



Supplies: Old Magazines; Clear Contact Paper; Scissors' Glue Stick; Black Electrical Tape

Instructions: Cut out pictures, words and letters from old magazines. Arrange pieces in a pleasing manner, overlapping to completely cover a 8 inch square. Use glue stick to tack pieces in place. Cover with contact paper. Turn over and cover the back with contact paper. Trim evenly to 8 inch x 8 inch. Fold in half. Run electrical tape across the bottom edge and long side folding it over to both the front and the back. Tape around the top opening.

### **MAKE A ROCKET!**

You can use a few simple materials at home to create your own rocket!

### WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- Empty film canister
- Construction paper
- Masking tape
   Scissors
- · Pen
- · Plastic Wrap
- Vinegar



### INSTRUCTIONS:

- Start by building the body of your rocket around the film canister. Flip the canister so that the lid is facing down. Roll a piece of construction paper around the film canister and secure with tape.
- Next, make a nose cone for rocket. Cut a small circle out of construction paper. Find the center and mark with a pen. Cut a line from the edge of the circle to the center point. Bend until it forms a cone shape and secure with tape. Faster onto the body of the rocket with tape.
- Cut a few fins for the base of the rocket (a triangle shape works well) and attach with tape. Head outside with your rocket and the rest of your materials.
- 4. Now, it's time to get your rocket fuel ready! Cut out a small square of plastic wrap and fill with about a tablespoon baking soda. Loosely wrap up the baking soda into a packet that will fit into the film canister.
- Turn the rocket upside down and remove the lid of the film canister. Place the packet of baking soda inside the canister and cover with vinegar. Quickly seal the canister and place the rocket on a flat surface.
- 6. Wait for the baking soda to react with the vinegar and watch what happens! If a reaction doesn't take place you may want to gently shake your rocket or try making fuel again, making sure the baking soda isn't so tightly wrapped.
- Experiment with different rocket shapes and see what happens when you adjust the shape and size of the nose cone or first Have fun creating!

### **STARVING ARTIST**

When I was really poor and competing for public art projects, I would have to go to various states for finalist presentations, usually competing with 3-5 other poor saps hoping for the same lousy commission. Once, on a project in Portland, Oregon, my arts commissioner recommended a 'reasonable' downtown hotel for me to stay at, probably 3 times what I'd ever spent on accommodations. I told her, gee thanks, but I'll find something more in my price range and she replied, "I don't want you sleeping in your truck." I assured her I wouldn't.

What I found, 20 or 30 miles outside Portland, was a \$23 a night hell-hole in Vancouver, Washington, a motel where, if you wanted a TV was \$5 more. If you wanted a shower, \$5 more. If you wanted a key, yeah, you guessed it. I chose the basic plan, slid 23 bucks under the bullet proof glass in the stainless steel bowl below and took occupancy of my suite.

My neighbors, judging by the water bowls and dog dishes outside their doors, were long termers, Lifers, I'd have to say, one step away from homeless or sleeping in their cars, running or not. The residents I met weren't looking for hellos or companionship or even a drinking buddy. They were folks who wanted to be left the hell alone. Misery, by the way, does NOT love company.

I have stayed in plenty of fleabag flophouses in my day, none as cheap as this dive, but unlike the others, my life wasn't threatened by surly neighbors on the great escalator down at this one the way it has been at some of the others. When folks reach rock bottom, I guess aggression is one of those virtues they abandon along with hope.

In case you're interested, I did not win the commission for the Portland Health Clinic even though I offered them a serious amount of glass for the project. Camano 101 is a free event that will be held at the Camano Center at 606 Arrowhead Road, on Sat. Sept. 24 from 1:00 to 4:00pm. There is plenty of parking and room for meeting your neighbors both indoors and out in a beautiful community gathering space. Take a beverage, a cookie, and meet the experts from 18 organizations that can help you make a happy, healthy home on Camano Island. For instance, you may not know that Island Transit provides a bus system that can take you around the Island, and from Camano to Stanwood, Mount Vernon, or Everett, for free! In fact, Island Transit's West Camano bus can take you to the Camano Center for this event upon request.

Staff from the Camano Center will tell you about ways you can get connected with the community through resources and activities at the center, health and fitness classes, and senior support programs. You can find out about the local parks and trails from the Friends of Camano Island Parks. Find out how to join a volunteer trail crew or other volunteer opportunities at Cama Beach or Camano Island State Parks. Get tips on how to landscape your yard to attract birds and wildlife. Learn how to identify and remove noxious weeds before they take over your property.

