### **FUN FACT:**

The traditional Yule Log lighting is an example of an ancient Celtic fire ritual done at the time of the December Winter Solstice. It was believed that to bring the log indoors was a symbolic way of bringing the blessings of the Sun God into your house. It was important that the log burn constantly without going out or else bad luck would follow.



### **AVIAN CHLAMYDIOSIS UPDATE**

A pet bird that originated from an Island County bird distributor has tested positive for avian chlamydiosis, a bacterial disease that can also cause illness in humans. The Washington State Department of Health, in collaboration with Island County Public Health are collecting the information necessary to contact persons who may have purchased birds from this distributor to share information needed for disease prevention. Avian chlamydiosis (sometimes referred to as "parrot fever") can cause serious disease in birds, and rarely cause disease in people (psittacosis). Avian chlamydiosis is typically found in cockatiels, parakeets, parrots, macaws, and other parrot-like (psittacine) birds. Symptoms include nasal and eye discharge, green to yellow-green droppings/diarrhea, fever, inactivity, ruffled feathers, weakness, and weight loss. Healthy looking birds can also be infected and shed the bacteria when stressed, causing infection to other species of birds housed in the same environment, like finches, canaries and doves. Symptoms of psittacosis commonly include fever and chills, headache, muscle aches, and a dry cough. Psittacosis is rare in Washington, with less than a dozen cases reported over the last 20 years. Although the risk of psittacosis is low, persons who have purchased pet birds should take a few steps to protect themselves and their bird. Use caution for bird owners. People are usually infected by breathing dried droppings or other body fluids excreted from infected birds. To protect yourself when handling sick birds or cleaning cages, bowls and other objects, always wear gloves and use an appropriately fitted mask. Use household bleach (1:32 dilution or 1/2 cup of bleach per gallon of water) or another registered disinfectant when cleaning. Use caution for birds. Birds do not always become sick. If you are notified your bird was exposed to a positive case or appears sick with noted symptoms, please speak to your veterinarian about getting your bird tested for avian chlamydiosis. Watch for symptoms. Symptoms of psittacosis in humans include fever, chills, headache, muscle aches, and a dry cough. More severe symptoms can occasionally occur, such as pneumonia. If you get any of these symptoms and are aware your bird may have been exposed to this disease or is symptomatic, please consult with your health care provider.


Something inside says I should not like the wind, or the rain and the darkness; the dankness of it all; there's plenty to hide from; the wind and the rain, and the industry.

### **COOKIE BUTTER FUDGE**

Cookie butter and fudge, a match made in heaven! Give the gift of homemade fudge to someone you love this holiday season.

INGREDIENTS: 1 lb. white chocolate, chopped; 1 1/4 c. creamy cookie butter (Biscoff); 1/2 tsp. salt; 2 T. molasses; White nonpareils, for sprinkling

DIRECTIONS: 1. Line an 8-inch square baking dish with foil leaving a 2-inch overhang on two sides; lightly coat the foil with cooking spray. 2. Bring 1-inch of water to a simmer in a medium saucepan over medium heat. 3. Combine the white chocolate, cookie butter and salt in a large heatproof bowl and set it over the saucepan (do not let the bowl touch the water). Cook, stirring frequently, until the mixture is completely melted and smooth. (Reduce the heat if steam sputters around the bowl, you want to prevent any water from getting in the chocolate and causing it to seize.). 4. Remove the bowl from the pan and quickly stir in the molasses. Wipe the water from the bottom of the bowl, then pour the mixture into the prepared baking dish. Spread evenly with a rubber spatula and top with white nonpareils. Let set at room temperature about 1 to 2 hours. Cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate until chilled but not hard, about 30 minutes. 5. Lift the fudge out of the baking dish and peel off the foil. Cut into 1-inch squares with a sharp knife. (If the fudge is too hard or starts to crack when cut, let soften slightly at room temperature for 10 to 20 minutes.)

### APPLE CINNAMON PANCAKES

Warm, fluffy apple-cinnamon pancakes topped with caramelized apples and whipped cream!

APPLE CINNAMON PANCAKES: 1 1/3 c. all-purpose flour; 1 1/2 tsp. baking powder; 1 tsp. ground cinnamon; 1 T. granulated sugar; 1/2 tsp. kosher salt; 2 T. butter, melted; 1 lg. egg, separated; 1 tsp. vanilla extract; 1 1/4 c. milk; 4-5 lg. apples, peeled and diced, divided CARAMELIZED APPLE SYRUP: 2 T. butter; 1/2 c. light or dark brown sugar; 1/2 tsp. ground cinnamon; 1/4 c. water; Butter for cooking; Whipped cream for serving

DIRECTIONS: 1. APPLE CINNAMON PANCAKES: In a medium bowl, whisk together baking powder, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, sugar, and salt; set aside. 2. Melt 2 tablespoons of the butter. 3. In a large bowl. whisk together egg yolk, milk, and melted butter. Gently fold dry ingredients into the wet ingredients until just combined. Fold in 1 1/2 cups of the diced apple. 4. In a separate bowl, using a hand mixer, beat egg white until stiff peaks form. Gently fold the egg white into the batter with a rubber spatula until just combined. 5. CARAMEL-IZED APPLE SYRUP: In a small saucepan over medium heat, melt 2 tablespoons of butter. Add remaining apples, brown sugar, 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon, and 1/4 c. water. Cook, stirring occasionally until apples have softened, and the syrup has thickened a bit, about 5-8 minutes. 6. In a large skillet over medium heat, melt 1 tablespoon butter. Pour 1/4 cup pancake batter into the pan. When little bubbles appear, about 1-2 minutes, flip and continue cooking until both sides are lightly golden. Repeat with the remaining batter, adding more butter to the pan as needed. 7. Serve pancakes topped with caramelized apple syrup and whipped cream. Yields 10 pancakes

### THE UNIVERSE IN 3D

We humans are good at determining depth between objects fairly close to us ..which makes sense viewed from our need to track down food. We are not so good at perceiving depth beyond a few hundred feet though. Past that we use atmospheric cues of haze or of distant objects looking slightly more blue as the red is absorbed by the atmosphere. Astronauts on the moon, lacking the atmospheric metric, were at a loss in determining the distances in the landscape. That mountain that looked a few miles away was often a hundred.

When it comes to the universe, however, we are absolutely terrible. Even astronomers fully aware of the depth around us find it very hard to perceive great distances in 3 dimensions. Its no wonder the sky was seen for so long as a 2 dimensional celestial sphere surrounding the Earth.

Try this as an experiment. Take a look at the Big Dipper and imagine that each star resides at a very different distance. If you lived around the star Aldebaran the shape would look like the image above. If you are still struggling, watch the video at www.youtube.com/watch?v=dFT02IQ18IE then go back outside to see if you can take that sense of depth with you. Don't feel bad if you can't. It isn't easy and we just aren't wired to do it. It is worth the effort to keep trying.

Giordano Bruno lived in a 15th century world view which enclosed the universe to a confining bowl of stars. This was the cosmos of Bruno's time. He describes the moment he became aware of the depth around him. "I experienced a sickening moment of fear as if the bottom of everything was falling away beneath my feet. I summoned up courage and spread confident wings to space and soared toward the infinite, leaving far behind what others strained to see from a distance. Here, there was no up or down, no edge or center. I saw that the sun was just another star, and the stars were other suns, each escorted by earths, like our own. The revelation of this reality filled me with unspeakable joy."
