



AMY BUSH

Camano has had artist Amy Bush's heart since 1972 when the Bush family cabin on Saratoga Passage was built. Prior to that her father's family vacationed at Cama Beach in the 1950s. Amy moved full time to Camano Island with her son, Gus, in 2020. She immediately became a member of the Camano Arts Association which she is now President of, and began volunteering with Gus at most of the beach walks led by the Cama Beach Foundation. Attending the Evergreen State College in the 90s Amy took advantage of the independent study program in which a student could design their own course. She studied woodblock printing in New Mexico, studied women artists and authors she admired and was swept up in the fervor of Riot Grrls' feminism, punk music, and politics (this was the height of third wave feminism- take a listen to Bikini Kill's Rebel Girl and you'll get right to Amy's soul) took figure drawing courses, learned to weld and handle woodworking tools- all for college credit! Her first job out of college was as a carpenter's assistant on a crew of 3 building a 5000 sq ft home right here on Camano, down by the Mbana schoolhouse. The following 25 years her making handmade candles in New Mexico, getting a bench jeweler's certificate in San Francisco, owning/ operating a retail store in Seattle called JayWalk that showed the art and craft of dozens of Seattle based artists and makers, then finally beginning her own jewelry line in 2017. The name of Amy's jewelry line, Loyalsmith, came from a two-column list of single words that had meaning to Amy. An extremely loyal person, Amy is now a metalsmith who makes her jewelry in her Camano workshop. Meet her on the Camano Island Studio Tour at Venue 23 John Hadley Studio.



HOOVES & HEROES



"Providing equine-based experiences, awareness, supportive services, and advocacy for our heroes and their families." Hooves & Heroes is a WA non-profit Corporation (501c3 pending) in Stanwood with a mission to provide supportive services to Veterans, Law Enforcement, Firefighters, Dispatchers, EMTs, Nurses, and others, primarily through equine facilitated programs and scholarships for mental health treatment and other needed services. Veteran participation in equine-related activities results in "...reduced anxiety and depression symptoms, reduced PTSD symptoms, elevated self-esteem and self-awareness, improved communication and trust, and increased overall well-being." Many Veterans and First Responders avoid seeking formalized treatment due to stigma or mistrust, and of those who do participate, a large percentage of participants show marginal improvement in symptoms, drop out of treatment before it is completed, and do not have long-term positive results. However, those who participate in equine-based programs have a higher participation and completion rate, statistically significant outcomes, and sustained results long after completion of the program. Simply spending time with horses outside of a structured therapeutic session can have immediate and marked impact on the individual who is interacting with the horse as well as those who share the experience with the person of focus for that session. ALLEN GILBERTSON REMEMBRANCE

Allen Gilbertson devoted more than fifty years to Camano Lutheran Cemetery. Fifty years is an incredible amount of time when you realize that in the 1970s, the Seattle SuperSonics battled the Bulls, Jaws was a favorite movie, Hitch-hikers Guide to the Galaxy a bestseller, and Happy Days a popular TV show. We used phones with cords (usually one per house) and no one we knew owned a personal computer. It is impressive that Allen Gilbertson dedicated fifty years to the Camano Lutheran Cemetery but that is not what makes his devotion so remarkable. It is the fact that every day, every single day (unless he was hunting), Allen tended to the cemetery. He not only did not miss a day, he could be seen at the cemetery two, three or more times a day. In the 1980s and '90s he shouldered almost complete responsibility for the cemetery. In his last fifteen years, Allen also visited Gilbertson Funeral home every day checking in on his good friend, David Brandt, sharing the latest news in Stanwood. And what did Allen do all these hours, each and every day? He checked on the general condition and needs of the cemetery. He arranged, supervised and paid grounds care workers. He met with people and showed them possible grave sites, marked graves, communicated with the cooperating funeral homes, kept the cemetery records, oversaw cemetery meetings, and maintained the financial records. He listened to those with complaints and accommodated those with special requests as he was able. Whatever needed to be done, Allen did it. An example of his diligence was once he was trying to top a tree and the trunk split and sent his body flying 35 feet, snapping his femur in two places. Later, upon hearing that a tricky grave was being dug which might impinge on a burial site next to it, Allen insisted, wheelchair and all, on sitting next to the open grave. He oversaw and supervised while the diggers did their work to make sure the grave was dug correctly. But what Allen really did best was to keep the stories of those who were buried there. Our entrance sign reads, "... buried here are many of the original pioneers and Camano Island community members." Allen knew those people and knew their stories and often their secrets. Lucky was the person spending the day with Allen at the cemetery listening to fascinating tales of yesteryear. They say an animal, instinctively, knows the measure of a man. We can say for certain that our Australian Shepherd, Auggie, thought that Allen was the most wonderful person in the world. She would wait each morning for him to arrive on our porch for the morning cemetery update, and would jump, and bark, and twirl and smile as he approached. He always had a good word, a warm pat and a friendly smile and always a special treat for her. Auggie thought Allen was beautiful. Allen was a kind man and a friend, and he is very much missed. It is important that we dedicate this new site in Allen Gilbertson's memory, for he made a difference, and we should never forget his story.

