





Camano Water Association (CWA) is looking to fill the role of Water System Technician. The individual chosen for this position will be under the direct supervision of the Operations Manager, who is responsible for routine operations, systems operations, equipment maintenance, water sampling, and customer service. 

Kid's Korner



CALLIGRAPHED EGGS DIY + FREE TEMPLATE

I love the idea of decorating simple and beautiful eggs through calligraphy. But let's be honest, it's difficult to write in a pretty font on a rounded surface. So, this year we had Julie Manwaring make us some templates to apply using tattoo paper. They were easy to make and even easier to clean up.

Material: Tattoo paper, scissors, hard boiled eggs, small bowl, water, paper towel

Step 1: Download the template—yes! It's supposed to be reversed—and print it out onto temporary tattoo paper (we used Silhouette Printable Tattoo Paper from Paper Source.) Step 2: With the print out in hand, closely follow the instructions provided on the tattoo paper packaging for proper application of the adhesive sheet. Step 3: Cut out one tattoo, remove the clear plastic layer, and apply with a very wet paper towel to a hardboiled egg, again referencing the tattoo paper instructions for additional application details. Step 4: Remove the paper backing and voila, a calligraphed egg!



ETCHINGS-N-STONE

Tom Gutierrez lives in the Pacific Northwest where he uses much of our abundant wild bird life (and other animals) as his art subjects. During his artistic journey he has created images using two mediums: Scratch board and Carvings in stone. Working on a board that has been covered with white clay then sprayed entirely with black ink, Tom has created images by scratching the surface with a sewing needle attached to an Exacto knife handle. This type of artistry – as you can imagine -takes many hours or even days to create, and just a bit of patience. Tom believes that stone carving and scratch board art can be two of the most exciting and satisfying experiences for any artist, when they discover and reach the point in the creative process where the image slowly and magically appears out of a black background or stone. With stone, you slowly realize that you have mysteriously been chosen to reveal an image that has been waiting silently in a rock, perhaps some 200 million years! Quite humbling - to say the least. Tom has been creating art for the last 27 years. He began his journey into drawing with pencil sketches, then moved into scratch art, and then tried his hand at stone carving, all of which started at the age of 50 years old! His hope is that his story may be inspirational and possibly open a path for others that may have never recognized a potential hidden ability, or at the least a new perspective of viewing art. 

ISLAND COUNTY BROADBAND ACTION TEAM NEEDS COMMUNITY FEEDBACK

In its effort to bring broadband internet services to underserved areas of Camano and Whidbey islands, the Island County Broadband Action Team is asking for the community's help. To achieve Washington state's goal of having universal broadband internet access by 2024, the county's Broadband Action Team is asking residents to take a Washington State 1-minute speed survey. Taking this simple survey will help to pinpoint areas of Island County where better internet service is needed. An additional way residents can help in the effort to bring better internet to Island County is through FCC Mapping. This is where residents can see options for internet in their locations and challenge the data provided to the FCC if it doesn't match personal experience. Click on the FCC site link and enter your address in the box to see who is reporting business or residential internet service at your location. If you believe the information is incorrect, you may challenge the data by clicking on the "Location Challenge" or "Availability Challenge" button. By taking the speed survey and providing mapping information, Island County residents can help the Broadband Action Team to obtain grant funding for open access networks that will better serve the community. In 2019, the Broadband Action Team was formed to provide broadband services to underserved areas within Island County. The objective is to close the digital divide, increasing opportunities for education, health and workforce development and to provide broadband accessibility to residents, students, government services, business entities, schools, libraries, health centers, and first responders. Since the launch of that effort, a study of broadband internet was completed identifying critically underserved and unserved areas in Island County. That study helped bring funding into Island County for construction of open access networks in South and Central Whidbey and a recent grant submittal on Camano Island. 



WELCOME TO CRICKET. IT'S A LOT LIKE BASEBALL, ONLY MORE BORING.

ESPN recently announced it's now broadcasting coverage of cricket. No, I'm not talking about televising small insects chewing through leaves – although granted, if you ask me, that sounds like a more appealing TV-viewing option. I'm talking about the sport of cricket. If you're someone who finds bowling on TV too exciting, then cricket could be just your cup of tea, so to speak.

I'm not exactly sure why ESPN decided to start covering cricket. Perhaps ESPN's International-Sports-Nobody-Gives-a-Rat's-Ass-About Channel wasn't able to get the programming rights for Equestrian Dressage. Or perhaps it came down to making a difficult choice between televising cricket versus broadcasting five hours of dead air.

