PAPER STRIP PUMPKIN CRAFT

What You'll Need: Orange and green construction paper; Toilet paper roll; Scotch tape; Scissors

STEP 1: Cut the toilet paper roll in half. Cut a strip of orange construction paper that will wrap around the toilet paper roll completely and tape the paper into place. STEP 2: Cut the orange construction paper vertically into strips that are approximately 1 inch wide. You will need 8 to 10 strips. Cut approximately 1 inch off of the length of each strip. STEP 3: Work with one end of the toilet paper roll at a time. Stick a piece of scotch tape onto the end of one of the paper strips and tape it inside an end of the tp roll. Repeat with three more pieces of paper, so you have strips at 12, 3, 6, and 9 o'clock. STEP 4: Once you have the initial 4 strips down, add another 4 strips of paper so that they overlap the initial 4 diagonally (at 2, 5, 8, and 10 o'clock). See the picture at right. STEP 5: Now you need to tape the other end of each strip into the other end of the tp roll. Do this just as you did before, only starting with the second set of strips first. STEP 6: Once you have all of the orange strips of paper taped into place, cut a leaf out of green paper and tape it into the hole to complete your pumpkin.

CONSTRUCT A SPECTROSCOPE!

Scientists use this tool to separate white light in to a spectrum, or rainbow, of colors. Make your own and start exploring the amazing properties of light!

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- · Paper towel roll
- A CD you can use a blank one or recycle an old one
- Pencil
- · Ruler
- Index card
- Masking tape
- Scissors

BOW TO DO IT:

- Take the ruler and measure about 2 to 3 inches up from one end of the paper towel roll. With the pencil, draw a small line to mark this measurement.
- Using the mark as your guide, cut a thin slit at about a 45° angle, pointing down towards the bottom of the tube. (You may want an adult to help.)
- Now, cut a small hole across from the slit. This will be your peephole into the spectrometer. Make it large enough to look in with your eye.
- 4. Trace one end of the paper towel roll on the index card. Cut this circle out.
- 5. Cut a rectangular slit in the center of the circle
- 6. Tape this circle to the top of the paper towel roll.
- 7. Insert the CD, shiny side up, into the 45° slit and ta-da! You have a spectrometer!
- 8. To use the spectrometer, point the sit on top towards a light source. Look through the peephole to see a spectrum of light! While you are exploring light on Earth, think about this: astronomers will use spectrometers to study light in space! Light can tell us things like the temperature of an object in space or even how fast it is moving! So cool!





NEWT CROSSING

"Hi Everyone! It's that time of year ... the heavy rains have brought newts, salamanders, and frogs out from under logs and leaf piles and onto the roadways. These tiny but important amphibians begin moving to wetlands during the rainfall to prepare for breeding season and to hopefully lay eggs. Just a heads up that there are many rough-skinned newts crossing Mountain View Drive today, particularly between South Camano Drive and East Camano Drive. Please use caution and move them to the side of the road in the direction they were heading if you feel safe to do so! Be sure to wash your hands after, as newts do have toxins on their skin as a defense mechanism. We see newts moving in the daylight, but red-legged frogs are moving at night and are incredibly hard to see. The Elger Bay wetland near the elementary school brings hundreds of frogs over East Camano Drive at night (right next to Cascade View) as well as some on Cascade View Drive. WHEN IT'S RAINING AT NIGHT ABOVE 45 DEGREES, please drive slowly to avoid smashing them. They are bug-eaters and are crucial to the ecosystem. Your local wildife biologist and the all the Camano Island amphibians thank you!" - Amber Parmenter.

THE GREAT RESIGNATION





MINI OREO PUMPKIN CHEESECAKES

These cute mini pumpkin cheesecakes with Oreo cookie crust are great for entertaining. A real crowd pleaser! Servings: 18 mini cheesecakes

Ingredients: OREO COOKIE CRUST: 18 Oreo cookies; 3 T. butter melted. PUMPKIN CREAM CHEESE FILLING: 1 (8 oz.) pkg. cream cheese softened; 1/2 c. granulated sugar; 2 lg. eggs; 1 c. canned 100% pure pumpkin; 2 T. sour cream; 1 tsp. vanilla; 1/2 tsp. pumpkin pie spice; 1/2 tsp. cinnamon: Sweetened whipped cream or Cool Whip for serving; Mini Oreo cookies or crushed Oreos for decoration, optional Instructions: Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Place 18 cupcake liners in muffin pan(s). OREO COOKIE CRUST: Use a food processor to crush the Oreo cookies into fine crumbs. Add melted butter, pulse to combine. Add 1 packed tablespoon of crumb mixture to each cupcake liner. Use the back of the tablespoon to firmly press in place. PUMP-KIN CREAM CHEESE FILLING: In a large bowl, beat the cream cheese and sugar until light and fluffy. Add the eggs one at a time, beating after each addition. Add the pumpkin, sour cream, vanilla, pumpkin pie spice, and cinnamon; beat until creamy and smooth. Spoon filling over each Oreo crust, dividing evenly, about 3/4 full. Bake for 20 minutes. Cool in pan for 15-20 minutes before removing and placing on a wire rack to finish cooling. Keep refrigerated until ready to serve. Before serving, top with whipped cream and crushed Oreos.

THE PALE BLUE DOT

Most of us humans have a notion of the immense universe around, the Voyager spacecraft on its one way trip away from home pointed its camera backward for one last image of Earth. From 3.7 billion miles, past the orbit of Neptune, a tiny little hop on the cosmological scale, it captured the now famous "Pale Blue Dot".

To quote Carl Sagan: "We succeeded in taking that picture, and, if you look at it, you see a dot. That's here. That's home. That's us. On it, everyone you ever heard of, every human being who ever lived, lived out their lives."The aggregate of all our joys and sufferings, thousands of confident religions, ideologies and economic doctrines, every hunter and forager, every hero and coward, every creator and destroyer of civilizations, every king and peasant, every young couple in love, every hopeful child, every mother and father, every inventor and explorer, every teacher of morals, every corrupt politician, every superstar, every supreme leader, every saint and sinner in the history of our species, lived there — on a mote of dust, suspended in sunbeam.

The Earth is a very small stage in a vast cosmic arena. Think of the rivers of blood spilled by all those generals and emperors so that in glory and in triumph they could become the momentary masters of a fraction of a dot. Think of the endless cruelties visited by the inhabitants of one corner of the dot on scarcely distinguishable inhabitants of some other corner of the dot. How frequent their misunderstandings, how eager they are to kill one another, how fervent their hatreds. Our posturings, our imagined self-importance, the delusion that we have some privileged position in the universe, are challenged by this point of pale light. To my mind, there is perhaps no better demonstration of the folly of human conceits than this distant image of our tiny world. To me, it underscores our responsibility to deal more kindly and compassionately with one another and to preserve and cherish that pale blue dot, the only home we've ever known."
