HOW TO GROW CRYSTALS ON CHARCOAL



This is a really easy and fun science project. It's definitely something that requires adult supervision, though. But, I'll confess. This was almost more fun for me than for my kids!

Here's what you need: Charcoal (you can also use a sponge); Non-iodized Salt; Ammonia; Liquid Bluing; Water; Food Coloring (if you want it to be colorful)

Bluing is really interesting to me. When I told my mom that this experiment required bluing, she told me that my grandma used to use it to keep the whites white. I'm definitely going to explore the laundry uses in the future. It's not as hard to find as I first thought. None of the Walmart's in my area carried it, but Albertson's did. At it was only about \$3.1 know you can find it online as well, but with the cost of shipping it was ridiculously expensive. Also, it is non-toxic and biodegradable. It can be extremely messy, though. Think blue food coloring kind of spill. So, make sure you are helping with the bluing.

So, here's how you make it. First put some charcoal in the bottom of a glass dish. We tried both whole charcoals and broken charcoals. Both work really well. Then, spray the charcoal really well with wate. In a mason jar, mix up 3 tablespoons salt, 3 tablespoons ammonia, and 6 tablespoons bluing. I'm not going to lie. This part smell really strong! My kids had a hard time with the smell and at one time went running for the hills just to catch their breath. (It smells like what I would imagine bleach and ammonia smelling like. Not that I know for sure what that's. And please do NOT try mixing ammonia and bleach together!) To mix them, we put the lid on and shook the ingredients really well. Now, pour the liquid ingredients evenly all over the charcoal. Lastly, sprinkle 2 tablespoons of salt evenly over the top. You can stop there and the crystals will grow white. OR, you can add drops of food coloring all over and get a colorful crystal garden! Now just wait.....To keep the crystals growing, every two days mix up 2 tablespoons of water, 2 tablespoons of bluing and 2 tablespoons of ammonia then pour around the base of the charcoals.

ICE CREAM IN A BAG



Milk can become homemade ice cream in five minutes by using a bag! This homemade, creamy treat is a summertime delight for my boys and yours will love it too!!

- •1 tablespoon sugar
- •1/2 cup milk or half & half
- •1/4 teaspoon vanilla
- •6 tablespoons rock salt
- 1 pint-size Ziploc bag
- •1 gallon-size Ziploc bag
- Ice cubes

How to make it: Fill the large bag half full of ice, and add the rock salt. Seal the bag. Put milk, vanilla, and sugar into the small bag, and seal it. Place the small bag inside the large one, and seal it again carefully. Shake until the mixture is ice cream, which takes about 5 minutes. Wipe off the top of the small bag, then open it carefully. Enjoy!

Just a note... a 1/2 cup milk will make about 1 scoop of ice cream, so double the recipe if you want more. But don't increase the proportions more that that -- a large amount might be too big for kids to pick-up because the ice itself is heavy. Source: whiskusaway.blog-spot.com

THE DANGERS OF VALLE

- Causes irreversible brain damage: The part of the brain that's responsible for decision making and impulse control is not yet fully developed until age 25. Teens and young adults are at risk for long-lasting effects including nicotine addiction, mood disorders, and permanent lowering of impulse control.
- Causes attention and learning problems: Nicotine also changes the way synapses are formed, which can harm the parts of the brain that control attention and learning.
- 3. Nicotine in vape is highly addictive: Each time a new memory is created or a new skill is learned, stronger connections – or synapses – are built between brain cells. Young people's brains build synapses faster than adult brains. Because addiction is a form of learning, adolescents can get addicted more easily than adults.
- Gateway to smoking: Kids who vape are 4x more likely to start smoking which can lead to a lifetime of nicotine addiction.
- Toxic chemicals & metals: E-cigarette aerosol isn't harmless water vapor – it can contain toxic chemicals and metals.
- Weakens immune system: Vaping weakens the immune system, increasing susceptibility to all kinds of illnesses and infections.
- Nicotine overload: Teens may not realize the level of nicotine they are inhaling. For example, 1 JUUL pod = 20 cigarettes worth of nicotine.
- Blood vessel damage: Vape that contains nicotine can increase blood pressure and heart rate and cause arteries to stiffen up. That means a higher risk for a cardiovascular event (think heart attack).

GOT NETTLES?

The old adage --- when life gives you lemons, make lemonade --- is certainly true on the South End despite the fact that citrus is in short supply in our Banana Belt of Global Warming. Won't be long, but in the meantime we have an overabundance of nettles. Stinging nettles! Stalks that reach 7 feet high by late May. We got a jungle full of the monsters.

