



Camano Water Association (CWA) is looking to fill the role of Water System Technician. The individual chosen for this position will be under the direct supervision of the Operations Manager, who is responsible for routine operations, systems operations, equipment maintenance, water sampling, and customer service. As such, whether a candidate has prior experience or not, our current Operator will be responsible for deciding the day-to-day scope and workload of the successful candidate. This list of possible work duties is not exhaustive, and any/all tasks considered within the scope and spirit of the position are expected to be undertaken by the successful candidate. 



My parents, when us little sprouts were growing up, never made much of a fuss over us. If we got good grades, they nodded approvingly. And if we didn't, they told us to buckle down and smarten up, school wasn't some game. They never came to our sports events to watch their star kids play and we were glad they didn't because, well, to be honest, we weren't stars. We were just your basic kids, vanilla, ordinary, okay.

When they became grandparents, however, things changed. Their grandkids, my god, they were Einsteins, they were football stars, they were just all around Wows. My friends who have grandkids have those same kids, all of them the smartest, best looking, most talented brats you ever had the privilege to hear bragged about. I don't know, maybe if I had kids, they'd be superheroes too. But I didn't and I bet they wouldn't be if I did.

When I look back at my childhood (okay, the early years, not the present years), I drifted through sandlot baseball games, marbles, some fights, some homemade soap box derby races, all the stuff we hoodlums did back in the halcyon days of Eisenhower's America. My folks didn't push us munchkins out into a competitive universe with a prescription for failure by convincing us we were God's gift to the free world. My folks accepted normal. So did we. What they wanted for us was happiness. It's not a bad wish. In their own hands-off way, they taught us how to get there.

WHAT TO DO WITH ALL MY KITCHEN SCRAPS

Let's transform food waste. Fruits and veggies have the highest wastage rate of any food products. A simple way to recycle food scraps is to produce your own compost. In your household, you can compost your food waste in a soil environment where lots of oxygen is available. The fungi and bacteria can break down the products into compost and CO2. Three easy ways to recycle food waste are as follows: 1. Bury your kitchen food scraps (excluding meats and dairy). Dig a hole about 1 foot deep, bury the contents, and cover with soil about 8" deep. It disappears quickly. 2. Food Digester - purchase a metal garbage can, drill holes on sides and bottom, and bury it. The worms will find their way into the container. This is an excellent choice for a limited-space property. Visit this website for complete information: https://tilthalliance.org/wp-content/uploads/2022/02/ Food-Digester-Feb09FINAL.pdf. 3. Worm Bin - purchase or go online to make a bin. The worms break down the food efficiently and create rich, dark soil. Again this is perfect for limited space. Visit this website: https://tilthalliance.org/wp-content/uploads/2022/06/GH-buildingplan-Wood-Worm-Bin-April-2021.pdf. There are so many benefits to recycling food waste. Composting decreases the demand for landfill space and decreases your reliance of synthetic fertilizers. Each year tons of uneaten food ends up the the landfill, where it breaks down in an anerobic environment, releasing harmful methane By keeping the food out of the landfill, you lower production of this potent greenhouse gas. MY SLIDING DOORS MOMENT

A Sliding Doors moment refers to a situation in which seemingly inconsequential moments nonetheless alter the trajectory of future events and a person's destiny. The term entered our lexicon thanks to the 1998 movie, Sliding Doors, in which the film alternates between two storylines, showing two very different paths the central character's life will take depending on whether she catches a train or just barely misses it (as the doors slide closed in front of her, hence the title).

My greatest Sliding Doors moment happened in December 1982. I was living in Columbus, having just recently completed my graduate MBA program at Ohio State. I had no job prospects lined up. I flew to Albany, NY, my hometown, for the holidays to visit my mom and sister. While there, I stopped by my father's law office to see some friends (my dad had passed away several years prior, but one of his partners continued the practice).

Just as I was leaving, heading for the elevator, a well-dressed older man was about to enter the office next doors. One of the people in my father's law office named Hazel introduced me to this man. She casually shared that I was a recent MBA graduate and was looking for work. I exchanged banal pleasantries with this stranger, shook hands, and moments later, I got on the elevator, never giving our fleeting visit a second thought.

