

Salt dough ingredients: 2 cups flour; 1 cup salt; 1 cup water Craft supplies: Baking tray; Paint - variety of colours; Sprinkles (optional); Glue (optional)

STEP 1: Gather salt dough ingredients. Before getting started, gather up the ingredients needed to make salt dough. Since this recipe takes a few hours to bake, I wouldn't get out the other supplies just yet.

STEP 2: Mix salt dough. Start by mixing the flour and salt in a mixing bowl. Slowly add the water and mix until you reach a dough consistency. Once consistency is reached, take the dough out and knead it for several minutes.

STEP 3: Bake salt dough donuts. Next, roll small balls of dough and flatten into a donut shape, poking a hole out from the middle (I just stick my thumb through the middle). Place each salt dough donut on a baking try lined with foil to dry them out in the oven. Bake for several hours (time varies depending on the oven and dough thickness) at 100C/225F. Keeping it at this low temperature prevents burning or the dough puffing up. Once finished drying out in the oven, set aside to allow time to cool.

STEP 4: Decorate your donuts. After your donuts are completely cooled, it's time to decorate! If desired, seal with varnish to make these last longer. Start by inviting your child to paint their donuts different colours. Set each one aside to dry. After the paint has dried, glue on sprinkles and wait for them to dry. You can also paint sprinkles or use markers.






LEIN HOUSE AND FAMILY





WHAT ARE SHARKS TERRIFIED OF?

Sharks are often viewed as one of the ocean's top apex predators, but despite this rather prestigious classification, there's one marine animal that most sharks prefer to avoid crossing paths with entirely: the bottlenose dolphin. Sure, most people may view the bottlenose dolphin as a humble and gentle marine mammal, but it's a widely known fact that these creatures can be aggressive when they want to be – especially when congregating in large numbers, often called a pod. Sharks are vaguely aware of this, as even these ocean-dwelling predators can fall victim to a pod of dolphins' foul behavior when they're swimming around by their lonesome. Sharks can be easily outmaneuvered by dolphins in a one-on-one fight, particularly because of the characteristics surrounding their physical build. A dolphin's horizontally-oriented rear fin coupled with its incredible flexibility provides it with heightened mobility. Comparatively, sharks have vertically-oriented rear fins, and aren't nearly as flexible, which puts them at a severe disadvantage when facing a pod of dolphins. Another advantage that the bottlenose dolphin has over the shark is its snout, which is stout enough to be used as a battering ram in the event that a pod of dolphins needs to protect itself from a shark. Dolphins can use their snout to land a well-placed hit on a shark's belly to cause internal damage, or its gills to prevent it from breathing entirely. As you might come to expect, this can be fatal for the shark. Many sharks are fortunate enough to get away by simply fleeing from the fight when they realize they're in danger, but if the shark is bold enough to stand its ground, then the dolphins just might prove why they're the dominant creatures of the sea. DON'T TOUCH SEAL PUPS

It's that time of year again, when our Marine Mammal Stranding Network is flooded with calls about seal pups. In most cases the pup is fine, and the best thing we can do for them is to stay as far away as possible and let them rest and warm up on the beach. It is a natural and common occurrence for seal pups to rest on the beach, but problems can result if humans try to interfere. If you see a seal pup being harassed, or one that has been on the beach for 48 hours with no sign of mom, call your local Marine Mammal Stranding Network (Island, Skagit and N. Snohomish, call us at 866-ORCANET); if you don't know your local network # call the NOAA hotline at 866-767-6114. You may not get a call back if the pup has already been reported and/or assessed. We often have volunteers checking in on pups who have been on the beach for awhile, and we work with marine mammal vets to help us assess and make decisions about what to do if a pup has truly been abandoned. Please do your part by just leaving the seal pups alone ~ thank you! If you have a seal pup on your beach and want to post information, you can download this sign from NOAA Fisheries: https://archive.fisheries.noaa.gov/.../stssign_2014.pdf.