So every spring when the fresh stalks reach a foot high or so, we garb up with gloves and go harvesting. We eat the greens the way we'd eat steamed spinach, but what we're really after is that lemonade. Without the lemons. I'm talking, of course, about our infamous spring tonic: Nettle Beer. Folks accustomed to our exaggerations naturally think we're pulling their leg yet again. Nothing could be further from the truth this side of political e-mails. We brew the stuff, we age it and oh yeah, we quaff it too. Probably goes a long way toward explaining our artistic propensities down here. Reality, whether it's brewing or job avoidance, definitely skews away from the top of the bellcurve. It may even be true that the consumption of nettle ales cures a lot of what ails us, but the studies of South End longevity vs the Chablis drinkers of the polar North End , while statistically significant over the short term, are still out on the long.

Anecdotal evidence certainly bears scrutiny if Old Lady Kirby is any example. She makes a concoction that resembles nettle beer in name only, its primary ingredients having neither malts or hops. She calls it Tonic. I got other descriptors for it, but then I'm a confirmed Believer in the Barley and adjuncts like mango and ginger and lemongrass tea leave me scratching without the nettles. Nevertheless, I will say for a woman of her advanced age, she's a spry old gal. I've seen her and the mizzus two-stepping up a storm a few nights at the Hotel to some band a third their ages. Oh, I know, it could just be the clean living of the South End, but ... I suspect those nettle beverages clean out more than the cobwebs.



MAPLE WHISKEY GLAZED BABY BACK RIBS



These baby back ribs have amazing flavor. Start them off in the oven, steaming them until they are almost falling off the bone. Add the glaze, and by the time they're done, you'll find it was worth the wait!

RIBS: 1 rack baby back ribs cut in half; 2 tsp. dried thyme; Kosher salt and fresh ground pepper to taste; 2 c. chicken stock

GLAZE: 1/2 c. maple syrup; 1/4 c. Canadian whiskey; 1/4 c. orange juice; 1 T. Dijon mustard; 2 T. red wine vinegar; 2 T. soy sauce; 2 T. freshly grated ginger

DIRECTIONS: Preheat oven to 325 degrees. RIBS: Season both sides of the ribs with the thyme, salt, and pepper. Place the ribs, rack side down, in a 10×15-inch baking dish. Pour chicken stock into the bottom of the dish. Tightly wrap the dish with foil and bake for 90 minutes. GLAZE: Meanwhile, in a small bowl or glass measuring cup, whisk together glaze ingredients; set aside. Remove the ribs from the oven and increase the oven temperature to 375 degrees. Uncover the ribs and pour the glaze over the ribs. Continue baking for 30 minutes, basting every 8-10 minutes. Serve with garlic mashed potatoes or mashed sweet potatoes. Enjoy!

I'VE BECOME AN ARTIST - MAINLY TO COMPETE WITH MY WIFE

My wife is an incredibly talented artist. Even her name sounds like an artist: Michele Rushworth. We can be competitive in some ways, but the truth is, our talents tend to lie in totally different arenas. For example, she can make incredibly tasty, nutritious meals, and I cannot. On the other hand, there's not a sport you can name at which my wife can defeat me. That's because she has about as much interest in learning how to play, say, pickleball, as our cat Zippy has in learning about the intricacies of cryptocurrency.

But there's one area where, if I'm being honest, I must grudgingly admit my wife has the edge – anything to do with art. She went to art school. I, on the other hand, graduated from a liberal arts program with a degree in Communications – which, upon my graduation, opened up a universe of exciting possible entry level job opportunities – mainly in the food services industry.

For the past 25+ years, Michele has painted incredible, lifelike portraits of judges, university presidents, orchestra conductors, military generals, philanthropists, and snotty rich children posed next to their prissy Irish Wolfhound named Prince Tuckahoe. But her real passion is painting landscapes of lakes, coastal areas, flowers, mountains, and birds – in other words, chick stuff. I'm not one to toot my own horn, but I recently found out that I am the co-owner of the largest private collection of original Michele Rushworth artwork in the world.

Watching Michele create her masterpieces has inspired me to explore my own latent artistic potential. I retired a couple years ago so, I have more time on my hands lately. I believe there's room for more than one artist in this house. So, I put down my writing pen, picked up the paintbrush, and am now well on my way to challenging my wife for household artistic supremacy.

I've only been at it a couple months – three, if you count my color-by-numbers coloring books initiation. I recently completed a painting of a horse prancing around in a field with a red barn in the background. When I showed it to a complete stranger for their reaction, they had no idea what it was, thinking that it might be an octopus or perhaps a school bus or maybe a mutant platypus, with a red barn in the background.