The Warm Beach Camp has been working in partnership with North County Fire / EMS to help improve emergency responses to residents that may be staying long term within the grounds. The Community Risk Reduction Division (CRR) of North County Fire / EMS recently identified a need and provided new address signs to be utilized to mark each lot or home within the grounds that someone may be living at. "This will really be a game changer for our first responders to this location. As our agency's call volume has grown to over 10,000 calls a year being able to locate an incident guickly continues to be a priority for us." said Battalion Chief Jason Brisson. The signpost material for this project was donated by Camano Island Cascade Lumber Company and the camp staff will be working on installing these posts very soon. "Warm Beach Camp has always focused on supporting the local community. One way we try to do this is working alongside North County Fire / EMS on community safety projects whenever possible." said Camp General Manager Eugene Barnes. "I have seen a great deal of changes here since starting thirty years ago and this item has been one that I have looked forward to seeing happen for a longtime." Barnes added. 


Welcoming Friends, Enriching Lives. In 2019, the Camano Center ended our Adult Day respite program due to COVID 19. We were committed to bringing back this much needed support program and began working on plans to reinstate the program over the past year. In this process, we came across a program called The Old Friends Club that had a similar structure to our Adult Day Program but offered the added benefit of a network of other locations, training opportunities, a complete tool kit of resources and the expertise and support of Dementia Support Northwest (a non-profit focused on educating people about dementia-related diseases and supportting care-giving partnerships). The Old Friends Club is a community-based social respite program that works to provide reliable, scheduled respite to those caring for a friend or family member living with dementia. Originally started in Carnation, Washington in response to a closing Adult Day Health program, Old Friends Clubs have now spread to four locations in King County. Dementia Support Northwest has expanded that service network further, bringing two programs to Whatcom County, with one program in Bellingham, and one in Lynden. Starting in July, the Camano Center will be bringing the Old Friends Club program to our own community by offering a program here at the Center once a week. Old Friends Clubs are designed to give care providers worry-free time to be at home, run errands, catch up with a friend, or relax and recharge in order to protect and maintain their own physical and mental health. Each Club is a place of friendship and belonging for those living with dementia, where they share life together through conversation, music, art, games, exercise, and a meal. A typical fivehour program at the Old Friends Club includes: Low-impact social time to encourage group engagement and support; Light physical activities; Art and other creative project; Group-oriented games and other forms of cognitive stimulation; Lunch, snacks, and light refreshments throughout the day. Other events may also appear in our programming, including guest performers from around our area, including musicians, presenters, and more, as well as some activities facilitated by those groups. Programming is constantly reviewed and updated to make sure it is aligned with the interests and passions of the members. 

S'MORES TRIFLE

How cute are these mason jars filled with graham cracker crumbs, marshmallow cream, and chocolate ganache topped with toasted marshmallows? The perfect dessert for your Memorial Day celebration!

CHOCOLATE GANACHE: 1/2 c. heavy cream; 4 full size Hershey's chocolate bars, broken into pieces GRAHAM CRACKER CRUST: 16 (8 whole) graham cracker squares; 3 T. butter, melted MARSHMALLOW FILLING: 1 (7 oz) jar marshmallow cream TOPPING: mini marshmallows 4 (8 oz.) mason jars

DIRECTIONS: 1. CHOCOLATE GANACHE: Heat the heavy cream in a saucepan over medium heat, until bubbles start to form on the side, about 2 minutes; remove from heat. 2. Add the chocolate to the pan. Let it sit for a minute or two, then whisk until smooth; set aside to cool. 3. GRAHAM CRACKER CRUST: In a food processor, pulse the graham crackers into fine crumbs. Add the melted butter, pulse a few times until the mixture resembles wet sand; set aside. 4. MARSH-MALLOW FILLING: Fill a piping bag fitted with a (1A) large round tip, with marshmallow cream. 5. TO ASSEMBLE: Spoon 1/4 of the graham cracker mixture into the bottom of each mason jar. Pipe 1/4 of the marshmallow cream over the graham cracker mixture. Pour 1/4 of the chocolate ganache over the marshmallow cream. Top with mini marshmallows. 6. Using a cooking torch, toast the marshmallows until browned and serve! Yields 4 (8 oz.) dessert jars.