STANWOOD 532 BYPASS VIRTUAL OPEN HOUSE AND SURVEY

Stanwood, north Snohomish County, and Camano Island are beautiful places to live, work, and play. Our community is growing and will continue to grow over the next 30 years. With growth comes traffic. While increased traffic causes driver frustration, it also brings economic vitality to a community. The question becomes: how to manage traffic while promoting economic development and preserving community identity. The City of Stanwood, in partnership with the Washington State Department of Transportation, Snohomish County, and Island County, is studying how to improve traffic flow and multimodal infrastructure to provide for all travelers on SR 532 within Stanwood and connecting communities from Island, Skagit, and Snohomish Counties. The goal of the project is to determine how best to improve transportation for our Stanwood / Camano community while ensuring that Stanwood maintains its historic downtown character and sense of place. In 2020 the city conducted an "origins and destinations study" to better understand traffic flow on SR 532. The study showed that approximately 20% of the daily traffic on SR 532 heads north to Skagit County via 102nd Avenue or Pioneer Highway. A new bypass road connecting SR 532 north to Skagit County has been suggested as a method to better distribute traffic volumes from SR 532 to I-5 and points north. A bypass road provides an opportunity to reimagine SR 532 through downtown Stanwood for all modes and users within the existing right of way. A multimodal SR 532 corridor will help to continue distributing traffic and alleviating congestion while maintaining an attractive downtown as the community grows. Stanwood's vision of the future is to create a walkable downtown with wide sidewalks, walking trails, and bicycle paths. As part of this project, the city is considering how roundabouts placed in strategic locations along SR 532 can help improve traffic flow as well as improve pedestrian and bicycle mobility in the downtown core helping to preserve the city's historic downtown character and livability of its residents. We want to hear from you. A community survey will be held online between June 21 and July 19, 2021. Click on the website below to learn about the project and take a short survey. With your help, we can collectively, as a community, make more informed decisions on how best to manage traffic and preserve our way of life.

LEQUE ISLAND RESTORATION PROJECT

On Oct. 14, 2019, tidal waters poured into the WDFW wildlife area at Legue Island after heavy equipment removed dikes and connected channels to the Stillaguamish River and Port Susan Bay. This event a year and a half ago began the transition of the 250-acre site from diked and drained fields back to estuary habitat. Restored estuary habitat at Legue Island is helping juvenile salmon and birds while the new flood protection infrastructure and recreation features are benefiting the local community. Scientists monitoring the restoration site over the last several months are finding that the project area is being used by a wide variety of fish and birds, including Chinook salmon and several shorebird and waterfowl species. Native salt marsh vegetation is rapidly establishing on the site and new channels are forming as the tides wash over the young marsh plain. In addition to positive habitat outcomes for fish and wildlife, Legue Island has been very popular with people using the trail on top of the new berm to enjoy the outdoors and watch wildlife. The Stanwood Area Historical Society asks, "Did You Know?"

Excerpts taken from the "Stanwood Story", written for the Stanwood News by Alice Essex. The first Camano fishing derby that began in April 1940 concluded on Oct. 30, 1940, a 35-pound King was the largest derby catch, and according to the official report by Carl Bangs, who chaired the event, a total 2,108 pounds of salmon had been taken. Resort owners slated a repeat derby for 1941.

That same April, the new clubhouse and traps of the Twin City Gun Club proved to be an interesting event for the sports-minded. Opened on April 21, 1940 in a location near the high school, it attracted a goodly number of out-of-town professionals, who went home with trophies, prizes and gifts...courtesy of local business concerns.

B.J. West, president of the Washington State Trap-shooters Association presided at the opening and expressed appreciation from the association and the visiting VIPs to Mayor Charles Dockendorf for his efforts in the project. The 22 x 30-foot clubhouse with fireplace, and two trap houses were pronounced one of the best club set-ups in the state...and an asset to the community.

Also, in the area of recreational happenings, Wenberg Park; which had been turned over to the state, scored a major victory with the help of contributions, an additional 10 and 3/4 acres were purchased and added to the 20-acre park site. Bought for \$1,800, the new area made possible a road to the beach and increased the waterfront footage to 1,000 feet. More funds were then sought for installation of boat launching facilities, lockers for bathers and a caretaker's cottage.

East Stanwood's big story of 1940 was the December 21 dedication of the new city hall by C.R. Amundson and C.J. Gunderson. Built at a cost of materials only, as far as the town was concerned, it was a lot of hall for the money, even at pre-World War 11 prices.

