HOW TO HANDLE A PHONE SCAMMER – PART 2

[This is Part 2 of a 2-part article. Part 1 ran in the previous edition of the Crab Cracker.]

Like I was saying in Part 1, in recent months I've received an increasing number of phone calls from fraudsters offering to part me from my money and my identity. They do this via robocalls with alarming or threatening messages informing me my social security number has been hacked or I'm wanted by the FBI for securities fraud. Most mature people would hang up the moment they realized they were being defrauded. But I never claimed to be mature. No, I prefer to have fun with these sleaze balls and egg them on for as long as I can keep them on the line.

These calls typically start with a robo-message, urging me to press 1 to talk to a live agent. And they always end the same way - with the conman hanging up on me. Here are more examples of actual phone exchanges I've had with phone scammers - some of whom actually had a rudimentary command of the English language. These all really happened.

The Computer Repair Scam: Robo message: "This is Microsoft with an important announcement about your computer operating system. We have identified that your computer's operating system may have become infected by the "Hercules" virus. If you would like us to remove this virus at no cost to you, we can do it remotely by phone. Please press "1" for a tech support agent to assist you."

So | press 1.

Agent Collins: This is Agent Collins. Can you please tell me your name and which Windows Operating System you have and your credit card number?

ME: Sure. It's Manning, Archibald Manning, Hey, you're not going to charge my credit card are you, Agent Carlin?

Collins: No, sir. And it's Collins. I just need your credit card number so we can confirm whether your Windows license is still current. Mr. Manning, please verify your card number for our records.

ME: Thank you, Agent Cowhand. It's 1843-4365-6327-0928. And I know you didn't ask for it, but my Bank of America checking account number is 8849329149. And if it might help identify me in your system, my Passport number is C34097749. Would it be helpful if I provided you my car's VIN number as well?

Collins: Um, that's okay. Give me your email address so I can initiate the remote repair.

ME: Happy to help, Agent Cowlick. It's A_Manning@SeattlePolice. org-... "CLICK"

The COVID Vaccination Scam: Robo message: "This is an important message from the CDC. If you have had the COVID-19 vaccine within the past five months, there is a possibility that you may have received an infected vaccination that could have long-term harmful effects to your respiratory and cardiovascular systems. To find out whether your vaccination might be among the corrupted batches, press 1 to speak to a medical assistant."

So | press 1.

Nurse Claire: This is Nurse Claire. What is your name, social security number, and the type of vaccine you received? Please provide the dates of those vaccinations.

SHELLFISH BIOTOXIN & CLOSURE ALERT – CRABBING UPDATE

Penn Cove, Saratoga Passage, and Holmes Harbor have been closed for recreational harvest of shellfish due to dangerous biotoxin levels. What types of shellfish are affected? Bivalve molluscan shellfish such as clams, mussels, oysters, geoduck, and scallops can accumulate Paralytic Shellfish Poison. So can moon snails and other gastropods. Other marine species, such as sea cucumbers, might be affected. Crab, because they feed on shellfish, can also become toxic. Even if the crab meat is safe, toxins tend to accumulate in crab gut and butter (the white-yellow fat inside the back of the shell). Clean crab thoroughly and avoid eating the crab butter and guts. Do not use shellfish harvested from closed areas as bait for crabs. Currently, biotoxins levels are not high enough to make crab unsafe to eat (except for the butter/guts). You can find the recreational shellfish beach closures due to biotoxins and pollution for Island County beaches here: https://fortress.wa.gov/doh/biotoxin/countybeachlist.html#Island. Please dispose of any shellfish (except for crab or shrimp) that have been harvested from the areas listed above after Monday, August 16th. That, or they were more private in their restroom etiquette.

What we had when we visited was a thundermug. You see em in antique stores now, usually an enameled metal pot with a lid but sometimes porcelain for the Martha Stewart crowd of the early last century. When we came to the South End, we had a working indoor toilet, something folks usually inquired about before they visited the first time, relieved we were so newfangled modern. But our stairs to the bedroom was nearly vertical so I did what my grandfolks did, I kept a chamber pot up there, emptied it every morning, no need to brave those skinny stairs you had to turn sideways to ascend or descend.

The last year or so the toilet in the shack kept backing up. I'm not going to shock you with tales of the attempted repairs, but I finally gave up. We had a few visitors (and ourselves) who stayed down there with apologies for the non-functioning toilet, but hey, here's the thundermug, save you an accident on those stairs, no need to thank me. Which, I guess, might explain the diminishing number of guests this year.

But I digress. The point is, and yeah, I plan to get to it, the point is I finally decided to return to the 21st century whatever it took. Today I dragged out the old antique model and hauled in a new crapper, one that advertised itself as 'pressurized', whatever that means, but what I hoped would mean the contents of the bowl would rocket out at the speed of sound to somewhere else, not just swirl around and possibly flood over the rim like in the past. To be honest, my expectations of success were low. To be totally honest, I didn't think I had a rat's chance, but I really hate to admit to defeat and I really hated to go back to using my outhouse back in the woods, not that I mind, mind you, I just remember the woman who came to a studio tour a dozen years ago, desperate to use the loo that was out of order and ended up back in our spider infested one seater back in the nettle forest. Believe me, I never want to see a look on anyone's face like hers when she was done. Some folks appreciate their modern luxuries. As you can see, I was doing this for them.