If you're a beach bum, or enjoy fishing, or crabbing, you might be interested in the volunteer projects and educational programs offered through the Shore Stewards, Marine Resource Committee or Sound Waters Stewards. You could learn about the efforts of the Whidbey Camano Land Trust to preserve beaches, forests and open space on the Island. Or find out about the free expertise offered through the Snohomish Conservation District that can help you protect the habitat, soil, forest, pasture, water quality and quantity on your property. The Camano Preparedness Group will help you get ready for the next emergency like the inevitable winter storms that take out power lines and close roads. The Camano Animal Shelter will help you find a new pet, a barn cat or trail dog, that needs a good home.

If you moved here from a more urban area where you were hookedup to a city sewer, you may not yet know how to live with and maintain a septic system. Though it is not a sexy subject, it is crucial to understand before you invite a lot of guests over for the holidays to avoid any deeply embarrassing, inconvenient and expensive incidents. 

# **OBITUARY - RENATE IDA TRAPKOWSKI**

(JULY 5, 1939 - JUNE 24, 2022). From the seaport town of Bremerhaven, Germany, where her life and love of the sea began on July 5, 1939, to the harbor town of Anacortes, WA, where her life on this earth ended on June 24, 2022, Renate Ida Trapkowski's life was an American success story. Renate was preceded in death by her husband Horst Helmut Trapkowski of Kalkberg, Germany, her parents Wilhelm and Elise Paschen of Germany, her brothers Burchard Paschen and Wilfred Paschen of Germany. As a child, Renate experienced and suffered through the tragedies and horrors of WW II. Her creativity emerged during those life changing moments — writing poems, inventing plays with the neighbor kids, unraveling sweaters to knit new ones and learning to play accordion. She had to grow up fast, be brave and guickly learn how to persevere through some of the most challenging of times — living as a little girl in war torn Germany. Her "can do" spirit gave her the strength to work through every obstacle that life presented. After emigrating to the US in 1963, she married Horst. Not speaking the English language, Renate had a strong desire to Americanize. By the mid-1960s she joined the Procter & Gamble Company (P&G) in Cincinnati, Ohio as a secretary, where she was later promoted to chief secretary. Renate eventually became an interpreter for P&G, interpreting German, French and English. Afterward and with her love of the sea tugging at her, she and Horst headed out west to Camano Island, WA, where she pursued her passion for painting. Art was woven through Renate's life, and layers of color became layers of friendship, discovery and expression. One layer was her friendship with two artists, Patricia Resseguie a fiber artist, and Marguerite Goff, a ceramic artist, who along with Renate, showed their works together for several years on the Camano Island Studio Tour. From that collaboration came the show 'Cascadia: Born from Nature'. In paint and fiber and clay the three artists focused on work reflecting their life in the Pacific Northwest. Another layer, vibrant and rich, commenced in 2007. A conversation about art, life, and community lead to the beginning of 'The Ladies of the Island', a group of 10 artists — Kathy Hastings, Liz Hamlin, Indy Behrendt, Susan Cohen Thompson, Jackie Roberts, Janet Hamilton, Lynne Nielsen, Patricia Resseguie, Marguerite Goff, and Renate; women who paint and write, who work in fiber, silver, clay, and wax. They were a community that became a profound part of Renate's life, with deep bonds of friendship, creativity, support, and great food. The 'Ladies of the Island' continue to gather, and it is with great sadness that they grieve the first death of one of their own. Renate's works were shown in numerous galleries and shows, and juried into the prestigious international ISEA (International Society of Experimental Artists) shows.

# WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT PICKLEBALL, AMERICA'S FAVORITE SPORT

By now, unless you're living in a cave somewhere in Mongolia, you've no doubt heard about the fastest growing sport in North America: Pickleball. And if by some odd circumstance you ARE living in a cave in Mongolia, how in the heck did this article reach you? Just curious.

As for the rest of us non-Mongolian-cave dwellers, it seems everybody is taking up pickleball. Here is a quick primer on what you're missing and what you need to know in case you were curious what all the buzz was about.

Even though few people had ever heard of this sport until three years ago, it's actually been around a fairly long time: Invented in 1965 by three people from Bainbridge Island, WA, it was named after the dog of one of the three inventors. The dog's name was "Ball." I meant to say "Pickles." I'm just glad his owner gave his dog a normal name instead of their original naming idea: Lord Chesterton of Belvedere. Otherwise we'd all be talking about LordChestertonofBelvedereBall.