Cricket is a very old game. Cricket is a lot like baseball – just slower-paced and without gloves or bases or David Ortiz Bobble Head Night or any coherent explanation for what is going on out there. Like baseball, it has a pitcher (which they call a bowler) and a batter (called a batsman). And like baseball, the main objective for most fans watching the game is to get as drunk as possible in order to keep their mind off the fact that the game in front of them is mind-numbingly dull.

Sadly, most Americans have never even seen a single game of cricket. So, let me explain briefly how the sport works. The object of the game is simple: score more runs than the opposing team. To do so, the team's batsman must leg out to the other end of the pitch and back and, of course, avoid letting the bowler strike the wicket causing the bails atop the stumps to fall.

The batsman ideally wants to hit the ball between the mid-off and the mid-on. A well struck ball might even make it past the long-off. Experienced batsmen wait patiently for the bowler to throw a belter or perhaps a full toss, which he can often successfully hit into a strong grubber, which, as you can imagine, is almost impossible to plumb. With me so far?

Two of the most important fielding positions in your standard ring field are the gully and the leg square because..... blah blah blah... This is killing me. I'm sure by now your eyes have completely glazed over, so it really doesn't matter what I write in this space, does it? Hey, did I ever deposit that check at the bank? And I wonder what that rattling sound is when I start the car. I guess I should probably get back to the point of this piece. It looks like you're about to wake up from your nap.

As best as I can surmise, there appear to be approximately 27 fielding positions in cricket, with names like gully, square leg, and mid-wicket. I have no idea what any of these positions does. My guess is their primary function is to take turns ordering tea and scones. There are a few common misconceptions about cricket. For example:

Myth: It's only played by stuffy, rich white Englishmen clad in white V-neck sweaters. Reality: They sometimes wear beige or cream-colored V-neck sweaters and sometimes also don a snappy cap featuring the coat of arms of the House of Gloucestershire or perhaps Kent.

Myth: A cricket match is insufferably long – typically lasting seven days. Reality: It only feels like that long while you're watching it. In



fact, the average match is typically over in less than three days. It only lasts up to seven if they go into sudden death overtime.

For the newcomer to this great sport, let me offer a few suggestions to help you enjoy watching cricket: 1: Get a comfy spot on the couch and pour yourself a spot of tea. Bake some crumpets while you're at it. 2: Skim a copy of Basic Cricket Rules for Beginners. I suggest the abridged 178-page version. 3: Inject 48 ounces of Red Bull directly into your veins. 4: After about 20 minutes, to avoid falling asleep, change over to the Fly Fishing Channel.

Cricket is a great sport, once you get in the right frame of mind, which usually only requires about three fifths of scotch. But if cricket is a bit too fast-paced for your viewing preference, switch over to ESPN-47 for their newest programming enticement: 24/7 coverage of chess. This weekend they're showing a Chess Master Marathon, featuring wall-to-wall coverage of classic chess moves. Personally, I can't wait till the segment on how to use the Two Knights Variation to outmaneuver the Hungarian Defense. Talk about spellbinding television.

CAROLEE'S CARROT CAKE WITH CREAM CHEESE FROSTING


Recipe from my "Other Mother" Carolee Prater. This cake is so AMAZ-ING! It always receives rave reviews!! It's the perfect cake for your Easter celebration, Enjoy!

CARROT CAKE: 2 c. granulated sugar; 4 lg. eggs; 1 c. vegetable oil; 2 c. all-purpose flour; 2 tsp. baking soda; 1 tsp. salt; 2 tsp. ground cinnamon; 2 tsp. vanilla extract; 3 c. shredded carrots; 1 c. nuts, chopped; 1/2 c. raisins

CREAM CHEESE FROSTING: 1 (8 oz.) pkg. cream cheese, room temperature; 1/2 c. butter, softened; 1 lb. confectioners' sugar; Fresh lemon juice as needed

DIRECTIONS: 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Grease a 9x13x2-inch cake pan and set aside. 2. CARROT CAKE: In a large bowl, beat together the sugar, eggs, and oil. Add the flour, soda, salt, cinnamon, and vanilla, beat until combined. Stir in the carrots, nuts, and raisins. 3. Pour the batter into the prepared pan and bake for 35-45 minutes. Let cool and frost with cream cheese frosting. 4. CREAM CHEESE FROSTING: In a large bowl, beat together the softened cream cheese, butter, and confectioners' sugar. If the frosting is too stiff, add lemon juice until spreading consistency is achieved. DUSTY'S NOTES: Pictured above: I made a 3-tier cake instead of a 9x13-inch cake. I divided the cake batter into 3 greased round cake pans and baked until a wooden toothpick inserted into the center of each cake came out clean. I doubled the frosting and decorated the top with "carrots" and the sides with chopped pecans, Enjoy!
