MARGUERITE GOFF

is a ceramics artist based out of Lake Goodwin, Stanwood.

"Marguerite Goff has been known by some as "the fish lady," and now her sculpted salmon have earned her a spot as the cover girl for the Camano Island Studio Tour poster. "I prefer to be called the salmon lady," Goff has said through the years. Goff has been sculpting anatomically correct salmon for more than 10 years. Her salmon appear on grocery store deli walls, at Ivar's Salmon House, on an exterior wall of Arlington's City Hall and an entryway sign for Arlington, as well as many private collections.

In recent years, Goff started sculpting smaller salmon in clusters for the tops of vessels, which are often asymmetrical in form, but she sculpts more than just salmon. Now, she feels like she has been working with clay "since the dawn of time," but she still debates the terminology: Is she a clay artist, a sculptor, a potter or a ceramicist? Since her master's degree in fine arts was focussed on ceramics, she prefers the term ceramics, "but then many people think of hand-painted china," Goff said.

Goff's work is sculptural and functional. She has made plenty of cups, bowls and plates in her lifelong career as a ceramic artist. She has made many vases – but not your average vases. Her pieces always feature a sculptural element, which Goff shapes with her hands: Tulips, gingko leaves, dogwoods, ravens, animal footprints, and, of course, salmon.

"I feel fortunate to spend my life as an artist," said Goff, who grew up in Boston and migrated to the Pacific Northwest with her husband, Robert, who attended graduate school at University of British Columbia in Vancouver. After school, he took a job with the University of Washington.



KEEP YARD WASTE OUT OF THE MARINE ECOSYSTEM

With springtime rain and moderate temperatures, vegetation on our islands has been growing like crazy. This includes not only our lawns and gardens but weeds as well. For those who live along the shoreline, the temptation may be to throw yard debris over the bluff, or onto the beach, letting nature carry it away. After all, it will decompose, right? Besides being illegal and subject to a fine, doing so can cause multiple problems to the marine environment. Any fertilizers or herbicides will make it to the shoreline along with the grass clippings, killing fragile marine life. Even if you use no chemicals, excess nitrogen created by decomposition can raise temperatures and deplete oxygen resulting in a threat to marine life. Grass clippings or waste can smother clam beds or kill forage fish eggs located on the upper beach. Any vegetation dumped onto your bluff can smother native plants that provide stability, and thus increase the chance of slides. What are your options in disposing of yard and lawn debris? Create a compost pile or purchase or build a compost bin; then use the resulting compost on your flower beds or garden. Take it to Coupeville Solid Waste Complex or Camano Transfer Station. Additionally, Camano residents can get it picked up curbside by Waste Management or haul their yard debris to Lenz in Stanwood. All of these disposal locations charge a fee for disposal. Noxious weeds can be disposed of for free at your Island County Solid Waste Transfer Station. You must make certain your load is limited to the noxious weeds. If you need help identifying noxious weeds, see the Washington State Noxious Weed Control Board website, or contact Island County's Noxious Weed Coordinator, Seth Luginbill who can answer your questions. Additional information on noxious weeds control and disposal can be found here and in this article on identifying and controlling the top 10 noxious weeds. Whidbey Conservation District offers an excellent guide to Natural Yard Care. Just a reminder: keep pet waste out of compost bins/yard waste collection. Always bag pet waste and put it into your trash. – By Scott Chase and Joan Schrammeck, Stewardship Committee.

UNRAVELING THE CONFUSION ABOUT CRYPTOCURRENCY

If you're like me, you've probably been wondering, "What exactly is this thing called cryptocurrency?" Let me help you out with this simple explanation that any seven-year-old could understand (assuming that youngster is currently studying blockchain computer programming at Harvard).

Cryptocurrency is nothing more than a form of decentralized digital currency traded over the internet, utilizing a series of peer-topeer networks of computers running open-source software, based on a complex series of logarithmic algorithms in which all transactions are vetted using a sophisticated technology called blockchain.

"Okay, but what is blockchain?" I hear you asking. Glad to see you're paying close attention. A blockchain – or as my poker buddies call it, "Distributed Ledger Technology" (DLT) – is just a fancy term for a distributed database shared among digital nodes of a computer network in which the information is stored electronically, thereby enabling cryptocurrency systems to maintain a secure, decentralized record of transactions, without any governmental regulatory interference.

One type of cryptocurrency is a "token." Think of it as being kind of like a bus token – but only in the way it is spelled. Now, wasn't that simple? But what you might not know is that blockchain is used in a decentralized way so that no single person or group has control – other than Mark Zuckerberg, obviously.

