





SLOW COOKER CASHEW CHICKEN

DIRECTIONS: 1. Combine the flour and black pepper in re-sealable gallon bag. Add the chicken to the bag, seal the bag and shake to coat. 2. In a large skillet, heat the oil over medium-high heat. Brown the chicken for about 2 minutes on each side. Place the chicken in the slow cooker. 3. In a small bowl, whisk together the soy sauce, vinegar, ketchup, sugar, garlic, ginger, and pepper flakes; pour over the chicken. Cook on LOW for 3 to 4 hours. 4. Stir in cashews. 