Besides spacious community rooms, it boasted an electric kitchen, warm air heating, landscaping and steel fenced grounds. Of the total tab of \$19,176, the government provided \$11,775 for WPA (Works Progress Administration) labor, public subscription supplies \$1,000 for furnishings and the town \$7,401 for building materials. The hall has been the scene of many community events and is now the home of Frank Hancock Post No. 92 American Legion.


Other happenings scattered through the pre-war years of 1940-41, included formation of the Twin City Cancer Unit, registration of all males 21 to 35 years for selective military service...purchase of the Brown Apartments by the Mel Burrills...opening of Allan's Cash Grocery and the Modern Bakery on Market St. and the old Settler's picnic, at which G.B. Joergensen brought to light facts, not previously recorded, about Camano Island and Utsalady's famous, and sometimes infamous, past. To fill in the recorded excerpts from his talk are quoted.

"Island County, organized in 1843, then included what is now Snohomish County...the Indian name for Camano was 'Kal lut chin', meaning a body of land jutting into the bay...Capt. Isaac Parker, who built the first mill at Utsalady in 1857, took the first shipment of Camano Island lumber from Puget Sound to Shanghai in 1860... the song 'Halla Baloo,' sung by the sailors on the stately ships that then frequented the Utsalady harbor, was the inspiration for Richard Wagner's immortal, "The Flying Dutchman"

Dec. 7, 1941 will long be remembered by the American people, and others about the globe. It was the day that news of the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor rocked the nation, and World War 11 was no longer a possibility...it was a grim reality!

DUNGENESS CRAB BURGERS WITH MANGO SALSAOur famous crab cakes served on toasted buns with homemade mango salsa...Enjoy!

CRAB PATTIES: 1 lb. fresh Dungeness crab meat, picked over for shells; 1 lg. egg beaten; 1/4 c. mayonnaise; 1 1/2 tsp. Dijon mustard; 1 tsp. Old Bay seasoning; 1 tsp. lemon juice; 1/2 tsp. Worcestershire sauce; 1/4 tsp. kosher salt; 1 c. bread crumbs; 1 T. fresh flat leaf parsley chopped; T. butter; 1 T. olive oil

MANGO SALSA: 1 mango, peeled & diced; 1 avocado, peeled & diced; 2 ears corn, charred & cut from cob; 1/2 red onion, chopped; 1 jalapeño, seeds & membrane removed, finely chopped; juice of 1 lime; 1/4 c. flat leaf parsley; Salt and pepper to taste; Drizzle olive oil; Toasted sesame buns for serving; Lettuce leaves for serving

1. CRAB PATTIES: Place the crab meat in a medium mixing bowl, set aside. 2. In a small bowl beat egg slightly, whisk in mayonnaise, mustard, Old Bay, lemon juice, Worcestershire sauce, and salt. Pour sauce over crab meat, sprinkle with bread crumbs and parsley, mix thoroughly, but gently. Cover with plastic and refrigerate 1 to 2 hours. 3. MANGO SALSA: In a large bowl, stir together mango, avocado, corn, red onion, jalapeño, lime juice, parsley, salt and pepper, and a drizzle of olive oil, until well combined. Refrigerate until ready to serve. 4. Shape crab mixture into 4 patties about 1-inch thick. In a large non-stick skillet, heat butter with olive oil over medium heat. Cook crab patties until dark golden brown, about 4-5 minutes. Flip the cakes, reduce heat to medium-low and cook until the other side is well browned, 4-5 minutes. 5. To assemble burgers: Toast the buns. Pile the salsa on the bottom buns, followed by a crab patty, a leaf of lettuce, and the top bun. Now devour! 6. Cook's Note: Serve leftover salsa with some corn tortilla chips!



GRAVITY, SPACE, AND TIME..

We build clocks to measure one, yardsticks to measure another, and are perhaps a bit too familiar with scales that measure weight. We think of them as constants "everywhere and every-when". Gravity is technically not a force at all, its matter bending space and time. We are not "held" onto the Earth, but as the image above illustrates, we are falling into a well stretching space that Earth's mass creates.