You've probably heard of Bitcoin. It was the very first cryptocurrency, introduced way back in 2008. Since then, more than 16,000 other cryptocurrencies have been launched (and thousands of them have crashed and subsequently vanished).

I recently learned there was even a hot cryptocurrency called TimCoin. So, naturally, with a great name like that I decided I had to go all in. I was all set to cash in our entire IRA portfolio – until my wife read that it was just a scam. Apparently, all the initial investors lost everything when it was discovered that the CEO had used the funds to purchase "extremely rare seeds" and repair a hole in her kitchen due to a small fire. (True.) I guess I dodged a bullet there.

Okay, I have to confess. I've read articles and watched news stories intending to explain Crypto, digital tokens, blockchain, Binance Smart Chain networks, and something called "bitcoin mining." And I still can't grasp what any of it means. For this article I just Googled "what is cryptocurrency." I have no idea what the words I have been writing even mean. I was just trying to impress you. Did it work? I didn't think so.

If you're still confused as to what all the hoopla is about crypto, you may be asking, "Is it risky?" It all comes down to your level of risk tolerance. If you're the kind of person who gets a rush out of putting down \$10,000 on 22 at the roulette table in Vegas, if you get an adrenaline high from trying to outrun the bulls in Pamplona, desperately hoping to avoid being gored to death, or if you're a big fan of Ponzi schemes, then something tells me crypto just might be totally your kind of thing.

If on the other hand, you might like to retire someday with most of your 401K intact and still be able to take that Mediterranean cruise you've been dreaming about for years, then perhaps you might want to sit out the crypto craze. Apparently, it's the Wild West of investing, as it's a virtually unregulated industry with huge, sudden market swings up and down – much like my daughter and her feelings about her latest boyfriend.

Incredibly, if you lose your crypto "wallet" password, you're completely screwed. No bank or government agency will bail you out – not even Oprah, and she is extremely generous. A few years ago, there was a guy who misplaced his Bitcoin password – never could remember it. As a result, he couldn't access his Bitcoin account. His \$250 million investment was literally locked in a cyberspace vault forever. Poor guy. He should have used an easier-to-remember password. Had he used my universal password ("PASSWORD123"), he'd be rich today.

My advice, if you're contemplating getting into crypto: Do extensive research. Otherwise, you probably should avoid it altogether – unless you're really good at remembering your password.

Invest in something less volatile. In fact, the other day, a buddy of mine told me about another hot new investment vehicle that sounds like a sure thing. It's called Non-Fungible Tokens or NFTs for short.

I asked him what an NFT was and he said. "It's a unique unit of data employing technology that allows digital content – from videos to songs to images – to become logged and authenticated on cryptocurrency blockchains so that you can easily own and sell digital content."

Umm, I have absolutely no idea what the hell any of that means. But I do know one thing: I'd better get in on this NOW, before the buzz around NFTs start to cool off. Don't tell my wife. I want to surprise her.

We're aiming for one column each month, so if we're not in the current edition, look for us in the next one.

Since it's spring – or at least it's trying to be – we'd like to share a few warm-weather safety reminders with you:

Window screens: Window screens aren't designed to keep kids in – they're designed to keep bugs out. Window screens are supposed to come out easily in case of a fire. That means a child who leans against a screen can easily fall out of the window because that screen isn't design to support their weight. If you have second-floor windows, make sure your little one doesn't have easy access to an open window and only open windows a few inches. You can also purchase window locks for as little as \$5 at most hardware stores.

Weed-burning torches: Propane-fueled weed-burning torches kill weeds and can be faster (and easier) than weeding by hand. They can also start fires in the blink of an eye. Make sure you have a garden hose or water source nearby – just in case. And avoid using your weed-burning torch around dry grass, leaves, branches, or ornamental bark.

Life jackets: Life jackets save lives. New technologies have also made life jackets smaller, lighter, and less uncomfortable to wear. You should always wear a life jacket when you're on the water – on a boat, on a kayak, on a paddleboard, or anywhere you're away from the shore and at risk of being in the water. If you don't have your own, visit our loaner life jacket cabinets at any public boat launch on Camano Island.

DIRECTIONS: 1. MARINADE: In a medium bowl, whisk together pineapple juice, soy sauce, brown sugar, ketchup, chicken broth, ginger, and garlic. Reserve 1 cup of marinade for basting. 2. Add the chicken thighs and marinade to a gallon Ziploc bag; marinate at least 3 hours or overnight. 3. Preheat an outdoor grill to medium-high. 




