

FIRE SAFETY TIPS for families with a member with autism

- Stress same fire safety tips/facts as you would for any one. Kitchens, electrical, candles, heating, etc. And remember that having a working smoke/co detector is the most important part of any plan.
- Practice fire drills. Many people with autism respond well to routines. Teach them to keep low because they may not feel the heat and respond by naturally getting lower. There is a wide spectrum of autism so your plan should be customized for each individual.
- Wrap them in a blanket or heavy coat. This will give them a sense of security and keep their arms from flailing about.
- Pick a meeting place that is quiet and familiar. Going to your car in the driveway or a nearby neighbor's house is recommended. A meeting place in the street or on the sidewalk, will give the person with autism an opportunity to "BOLT" either back into the house or into traffic.
- Program emergency contact info under ICE (In Case of Emergency) on their cell phone/IPA/Tablet. There are smart phone apps that can hold all relevant medical/emergency information. Info you can also keep in a small wallet.
- Visit the local firehouse so the person with autism can become familiar with the sights and sounds that may accompany an emergency situation.
- There are stickers that can be placed in your car window or near your front door to alert emergency personnel there may be a person with autism present or involved. (Like those below that were found on-line).

Did You Know?



The Stanwood Area Historical Society asks, "Did You Know?"

Excerpts taken from the "Stanwood Story", written for the Stanwood News by Alice Essex. The Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor rocked the nation, almost overnight the country swung into military gear. Stanwood was no exception. The local legion called a special meeting to set up emergency measures, the two town councils organized for civil defense, C.J. Gunderson was elected coordinator for the mainland and James Zylstra was chosen for the post on Camano Island. So it was that in three days, or thereabouts, the community took its first steps toward defense.

"BE PREPARED...We are in a Danger Zone," and other such headlines then called the people to action. Captains were named to head auxiliary units to assist area police, fire and utility departments. Volunteers were enlisted to serve in emergency evacuation, medical or transportation contingents. What happened here also was happening in towns and cities throughout Puget Sound as people were jolted into war-time routine.

Then came orders for blackouts, to protect ship movements and military installations, and the establishment of air raid observation posts. Both were top priority and under the direct control of the U.S. Army. Again, Stanwood and Camano residents (male and female) rallied to the call for volunteers, and presto...around-the-clock watches were set up with two persons serving on two-to-four-hour shifts.

As people of the World War 11 generation will recall, the mission of the spotters was to report planes to central control headquarters within five seconds of sighting so they could be determined friendly, or otherwise. Fires, fallen bombs and dangerous gases also were part of their look-out duties.

Soon an officer from Bremerton came to explain the functions of the air watch and a group of local volunteers went to the three-day school at Fort Lewis for training in air raid protection, sabotage, war gases, handling and demolition of bombs.

February brought two government actions important to Stanwood as well as the war effort. They were reactivation of the Camano-Whidbey ferry and an urgent plea for an increase of 13 million cases in the nation's canned pea pack.

Construction of the \$3,370,000 Whidbey Navel Air Station and the shortage of housing for its personnel prompted the ferry operation. Housing for as many as 500 workers was requested here and soon every available house, room and cabin in town and on Camano was filled.

The pea request was equally pertinent locally and may have prompted the five-year leasing of Lien Bros. Cannery by a new corporation, known as Stanwood Canning Co. Arrangements were finalized early in June 1942 with C.G. Nash as president of the new company; William Bailey as vice president and Mr. Homer Elford as secretary-treasurer.

Nash, who had been superintendent at the Lien plant for two years, immediately announced plans to expand the plant to 200,000 cases a year and expressed need for increased acreage to support the increased output. Started in 1916 by Bernard, Conrad and Otto Lien, the cannery had a record of continuous operation during those 26 years. Nash, incidentally, was experienced in cannery management, having been connected with a large Friday Harbor plant before coming to Stanwood.

Meantime, civilians were feeling the pinch of war time regulations. Trips hither and yon were no longer possible, as the mood dictated. Gas and tire rationing had begun. Much more later.

PEANUT THAI ZOODLES

Zucchini noodles and fresh colorful veggies tossed in a delicious spicy peanut Thai sauce. Serve warm or cold!

PEANUT SAUCE: 1/3 c. peanut butter; 1 T. low-sodium soy sauce; 1 T. rice vinegar; 1 T. maple syrup; 1 tsp. Sriracha sauce; 1 tsp. freshly grated ginger; 1 lg. clove garlic, pressed; Water as needed

ZOODLES & VEGGIES: 2 T. avocado oil; 2 green onions, thinly sliced, green & white parts separated; 1 c. shredded carrot; 1/2 lg. red bell pepper, thinly sliced ; 1/4 head purple cabbage, thinly sliced ; 4 c. spiralized zucchini (zoodles)

GARNISHES: Green onions; Crushed peanuts; Cilantro; Limes wedges

DIRECTIONS: 1. PEANUT SAUCE: In a small bowl, whisk together peanut butter, soy sauce, rice vinegar, maple syrup, Sriracha sauce, ginger, and garlic until well combined. Slowly whisk in water a little until you reach desired consistency; set aside. 2. Prep all veggies before you begin to cook. 3. ZOODLES & VEGGIES: Heat oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat. Add green onion (white part only) carrot, red bell pepper, and purple cabbage. Using tongs, sauté for 1-2 minutes, just until tender-crisp. Add zoodles, sauté 1-2 minutes more until they are warmed through and begin to soften. Do not overcook! Remove the skillet from the heat, and gently fold in peanut sauce. 4. Serve warm or cold in bowls garnished with green onions (green part only), crushed peanuts, cilantro, and lime wedges.

THE MOON

The Moon gets a bad rap among amateur astronomers. It is true that its glow can wash out fainter targets causing celestial observers to pack up their telescopes, but there is much to be seen on our nearest neighbor. Some astronomers describe the Earth and Moon as a dual planetary system. Compared to most planet/moon combinations, our Moon is quite large in comparison to the planet it orbits. Mars has two moons, but they aren't much more than large, irregular rocks. Some moons around Jupiter and Saturn are fairly large, so much so that they would be dwarf planets in their own right, but the planets they orbit are huge. Our home planet and Moon are much closer in size. Surprisingly, the best time to observe the Moon is not when it is full. Most artist speak of the "golden hour," the hour right before sunset and right before sunrise, as the window of best light. This is also true on the Moon. The edge between lunar night and day shows the best detail and shape, the "midday" light leaves features looking flat. As the Moon changes phases, you can follow the edge of best detail as it crosses from one side to the other over the monthly waxing and waning. The Moon is almost always the first target for budding astronomers with that first telescope. It was the first target of Galileo when he turned that new invention skyward. Even binoculars reveal a wealth of detail: mountains, craters, canyons, and areas once thought to be inland seas because of their smoothness. The Moon has, and continues to have, a great impact on our planet. So much of life on this planet depends on its existence. It is well worth an observer's view to get to know our nearest neighbor a bit better.
