








BOW-TIE NOODLE BUTTERFLY CRAFT FOR KIDS



Officer Wilson: This is Officer Wilson. How can I help you? (She speaks with a noticeably thick Caribbean accent.)

ME: Thank you, ma'am, I just learned my social security number may have been compromised. Can you help me?

Ófficer Wilson: What is your namé please, and your social security number?

ME: It's Bart. Bart Starr. Would it help if I provided my date of birth and the name of my kids to prove to you I am who I say I am? They are great kids, except for my middle child, Conrad. He's going through a phase. Do you have any suggestions for how to deal with a 9th grader who still wets the bed?

Officer Wilson: I don't know anything about that. Just tell me your social sec-...

ME: Oh, right. Hey, quick question. Do you know any good fajita recipes? We're having guests over this evening, and I promised my wife I'd help out with an entrée. But between you and me, I don't know the first thing about Mexican food. You're not Mexican, by any chance, are you?

"CLICK" (That's when "Officer Wilson" hung up on me.)

The Bank Fraud Scam: Robo message: "This is the FBI. This is not a hoax. According to our files, you are currently wanted in four states for multiple instances of bank fraud and securities fraud. Please report to the nearest FBI office within 24 hours or else an agent will come to your residence and put a lien on your property. To learn details about the charges pending against you, please press "1" now."

So I press 1.

Agent Johnson: This is Agent Johnson. Please provide your name and the last credit card you used.

ME: Oh my. Yes, Agent Johnson. My name is John Unitas. But my friends call me Johnny. And I don't know what to say. I knew it was only a matter of time before my past would finally catch up with me.

Agent Johnson: We are willing to give you a one-time pardon for



your past criminal activities if you agree to pay a fine of \$2,500. Give me your credit card number and you can pay this fine right now.

ME: That seems more than fair. But the more I think about it, I actually think I would rather turn myself in. After all, I did commit that bank fraud your generic automated message mentioned. It's time I pay for my crimes by doing the time, right?

Agent Johnson: Excuse me?



PLASTIC BAG BAN

During the 2020 legislative session, the Legislature passed a state-wide ban on single-use plastic bags, an effort to reduce plastic pollution, litter, and waste. This ban will also benefit Washington's recycling system: Reducing contamination in the recycling and compost systems; Promoting reuse and recycled conten; Building consistency in policy and enforcement across the state; Supporting the recycled paper industry. We collaborated with local governments, retailers, business associations, and non-profits to begin this effort, and have developed a bag ban outreach toolkit that is formatted for accessibility and available in 17 languages. When the bag ban goes into effect on Oct. 1, 2021, anyone may submit an observation of businesses not in compliance with the new requirements using our reporting form. We will use this information to follow up with businesses to ensure their understanding of the new law. Repeated non-compliance may result in penalties.





PEACH SALAD WITH GRILLED CHICKEN AND POPPY SEED DRESSING

Mixed greens topped with sweet peaches, wild blackberries, fresh corn, red onions, toasted pecans, and goat cheese crumbles drizzled with homemade poppy seed dressing. It's summer on a plate, Enjoy!

CHICKEN: 2 boneless skinless chicken breasts.

MARINADE: 6 T. extra virgin olive oil; 4 cloves garlic, minced; 1 tsp. dried thyme; 1/2 tsp. dried oregano; 1 tsp. salt; 1/2 tsp. freshly ground black pepper; 1 1/2 tsp. lemon zest (from 1 lemon)

POPPY SEED DRESSING: 1/3 c. mayonnaise; 1/4 c. milk; 2 T. granulat-

ed sugar; 1 T. apple cider vinegar; 1 T. poppy seeds

SALAD: 1 (10 oz.) cont. baby spring mixed greens; 3 peaches or nectarines, sliced; 1 c. fresh picked blackberries; 2 ears fresh corn, husked, kernels cut from cob; 1/2 sm. red onion, thinly sliced; 1/2 c. chopped pecans, toasted; 1 (4 oz.) cont. goat cheese crumbles

DIRECTIONS: CHICKEN: 1. Place chicken in a 1-gallon zipper bag, using a mallet pound the chicken to an even 1/2-inch thickness. 2. MARINADE: In a separate 1-gallon zipper bag, combine all marinade ingredients. Add the chicken breasts to the bag, seal the bag and massage the marinade into the meat until evenly coated. Place the bag in a bowl and refrigerate for at least 4 hours or overnight. 3. Preheat an outdoor grill to 425 degrees. Brush the grates with olive oil. 4. Place the chicken on the grill. Grill until cooked through, rotating once halfway through cooking, about 3-4 minutes per side. (Chicken is done when an instant thermometer inserted into the center of the chicken reads 160-165 degrees.) Transfer to a cutting board and let the chicken rest 10-15 minutes before slicing into strips or dicing into cubes. 5. POPPY SEED DRESSING: In a small bowl, whisk together mayonnaise, milk, sugar, apple cider vinegar and poppy seeds; refrigerate until ready to use. 6. SALAD: In a large bowl, gently toss together mixed greens, peaches, blackberries, corn, onion, pecans, and grilled chicken. Transfer salad to a serving bowl or platter. Drizzle with poppy seed dressing and sprinkle with goat cheese crumbles. Serve immediately after adding dressing. Enjoy!

