





# Kid's Korner



Supplies Needed for Your Turkey Craft: Colored construction paper or colored printer paper; Brown or white cardstock (brown if you want to make the turkey body brown and white if you want your kids to color it in themselves); Pencil; Scissors; Craft glue; Googly eyes


### Instructions for How to Make Your Folded Paper Turkey Craft: 1. Grab some fun colored papers for the tail feathers of the turkey. Fall-inspired colors are a nice touch, but I would let children pick the colors they prefer to use. Trace the tail feather pattern template on the colored construction paper or printer paper and cut them out. 2. Create small and even accordion folds (fan folds) lengthwise on the feather cutouts. 3. Hold the accordion folded paper in the middle of the piece and press on that point. 4. Fold the accordion folded paper in half at the point where you were pressing down. Join the straight ends (leaving the curved end facing outwards). Apply glue to attach the straight ends. 5. Press the two sides together to make sure the shape doesn't come apart. After you're finished, your piece should look like the turkey's tail feathers. 6. Repeat steps one through five to create more tail feathers for your turkey. Seven tail feathers should work well on your turkey. 7. Next, you will draw the body parts of the turkey on brown cardstock, unless you want to use white cardstock and have your kids color the turkey. You can draw the other parts of the turkey (beak, wattle, and legs) onto colored printer paper or colored construction papers. Again, if you prefer, you can do it all on white paper and have your kids color the parts instead. 8. Attach the following: wings on both sides of the turkey body, the googly eyes on the head, and the beak and wattle below the eyes to complete it. 9. Draw and cut out the tail base from a piece of brown cardstock. 10. Attach the accordion/fan folded tail feathers onto the tail base cutout. Attach the paper feathers around the curved end of the tail base. 11. Continue to add paper tail feathers to the tail base until you're happy with how the turkey looks. 12. Last, attach the tail piece on the back of the paper turkey body to cover the middle of the feathers on the back.

### **FUN FACT:**



"I'm the designer/owner/maker of a line of jewelry called Loyalsmith." I moved to Camano Island with my school aged son, Gus, in August of 2020. However, I grew up coming to Camano several times a year to a family owned cabin on Saratoga Passage, and prior to that my father's family vacationed at Cama Beach in the 1940s and early 1950s. Camano has had my heart since 1972 when our place was finished, and buying my own place here feels like I have come home to where I am supposed to be. I love being a member of the Camano Arts Association and look forward to volunteering with the Cama Beach Foundation. Attending the Evergreen State College in the early 90s I took all of the art courses available and took advantage of their independent study programs in which a student could design their own course (you know the joke- why did the Greener cross the road? To get credit). I studied woodblock printing with artist Jody Isaacson in New Mexico, took figure drawing courses until my pastels crumbled, learned to weld and handle woodworking tools- all for college credit! My first job out of college was as a carpenter's assistant on a crew of 4 building a 5000 sq ft home right here on Camano, down by the Mabana schoolhouse. The following 25 years have seen me making handmade candles in New Mexico, getting a bench jeweler's certificate in San Francisco, owning/operating a retail store in Seattle called JayWalk that showed the art and craft of dozens of Seattle based artists and makers, then finally beginning my own handmade jewelry line, Loyalsmith, in 2017. I make it all right here on Camano in my woodshop/studio. You can find Loyalsmith at the Kristoferson Farm Stand across from the IGA (treat your honey to a bottle of fine wine and a pair of lovely earrings!), many retailers in Seattle, on Bainbridge and Whidbey, and on my website, loyalsmith.com."



### IMPROVE YOUR DIGITAL SKILLS

As more and more services move online, Sno-Isle Libraries continues to find innovative ways to help customers gain the skills they need to successfully navigate the complex digital world. "The digital divide is real and we want to help people build their skills with computers and get them comfortable with the internet since so many services and activities are online or web-based now," Sno-Isle Libraries Adult Services Coordinator Emily Felt said. Sno-Isle Libraries recognizes the growing importance of and now offers Northstar Digital Literacy, a free online learning and assessment tool. It's designed to help people improve their basic knowledge of how things work with computers and enhance their skills around websites and widely used software programs. The lessons combine videos, reading and practice scenarios to build skills. Topics cover basic computer skills, internet, email, Windows, Microsoft Word, and career-search skills. Northstar offers personal assessments of digital skills, online learning lessons, and personal Northstar Learner Accounts that allow customers to track their progress. When Northstar learners complete an assessment, they are automatically directed to the Northstar Online Learning lessons that target specific skill areas. "Access to this kind of training is really important because it lets people participate in society," Felt said. "During the pandemic, Sno-Isle Libraries expanded community access to the internet with laptop computers and Wi-Fi hotspots, and we can now use Northstar as another helpful tool." After Northstar test takers pass assessments, they should feel comfortable using their new skills to search for information online, search for a job, and use email, Felt said. They can then pursue more advanced training, certifications, or career pathways elsewhere. "We're looking forward to offering Northstar to our customers to help increase digital inclusion in Snohomish and Island counties," Felt said. Northstar Digital Literacy is being provided regionally by the Washington State Library.