BUTTERNUT SQUASH SOUP WITH APPLE GORGONZOLA AND ALMONDS

Cozy up to a warm bowl of my creamy butternut squash soup topped with grated Granny Smith apple, Gorgonzola cheese, and Smokehouse almonds! When I think of Fall, I think of this delicious soup, simple and satisfying!

Ingredients: 2 T. olive oil; 2/3 c. diced carrot; 2/3 c. diced onion; 1/2 c. diced celery; 4 c. (1 med.) butternut squash, peeled, seeded and cut into 1-2 inch cubes; 1/2 tsp. fresh thyme, chopped or 1/4 tsp. dried thyme; 4 to 6 c. low sodium chicken broth; Salt and freshly ground pepper to taste; 1 c. 100% natural applesauce; 1 (4 oz.) gorgonzola cheese, crumbled for garnish; 1 (6 oz.) can whole smokehouse almonds for garnish; 1 med. granny smith apple, peeled and grated for garnish

Directions:1 Heat olive oil in a large soup pot. Add diced carrot, onion, and celery. Cook until vegetables begin to soften and the onion is translucent, about 3-4 minutes. 2. Add cubed butternut squash and thyme. Stir in chicken broth and season with salt & pepper. Bring to a boil, reduce and simmer until squash is fork tender, about 25-30 minutes. 3. Puree the soup with an immersion blender OR carefully puree in 3 batches in a traditional blender. Do not fill blender more than 1/2 full. Pour pureed soup into a large bowl. 4. Return soup to the pot and stir in applesauce. 5. Ladle into serving bowls. Garnish with gorgonzola cheese, almonds and grated apple. Serves 6-8

Did You Know?



The Stanwood Area Historical Society asks, "Did You Know?"

Excerpts taken from the "Stanwood Story", written for the Stanwood News by Alice Essex. The vessel, christened by Mrs. L.H. Kelsey, was officially "U.S. Transport, D.C.L. 1330." Accompanying Mrs. Kelsey on the flag-bedecked christening platform were her two daughters from Seattle, and Mr. and Mrs. Horace S. Kelsey, who but a few weeks previously became sole owners of the local yard. Flower girl, Betty Loy Amundson, presented Mrs. Kelsey with a basket of carnations and in keeping with tradition, Kelsey gave his mother-sponsor a diamond-studded wristwatch.

Commenting briefly during the festivities were C.J. Gunderson, local Civil Defense coordinator; Harry Dence, president of Stanwood Commercial Club; Captain McCallum, Chief of the Engineering Division of the U.S.A.T.C. Supply Base; E.H. Thorson, general superintendent of the local plant and Ray Sandberg, who presented the shipyard employees.

William J. Miller, Jr., resident government inspector, lauded the craft's fine workmanship and Kelsey thanked local businessmen, who volunteered to pinch-hit on four-hour night shifts during last minute labor shortage. Special guests for the occasion were representatives and their wives from out-of-town supply houses. A chicken dinner, hosted by the Kelseys' for guests and launching participants, was the grand finale of the evening.

As noted earlier, the plant had been established in Dec. 1942, as the Carl E. Edlund Shipyard, with Edlund, his son, Clarence, and Kelsey as members of the company. The site was the former Stanwood Lumber Co. property on the waterfront. Shortly before launching of the first ocean-going barge, Kelsey bought the Edlund interests, changed the name to Stanwood Shipyards, announced plans for expansion and the awarding of a second government contract.

The third barge was launched in Dec. 1943, at which time Kelsey reported another contract and the addition of the Barbee Shipyard Co., of Seattle, to the local holdings. The following excerpt from a letter to the NEWS by employee Sandberg in Feb. 1944, reflects the spirit of the nation during World War 11...also the attitude of local workers toward the war effort, Sandberg said in part:

"While making a tour of the Barbee Shipyards (owned by the Stanwood Shipyards Co.) I saw the first barge built in Stanwood, loaded to the gunwales ready to be towed west by a tug. It was a great sight... every man, who worked on the barge, should have a feeling of pride to know that he is aiding the war effort and that the hours of toil invested are being repaid by knowing that Stanwood barges are carrying supplies to our fighting forces in the Pacific."

In April 1944, when the fifth barge went into the Stilly, a glowing report of the company's operations was given by Harry Dence, who served as master of ceremonies. In its 16 months of operation, he noted that the plant had chalked up 424,320-man hours and paid upwards of \$565, 760 in wages at an average wage of \$1.27 per hour. Many more thousand had been spent locally for materials and contracts had totaled in the millions.

At the August launching of the seventh and last barge under contract, the story was far from glowing. Kelsey came forth with the news that operations in Stanwood were to be terminated. As a gesture of appreciation (and perhaps to soften the blow) he invited the employees and townspeople to a goodwill dance, courtesy of the company.

To this unwelcome news, the business community rallied with a joint session of the Stanwood and East Stanwood Commercial Clubs to explore purchase of the yard by the two towns. A surprise was in the future—next time.
