
SNOHOMISH CONSERVATION DISTRICT'S CONSERVATION STATION



is the perfect way for children of all ages to create a habitat for all the bugs and insects that they love to find on their explorations into nature. The materials should be things that you find in your own environment like twigs, bark, broken pots small rocks etc.

Supplies: Large Plastic Soda Bottle; Scissors; Twine; Twigs, bark, broken pot shards, small pine cones etc.

Instructions: Cut top and bottom portion of bottle off so that all that is left is the cylinder of the bottle. Cut that cylinder in half. Stuff the cylinders with twigs and other materials so that you have created lots of nooks and crannies. Stuff them fully so they don't blow around too much. Tie twine around the bottle and hang it where it is kept fairly stable. You can also secure one on the ground between two supports like bricks to see what different kinds of bugs you will find on the ground.

I clicked the button to have a tech support agent call me. Twenty minutes later my phone rang. The readout indicated the call was that company. Oddly, it only rang once and then the call dropped. I tried to call back the number on my phone, but I reached an automated message: "We're not able to accept incoming calls to this number. Please visit our website to request a call back."

I then navigated the maze back to the CONTACT US page. I clicked on the button to request a call back – again. That triggered this message: "Our records indicate that you have already requested a call back. Please wait until you receive that call." Arrgh!

I waited thirty minutes. No success. Feeling stymied, I tried their online CHAT to request a phone call. Within a minute Agent Adrian generically typed, "How can I help you?" I explained I had requested a call, then the call dropped after one ring and the system would not allow me to make another call request. "Could you just tell someone in your tech support department to call me?" I pleaded.

Agent Adrian typed back, "I'm sorry but this CHAT feature does not allow us to talk by phone with the customer." "I know that," I wrote back, frustrated. "I get how online chat works." I pounded away at the keyboard, trying again to explain that I just wanted to have someone from their tech team call me.

Then, like a broken record, Agent Adrian, who by now I was fairly certain was a bot, typed, "I'm sorry but this CHAT feature does not allow us to call the customer." Instead he / it offered to help me via their web-based chat utility.

I copied and pasted my long list of questions into the chat message field and pressed SEND. Seven minutes later, the Agent Adrian bot resurfaced: "I'm sorry. You'll need to talk to a member of our tech support team. You can request a call back by visiting our website. Thank you." He / it then abruptly closed out our session.

I guessed that enough time had elapsed to take a chance and try clicking on the "Call me" button again. I guessed wrong: "Our records indicate that you have already requested a call back. Please wait until you receive that call."

I tried using the online chat app again and listened as the Agent Paul bot offered this by now very familiar feedback: "I'm sorry but this CHAT feature does not allow us to talk by phone with the customer." I explained – again – that I needed to talk to a LIVE PERSON BY PHONE! Finally, Agent Paul relented and agreed to try to find someone to call me. I'm pretty sure Agent Paul was going to be summarily fired for violating Online Chat Policy Rule #1: Never



let the customer talk to a live human being. Or perhaps he'll just be rebooted and upgraded to a more recent security protocol.

An hour went by. Noone called. I tried their "Call me" option one more time. To my surprise twenty minutes later, I received a call from KDP tech support. This time the call did not drop. This time I was actually able to present all my questions to an actual live person. After describing my problems in exhausting detail, tech support Agent Thomas explained: "I'm in first level tech support. I can't help you with your issues. You'll need to talk to someone in Senior Level tech support. Would you like me to transfer you?"

"Sure," I said. "I'll be most curious to see what rabbit hole this sends me down," I muttered under my breath. Agent Thomas put me on hold. Ten minutes later someone came back on the line: "This is Thomas again. Would you still like to continue to wait to speak to a Senior Level support agent?"

"Um, yes, I would. Thank you." "Okay, please hold." The next sound I heard was the soothing, familiar melody of ... of another dial tone. My call had been dropped. Again. It's now been over five hours. I'm still waiting to talk to someone about my issues. I'm sure they'll be calling me back... any moment now.

CAMANO FIRE CREWS THANKED FOR LIFE-SAVING RESPONSE

The widowmaker. That's what doctors call the heart attack that Jon survived. Jon and his wife Dianne visited Station 4 today to thank the 911 dispatcher and Camano Fire EMTs and Paramedics who saved his life.

"The cardiologist says you saved the day," Jon said. "It was textbook perfect."

When he called 911 on April 23, one of Jon's arteries was 100% blocked. Jon had no symptoms other than "the elephant on my chest" His father passed away from a heart attack at 58, so when he started feeling uncomfortable, he didn't wait to call 911. ICOM 911 dispatcher Sarah took his call. A trained EMT herself for North Whidbey Fire, Sarah kept Jon talking as she relayed his symptoms to Camano Fire crews. Then Jon stopped talking and went unresponsive.

"You said, 'I think I'm going to black out,' and then nothing," Sarah said.

Camano Fire paramedics performed what the hospital called "excellent CPR" and shocked Jon four times to get his heart back in rhythm. Before discharge, the hospital took an EKG and found something remarkable: Virtually no muscle damage to the heart. Doctors were shocked to find his heart muscle in such good condition after a "widowmaker" heart attack. Jon said he has full heart function – though he's still adjusting to his new heart medications. Jon also thanked his neighbor Linda, a secretary for Camano Fire, who was on scene that afternoon and who helped take care of his wife while he was in the hospital.

"We have a pretty special neighbor relationship," he said.

Remarkably, this is the second time Camano Fire has saved a life in Jon's family. In May of 2011, EMTs and Paramedics responded after his wife Dianne suffered a brain aneurysm.

"I don't know what to say, just the most sincere thank you to everyone," Jon said.





TACOS: 1 lb. lean ground beef or turkey; 1 (1 oz.) pkg. taco seasoning mix; 6 (2-2.5 oz.) bags corn chips, Fritos, Doritos, Sun Chips, any flavor; 3 c. shredded lettuce; 2 tomatoes, seeded and chopped; 1 1/2 c. shredded cheddar cheese

ADDITIONAL TOPPINGS: Black beans; Olives; Onions ; Pickled jalapenos

DRESSINGS: Salsa; Sour cream; Guacamole; Ranch salad dressing

DIRECTIONS: 1. Brown ground beef in a large skillet over medium heat. Drain off excess grease. Mix in taco seasoning and prepare according to package directions. 2. 