### CRANBERRY TART

Our delicious graham cracker-pecan crust filled with sweet and tangy cranberry curd topped with homemade whipped cream is a stunning and festive holiday dessert. Happy Thanksgiving!

GRAHAM CRACKER PECAN CRUST: 6 whole rectangle graham crackers; 3/4 c. pecan halves; 6 T. unsalted butter, melted; 1/4 c. light brown sugar, packed

CRANBERRY CURD: 12 oz. bag cranberries; 1 c. granulated sugar; Zest and juice of 1 lg. orange (about 1/2 cup juice); 1/2 c. butter; 2 whole eggs plus 2 egg yolks, lightly beaten

WHIPPED CREAM: 1 c. heavy cream; 1 T. granulated sugar; 1 tsp. vanilla extract

DIRECTIONS: Preheat oven to 350 degrees. GRAHAM CRACKER PE-CAN CRUST: Place graham crackers and pecans in a food processor fitted with the S-chopping blade; pulse until coarsely ground. Add sugar and butter, continue to process until finely ground and completely combined. Press mixture into the bottom and up the sides of a 9-inch pie plate using the back of a measuring cup. Press the mixture firmly until compact using your fingers as an edge guide. Bake crust for 10 minutes. (If crust puffs up, gently press it down with the back of a measuring cup.) Cool crust slightly, then place in the freezer while you prepare the cranberry curd. CRANBERRY CURD: Place cranberries, sugar, orange zest and juice in a saucepan over medium heat. Simmer until the cranberries have popped and softened, about 10 minutes. Remove from heat. Carefully purée the cranberry-orange mixture with an immersion blender, food processer or blender. Pour the mixture into a fine-mesh sieve set over a bowl pressing the liquid and solids with the back of a spoon. Whisk butter into the warm liquid. In a small bowl, beat the whole eggs and yolks together. Slowly whisk in a cup of warm cranberry-orange liquid into the eggs to temper, then combine both and whisk together. Wipe out the pot if necessary, return liquid to pot and cook over low heat until nearly bubbling and thickened, about 10 minutes. Let cool to room temperature stirring occasionally. Pour cooled cranberry curd into the cooled prebaked graham cracker pecan crust and smooth top with an offset spatula. Bake at 350 degrees for 10 minutes to set curd. Cool on a rack. Store in the refrigerator or at room temperature for up to 2 days. WHIPPED CREAM: Chill a deep bowl and beaters at least 10 minutes before preparing the whipped cream. Pour the cream into a well-chilled bowl. Using an electric hand or stand mixer, beat until soft peaks form. Add sugar and vanilla, beat until peaks return. Do not over-beat, cream will become butter! Slice and serve pie topped with sweetened whipped cream.



# What's Up?

### GAUGING THE SKY CONDITIONS

Not all nights are created equal for stargazing. Astronomers have several criteria to gauge the quality of the night sky. "Transparency" is a measurement of any physical barrier that gets between you and the stars. Clouds are an obvious hindrance, but transparency is also impacted by smoke, dust, or even high humidity. The next criteria is sky darkness measured with the Bortle scale (map above). A Bortle 1 sky is pretty much pristine and apart from a trip beyond the atmosphere is guite hard to find. Bortle 9, not so affectionately known as a "white zone", is a sky almost completely aglow from lights (think New York Times Square). If you live on Camano or around Warm Beach you have Bortle 4 skies (mustard color on the map). If you are within a mile of Stanwood, five miles from Everett, live close to street lights, or have neighbors who find Christmas lights festive all year around then you can downgrade your sky to a Bortle 5. Bortle 6 skies are if you live anywhere near the Stanwood High School football field, near any car dealership or anywhere in Marysville. Everett is a Bortle 7. Most of Seattle is now a white zone. "Seeing", in astronomical terms, relates to the stability of the atmosphere. Stars don't twinkle, that's turbulence in the air layers above us. Imagine looking to the bottom of a pool. Seeing becomes more important as magnification increases. With binoculars even the worst seeing doesn't impact anything. If you are the proud owner of that 16" telescope seeing becomes a major concern. Western Washington has very poor seeing most of the time because the jet stream races overhead. The best night for astronomy? A moonless dry night after a day's rain with clear and stable air when the power has gone out. Any four out of six isn't bad!
