By 1910, immigrants from Norway, Sweden, Denmark, and Finland were the largest single foreign-born group of whites living in Washington State. Over a third of these immigrants were from Norway. Most settled in the Puget Sound, Grays Harbor, and Spokane areas. MAKE A LEMON BATTERY

Did you know that a lemon has enough juice to turn on a light?

Build this simple battery to see how it works!

MATERIALS:

- · Lemon
- Galvanized nail (coated in zinc)
- Copper wire or a penny Optional:
- Additional lemons
- Alligator clips
- · Small LED bulb



HOW TO DO IT:

- 1. Roll the lemon on a hard surface. This will release some of the juices that will get this battery going!
- Stick the nail and the penny in the Jemon. An adult may need to cut a small slit in the Jemon for the penny. Don't be afraid to ask for help.
- You may have noticed that batteries have positive (+) and negative (-) ends. On the lemon battery the copper is positive and the nail is negative.
- 4. Touch the copper and zinc with the same hand. What do you notice as you complete this circuit?
- 5. You can take this experiment to the next level by turning a few more lemons into batteries. Two to four lemons should have enough juice to power up a small LED bulb. Connect the lemons with the alligator clips each clip should attach a nail to a penny. You should have two loose clips at the end to connect to the LED bulb. Attach these clips to the bulb and watch what happens!
- 6. The lemons aren't creating energy on their own but are a part of the battery. The citric acid in the lemon is perfect for electrons (small particles) to flow through. The zinc from the nail oxidizes in the citric acid, releasing electrons. These electrons flow when a circuit is completed. Try this experiment with a potato or apple and see if you can create a similar reaction!





BAKED POTATO SOUP

Do you like loaded baked potatoes? Then you'll LOVE our baked potato soup topped with all your favorite fixin's like sour cream, shredded cheddar cheese, crumbled bacon and chopped green onions, Enjoy!

SOUP: 2 lg. potatoes, baked and diced; 3 T. butter; 1 c. diced yellow onion; 2 T. all-purpose flour; 4 c. chicken stock; 2 c. water; 1/4 c. cornstarch; 1 1/2 c. leftover mashed potatoes or instant mashed potatoes; 1 tsp. salt; 3/4 tsp. black pepper; 1/2 tsp. basil; 1/8 tsp. thyme; 1 c. half and half

GARNISHES: Shredded cheddar cheese; Crumbled bacon; Chopped green onions; Sour cream

DIRECTIONS: 1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Place potatoes on a baking sheet and bake for 1 hour or until done, set aside to cool. 2. As potatoes cool, prepare soup by melting butter in a large pot, sauté onions until light brown. Add flour to the onions, stir to make a roux. 3. Add stock, water, cornstarch, instant mashed potatoes, and spices to the pot, bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer for 5 minutes. 4. Peel and dice potatoes into 1/2-inch chunks. Discard skins. 5. Add diced baked potatoes and half-and-half to the pot, bring soup back to a boil, then reduce heat and simmer the soup for another 15 minutes or until it is thick. 6. Ladle soup into bowls, top with sour cream, shredded cheddar cheese, crumbled bacon and chopped green onions. Serves 6 to 8





THE WEATHER

It has been cloudy, so let's talk about the weather. No, not the endless rainy days we have been having this winter, but weather elsewhere in our solar system. Venus, our neighbor that orbits closer to the Sun, is a greenhouse catastrophe. It may have once been hospitable, but today the CO2 rich atmosphere and perpetual cloud cover propels temperatures to 864 degrees Fahrenheit and incredible atmospheric pressures. If you were on Venus and could somehow survive the heat, the weight of the atmosphere would feel like being 3000 feet underwater on Earth. It also rains sulfuric acid. The first Venera lander sent to Venus lasted 23 minutes despite being fortified like a deep sea dumbbell.

Mars, our nearest neighbor further away from the Sun, is somewhat more friendly, but its unbreathable atmosphere is very thin compared to Earth's and does not block lethal doses of solar radiation from reaching the surface. Mars does have seasons, shrinking and expanding polar ice caps, wind storms, and clouds. Orbiters above Mars have even detected falling snow, although it evaporates before reaching the surface. Although daytime summer highs at the equator have reached as high as 81 degrees Fahrenheit, typical summer highs at the equator are around 35 degrees with winter lows a chilly -140. Before you book that vacation be prepared for dust storms. Dust storms on Mars can be intense and have been seen to cover almost the entire planet.

Next time we'll cover weather in the outer solar system, but just so you are warned, it doesn't get more friendly.