I flew home to Columbus to resume my flailing job search. The next day, I received a call from Hazel. "Tim, you're never going to believe it, but remember that man I introduced you to in the hallway as you were waiting for the elevator? He wants to interview you for a job!"

hallway. That random stranger turned out to be the president of Knight Ridder Broadcasting, one of the largest chains of radio and TV stations in the country. But why would he want to interview me for a job? I was unemployed and had no relevant work experience.

It turns out that he was looking to hire a full-time advertising sales rep for the local Albany Knight Ridder television station. He had no idea that I was not living in Albany. But I was not about to tell him that and blow this opportunity. So, I flew back to Albany two days later for the interview.

During our interview, he had to take a phone call from one of his managers. The man on the other end of the line turned out to be someone named Al Gillen. After the call was over, the man explained that this was the same Al Gillen who had been a client of my father's many years ago when Al Gillen had been the president of a TV station in Flint, Michigan. (My father as an attorney represented several TV and radio stations.)

By now, in December 1982. Mr. Gillen was the president of Viewtron, a Knight Ridder subsidiary which was on the cusp of becoming the bleeding-edge forerunner to America Online (AOL) and a pioneer in online information technology that would eventually pave the way for the Internet.



I turned down the Executive's job offer to sell advertising for his Albany-based TV station. But I sent a letter to Al Gillen, asking for an interview for a position – heck, ANY position at Viewtron.

Mr. Gillen passed my resume on to one of his frontline managers. I flew down to Miami Beach, where Viewtron was headquartered. I had the interview and two weeks later, I received a job offer as an account executive. Two months later I drove to Miami, with my pet rabbit Boose and my parakeet Bob in the back seat. An exhausting (not to mention smelly) 18-hour, 1,200 mile journey.

A week or so into my new job, I was sitting in the lunchroom. Across the table was an attractive redheaded woman with a vaguely foreign accent. I could not place it. She turned out to be from Canada. Little did I know at that moment that three years later I would ask this person to be my wife.

On that December afternoon in 1982 in Albany, had I left that office just 30 seconds sooner or just 30 seconds later, I never would have crossed paths with that executive in the hallway. I would never have been sitting in his office at the precise moment he received that call from the president of Viewtron. And I never would have found myself sitting across the table in that Miami Beach lunchroom from my future wife.

CHICKEN MILANESE

Tender chicken cutlets coated with seasoned breadcrumbs, pan fried until golden brown and crispy, then topped with a light lemony arugula salad, Enjoy!

SALAD: 2 c. arugula; 1/4 c. red onion thinly sliced; 1/2 c. cherry tomatoes halved; 1 T. lemon juice; 1 T. olive oil; 2 T. shaved parmesan cheese; Kosher salt and pepper to taste

CHICKEN: 1 1/4 lbs. boneless skinless chicken cutlets or breasts, cut in half lengthwise; 1/2 c. all-purpose flour; Kosher salt and pepper to taste; 2 T. milk; 3 lg. eggs; 1 c. Italian style breadcrumbs; 1/4 c. panko breadcrumbs; 1/4 c. olive oil; 1 T. fresh parsley chopped

DIRECTIONS: 1. SALAD: In a large bowl, toss the arugula, red onion, cherry tomatoes, and shaved parmesan cheese together; cover and place in the refrigerator. Just before serving, combine the lemon juice and olive oil in a small bowl. Drizzle over the salad and season with salt and pepper. 2. CHICKEN: Use chicken cutlets OR chicken breasts cut in half lengthwise. Place each piece of chicken in between two sheets of plastic wrap. Use the flat end of a meat mallet or a heavy pan to pound the chicken thin. Repeat the process with the remaining pieces of chicken. 3. Pour the flour into a shallow pie dish, season generously with salt and pepper; set aside. 4. Pour the milk and eggs into a shallow pie dish, whisk to combine; set aside, 5. Pour the Italian breadcrumbs and panko breadcrumbs into a shallow pie dish, stir to combine; set aside. 6. Dip the chicken cutlets into the flour, then the egg mixture, then the breadcrumbs; repeat. 7. In a large skillet, heat the olive oil over medium high heat. Add the chicken cutlets in a single layer. Cook for 4 minutes per side, or until golden brown, crispy, and cooked through. Transfer to a serving plate and sprinkle with parsley. 8. Arrange the arugula salad either on top of or next to the chicken cutlets and serve immediately. Serves 4.
