ISLAND COUNTY MASTER GARDENERS CELEBRATE THE PROGRAM'S 50TH ANNIVERSARY



On July 13, WSU Extension Island County Master Gardeners celebrated the 50th anniversary of the Washington State University (WSU) Extension Master Gardener Program. The regional celebration was held at the Skagit Master Gardener Discovery Garden and WSU Northwestern Washington Research and Extension Center in Mount Vernon, and attended by nearly 300 current and former Master Gardener volunteers from neighboring counties along with WSU Extension faculty and staff. Master Gardeners are Extension-trained volunteers who share information on horticulture and environmental stewardship with their communities through clinics, demonstration gardens, and local partnerships. Now a worldwide volunteer movement, the Master Gardener phenomenon began right here in Washington state, 50 years ago this spring. Island County was well represented at the event, hosting a booth that highlighted the work of our volunteers. The program included our own Dave Thomas, Master Gardener class of 1982, who exemplifies a long history of commitment to the community and passion for horticultural education. Dave's most recent project is teaching Oak Harbor youth the "wow" of gardening and the science behind it. Island County has nearly one hundred Master Gardener volunteers, who provide over 5000 hours of service annually. That service takes many forms, all designed to help our Island County residents thrive and adapt to challenging and changing environmental conditions – and to enjoy the beauty of our environment and the health benefits of engaging in gardening. Plant clinics at locations on Whidbey and Camano help to answer guestions on gardening problems. Classes and workshops provide science-based gardening knowledge in an accessible and practical way. The Education Garden at Greenbank Farm displays a variety of design and plant types suitable for our area. School gardens teach the next generations, and community food gardens provide produce to those in need. In a separate bowl, stir together flour salt and baking powder. Add the dry ingredients to the egg mixture, beat until smooth and creamy. 4. Pour batter into a funnel and use your finger to plug the hole. 5. When the oil becomes hot, move your hand over the pot and slowly release your finger so the batter can start cooking. Move the funnel around to make designs. 6. Brown on both sides, then immediately remove to drain on paper towels. Dust with cinnamon sugar, confectioners' sugar or top with berries and whipped cream, serve warm.