The first thing you should know about LordChestertonofBelvedereBall, I mean Pickleball, is that you MUST BE OLD in order to play. In most states, the legal minimum is 60 years old. But check the applicable age restrictions in your region. (In North Dakota, you must be 85 – I have no idea why.) The penalty for underage pickleballing is being forced to watch old people play pickleball. Personally, that strikes me as cruel and unusual punishment.

This sport has become wildly popular all throughout America. According to one study, pickleball surged by nearly 40% between 2019 and 2021 to 4.8 million active players. Compare that to the Mayan sport of Pitz, a team sport popular in ancient Mesoamerica which involves a heavy rubber ball that teams try to get through a hoop on the wall. That sport's popularity has declined markedly to the point that you almost never hear the results of a Pitz match on ESPN anymore. Experts theorize that its dramatic decline in popularity was because it's a very difficult game to play – and because the losing team's players had to be sacrificed to the gods.

In stark contrast, in pickleball, losing players are almost never sacrificed to the gods. Why is this sport so popular? The answer is that it's easy to learn, takes only nominal skill to enjoy (a definite plus for me), and does not require much moving around. Perfect for seniors or anyone who is chronically lazy. And thanks to COVID, the sport took off in the past two years, as people looked for a safe way to interact with others that did not require them to be indoors or talk about whether they've been vaccinated.

Increasingly, longtime tennis and racquetball players have started transitioning to pickleball. This is because they're getting older and slower, and their younger, faster former tennis / racquetball partners have hinted to them, "Have you ever considered switching to pickleball, buddy?"

Pickleball blends aspects of ping pong, tennis, racquetball, and Pitz – but mostly just the first three aforementioned sports – to create a game that moves quickly and gives players a false sense that they are actually getting a lot of vigorous exercise. They are not.

To play the game, all you need are a net, a paddle, a wiffle ball, and the ability to count to 11. Skill is not a pre-requisite to play this



sport, as evidenced by the fact that several people familiar with my lack of athletic ability have invited me to play.

One key aspect of this sport is the rule that "there is no volleying in the kitchen." You may be asking, "What is the kitchen?" Glad to see you're paying attention and didn't bail after you read the part about Mongolian cave dwellers. Well, the kitchen is an area next to the net where players are not allowed to volley.

"Why is it called the kitchen?" Because calling it the "laundry room" iust sounded silly.

"But why can't you volley in the kitchen?" I have no idea why. I didn't make up this sport. No more questions, please! You're starting to get annoying.

So, if you're over 60 and you're looking for a way to become more active and meet lots of interesting people, my advice is this: Try golf or aerobic water jazzercise. But if those don't sound like your cup of tea, definitely give pickleball a try. But if that still sounds like too much effort, then maybe shuffleboard is more your style. I hear it's making a comeback.

# **PECAN PIE BROWNIES**

Fudge Brownies + Pecan Pie = Win Win!!

BROWNIES: 2 lg. eggs; 1 tsp. vanilla extract; 1/2 c. butter, melted; 1 1/4 c. granulated sugar; 3/4 c. cocoa powder; 1/4 tsp. salt; 1/2 c. all-purpose flour

PECAN PIE TOPPING: 1/2 c. corn syrup; 1/2 c. brown sugar, packed; 2 lg. eggs; 1 T. vanilla extract; 1/4 tsp. cinnamon; 1/4 c. butter, melted; 2 c. chopped pecans

DIRECTIONS: 1. Preheat the oven to 325 degrees. 2. BROWNIES: In a small bowl, beat together the eggs and vanilla; set aside. 3. In a large bowl, stir together melted butter, granulated sugar, cocoa powder, and salt, until well combined. Whisk in egg and vanilla mixture. Add flour, stirring until well combined. 4. Pour the brownie batter into a parchment lined 8 x 8-inch baking dish. Bake for 25-30 minutes. Cool for 20-30 minutes. 5. PECAN PIE TOPPIONG: Meanwhile, in a large mixing bowl, using a hand mixer, beat together corn syrup and brown sugar until smooth. Add the eggs, vanilla and cinnamon, beat until combined. Add melted butter and bourbon if using, beat until well combined. Stir in pecans. 6. Pour the pecan pie mixture over the cooled brownie layer. Bake for an additional 25 to 30 minutes, until the center is set. Let cool completely. 7. Score into 16 bars then refrigerate for at least two hours before serving. Remove from the pan and carefully cut into 16 squares. Refrigerate leftovers.


