

The room emptying of air and sound and mirth, as if a stopper had been pulled from the tub of our happiness and no matter how hard you try, and Brent desperately tried, that stopper won't go back in and all the merriment drains out by your feet and deep down in your cold curling guts you know, you know absolutely this is not the way you wanted to ring in the next year. You know what they mean by ill-omened now and all the months to come you will dread the next New Years' Eve the way you would dread death itself. And of course Liz and Brent broke up and Brent moved to the furthest corner of the earth and my brother admitted maybe that wasn't the best holiday icebreaker of all time and we decided either to forsake New Year's altogether or bring so many people in we couldn't possibly go around the room and play parlor games like Stab Your Lover.

And that is how the South End got its gala New Year's Extravaganza Potluck and BYOB Party. And of course, you're invited! Unless you got some serious issues with your girlfriend or boyfriend, lover or husband, wife or mistress. Then I think you got a new parlor game for you and a few select friends. Happy New Year anyway.





### HOPE FOR THE HOLIDAYS GIFT DRIVE RAISES \$10,000 FOR IMMIGRANT FAMILIES

Immigrant Resources and Immediate Support (IRIS), a non-profit serving Skagit and Whatcom counties, announces the conclusion of its "Hope for the Holidays" campaign, which generated more than \$10,000 in local contributions. Proceeds of the fundraiser were used to purchase food, blankets, warm winter clothing and household necessities for 38 local families. The majority of individuals served were from Latin America and the Ukraine. 

With a family of eight, not including any guests, it was a necessity. We whispered to each other in excited voices, wondering when Santa would come, anxious about the possibility he wouldn't bring the gift we most wanted. That year, Tom wanted a drum set. I wanted, above all else, a special baby doll."



### TOMATO BASIL SOUP WITH GRILLED CHEESE CROUTONS

This is one of my all-time favorite soups. It's easy to make and always tastes AMAZING! I promise you will NEVER eat tomato soup from a can again!

TOMATO BASIL SOUP: 1 T. extra-virgin olive oil; 1 med. yellow onion, diced; 4 cloves garlic, pressed; 1 1/2 tsp. kosher salt; 1 tsp. black pepper; 1/4 tsp. red pepper flakes, optional; 4 c. chicken broth; 2 (15 oz.) cans Hunts diced tomatoes, with liquid; 1 (10 oz.) can Hunts tomato sauce; 1 Parmesan rind; 3/4 c. chopped fresh basil, divided; 5 T. unsalted butter, divided; 1/4 c. all-purpose flour; 1 c. heavy cream GRILLED CHEESE CROUTONS: 4 slices soft white bread; 4 slices Sharp Cheddar cheese

DIRECTIONS: TOMATO BASIL SOUP: In a large Dutch oven, heat olive oil over medium-high heat. Add the onions, garlic, salt, black pepper and red pepper flakes, cook until softened, about 1 to 2 minutes. Add the broth, diced tomatoes with liquid, tomato sauce, Parmesan rind and 1/4 cup of the basil and cook, stirring occasionally, for about 30 minutes. Remove the Parmesan rind and puree the soup with an immersion blender until smooth, 2. In a small saucepan, melt 3 tablespoons of the butter. Whisk in the flour and continue to cook, whisking, until the mixture is lightly browned, 1 to 2 minutes. Add the cream and cook, stirring, until thickened. Add the cream mixture to the soup and cook over medium-low heat, stirring occasionally, until the soup has thickened, about 10 minutes. 3. GRILLED CHEESE CROUTONS: Meanwhile, melt the remaining 2 tablespoons butter in a medium skillet over medium heat. Place 2 slices of bread in the skillet; top each bread slice with 2 cheese slices, 2 tablespoons of the chopped basil and another bread slice. Cook until the bread is golden brown, and the cheese is melted about 3 minutes per side. Cut each sandwich into 9 pieces. 4. Serve soup topped with grilled cheese croutons and remaining chopped basil.