Did You Know?

The Stanwood Area Historical Society asks, "Did You Know?"

Excerpts taken from the "Stanwood Story", written for the Stanwood News by Alice Essex. The vessel, christened by Mrs. L.H. Kelsey, was officially "U.S. Transport, D.C.L. 1330." Accompanying Mrs. Kelsey on the flag-bedecked christening platform were her two daughters from Seattle, and Mr. and Mrs. Horace S. Kelsey, who but a few weeks previously became sole owners of the local yard. Flower girl, Betty Loy Amundson, presented Mrs. Kelsey with a basket of carnations and in keeping with tradition, Kelsey gave his mother-sponsor a diamond-studded wristwatch.

Commenting briefly during the festivities were C.J. Gunderson, local Civil Defense coordinator; Harry Dence, president of Stanwood Commercial Club; Captain McCallum, Chief of the Engineering Division of the U.S.A.T.C. Supply Base; E.H. Thorson, general superintendent of the local plant and Ray Sandberg, who presented the shipyard employees.

William J. Miller, Jr., resident government inspector, lauded the craft's fine workmanship and Kelsey thanked local businessmen, who volunteered to pinch-hit on four-hour night shifts during last minute labor shortage. Special guests for the occasion were representatives and their wives from out-of-town supply houses. A chicken dinner, hosted by the Kelseys' for guests and launching participants, was the grand finale of the evening.

As noted earlier, the plant had been established in Dec. 1942, as the Carl E. Edlund Shipyard, with Edlund, his son, Clarence, and Kelsey as members of the company. The site was the former Stanwood Lumber Co. property on the waterfront. Shortly before launching of the first ocean-going barge, Kelsey bought the Edlund interests, changed the name to Stanwood Shipyards, announced plans for expansion and the awarding of a second government contract.

The third barge was launched in Dec. 1943, at which time Kelsey reported another contract and the addition of the Barbee Shipyard Co., of Seattle, to the local holdings. The following excerpt from a letter to the NEWS by employee Sandberg in Feb. 1944, reflects the spirit of the nation during World War 11...also the attitude of local workers toward the war effort, Sandberg said in part:

"While making a tour of the Barbee Shipyards (owned by the Stanwood Shipyards Co.) I saw the first barge built in Stanwood, loaded to the gunwales ready to be towed west by a tug. It was a great sight... every man, who worked on the barge, should have a feeling of pride to know that he is aiding the war effort and that the hours of toil invested are being repaid by knowing that Stanwood barges are carrying supplies to our fighting forces in the Pacific."

In April 1944, when the fifth barge went into the Stilly, a glowing report of the company's operations was given by Harry Dence, who served as master of ceremonies. In its 16 months of operation, he noted that the plant had chalked up 424,320-man hours and paid upwards of \$565, 760 in wages at an average wage of \$1.27 per hour. Many more thousand had been spent locally for materials and contracts had totaled in the millions.

At the August launching of the seventh and last barge under contract, the story was far from glowing. Kelsey came forth with the news that operations in Stanwood were to be terminated. As a gesture of appreciation (and perhaps to soften the blow) he invited the employees and townspeople to a goodwill dance, courtesy of the company.

To this unwelcome news, the business community rallied with a joint session of the Stanwood and East Stanwood Commercial Clubs to explore purchase of the yard by the two towns. A surprise was in the future—next time.

THE GREAT DYING

About 250 million years ago acute climate change occurred when huge reserves of coal burned pumping large amounts of carbon into the atmosphere. Today it is known as "The Great Dying" and was probably the closest life on our planet has come to being completely extinguished. About 65 million years ago an external event, an impact of an asteroid, created a planetary firestorm that killed 75% of all life on Earth.

Slower changes occur from predictable variations in Earth's orbit around the Sun. These slow variations can trigger dramatic change: At one time Camano Island was under 2 miles of ice. Lush rain forest once existed in the Arctic. Less dramatic changes can be influenced by the Moon, for example, high tides locally will be higher than normal in the 2030s.

Its not hard to see our climate is changing and its quantifiable that the change is triggered by warming. It would be easy to argue this as all just normal cyclical variations except the pace of carbon being released into the atmosphere is now higher than even during The Great Dying. I'm afraid I also have some more bad news: Our planet currently, according to its natural cyclic relationship to the Sun, should be cooling. Even during this golden age of temperate weather devoid of major astronomically triggered disasters, every hominid between us and chimps has gone extinct. Neanderthals are often portrayed as rather stupid, but really were not that different from us, in fact the intermingling was extensive enough that we have Neanderthal ancestry in our DNA. Despite that they are gone and we humans became, at one point in the past, what would be called today a critically endangered species on the brink of extinction.

We may have more options than they did in their time, but our cleverness is not enough to survive an attack on two or more fronts. Species become stressed when their environment changes, through disease, or through externally triggered events such as ice ages or asteroid impacts...not to mention our unique ability to create weapons capable of decimating the planet in about an hour. As our ancestors have shown there is no guarantee, even if we do everything right, that we too will not become extinct. We really need to think how much we wish to draw our survival capital down in those areas that are within our control.
