DIY: SIDEWALK CHALK "POPS"

Sidewalk chalk is a great way to encourage imagination and physical activity (hopscotch, tic-tac-toe, toy car racetracks, hangman, bean bag toss, checkers, etc). Mix up a batch of your own colorful DIY sidewalk chalk "pops."




Materials: Plaster of Paris, tempera paint (neon works best), silicone pop mold, wood craft sticks, plastic cups and plastic spoons. You'll also need cold water, scissors and measuring cups (not pictured).

A few important notes before we begin: 1. Do not put Plaster of Paris down your drain! It will harden in your pipes and cause damage. You can rinse very small amounts off your measuring cups and such, but get the majority of the excess (wet or dry) in the trashcan. 2. This can be messy. I would recommend doing it outside. 3. Cold water means between 40-50° F. Yes, it matters. Chill enough water in your fridge for 30 minutes prior to starting. 3. Older children may help with the mixing, but little ones probably shouldn't.

Begin by cutting down your craft sticks to about 3" long. You will need one plastic cup for each color you wish to make. Since my mold has eight spaces, I decided to mix eight different colors. Fill each plastic cup with 1/3 cup cold water. Add 2 Tablespoons of tempera paint to each plastic cup. I measured the first one then just eyeballed the rest. Since my paint set only had six colors, I created the purple (pink+blue) and aqua (green+blue) myself. Use your plastic spoons to gently stir the water and paint together. Don't worry if it remains a little chunky or separated—it will smooth out in the next step. Add 2/3 cup Plaster of Paris to each plastic cup. This is where it got messy and I learned my cups were a little too small. Stir until thoroughly combined. Ideally, your mixture will have the consistency of thin yogurt. Carefully pour your colors into the silicone mold. Gently tap the mold on your work surface to release any air bubbles. After two minutes, the plaster will begin to firm up. Insert your craft sticks (cut side down) into the middle of the chalk "pops." They should be easy to place without having to push hard or hold them up. Setting these out in the hot sun is a great way to cure them guickly. After an hour, you will be able to carefully remove them from the mold. Leave them in the sun to continue drying. Most sources recommend waiting 24 hours for the plaster to fully cure. This will ensure a nice solid chalking experience. Source: www.projectnursery.com.

Outdoor Burning Checklist





Outdoor burning is permitted only when there is NOT a county wide burn ban. Please refer to the Snohomish County Fire Marshal's website for more information.



Only recreational fires are permitted within the city limits of Stanwood. A recreational fire is defined as a cooking fire or camping fire using charcoal or firewood



Fires may **not** be greater than three feet(36 inches) in diameter and/or two feet (24 inches) in height. The location of the recreational fire shall be at least 25 feet from a structure.



A water source must be immediately available whenever the recreational fire is lit.



The fire must be constructed of a noncombustible material such as concrete or metal. (Example Fire Pit, Outdoor Oven, Chiminea)



NO garbage, household trash, lumber, building construction waste, or demolition debris may be burned. If smoke is determined to be a nuisance to

neighbors, the fire must be extinguished.



Public comments need to be submitted to the Parks Commission by September 27, 2024. More than one comment can be submitted during the comment period. If you want these cabins to reopen you need to let the State Parks Commission know how important and unique these cabins are to you. The Parks Commission will decide whether or not to permanently close the cabins at Cama Beach State Park at their October 10th meeting in Clarkston, WA.

TOPICS TO DISCUSS


- 1. Share your story or personal experiences at Cama Beach State Park.
- 2. The resort is on the National Register of Historic Places along with the Pre Contact Tribal site. Both sites are important, and both sites should be protected. Since the resort reopened in 2008, State Park employees have been respectful of the Tribes and procedures are in place to protect any culturally sensitive areas. Cama Beach is unique. As a large, intact 1930s saltwater waterfront fishing resort on the National Register, it is a time capsule of the more recent history of Camano Island and Puget Sound. It is living museum that people can use. At one time there were many resorts like this one around the Sound. This resort is the only one left and it allows visitors to step back in time. The Tribes could be doing educational programs about their history at the Park, but have chosen not to.
- 3. State Park management's implication that somehow there was careless indifference in cases of accidental disturbance of graves did not happen at Cama Beach State Park. The implication is not true. Prior to the Park opening \$2 million of archaeological survey work was completed to help protect the culturally sensitive areas. Work requiring digging that has happened at the Park since the opening in 2008 has not found any significant discoveries.
- 4. State Park management has not done a good job of maintaining and fixing problems at the Park. They are right, making temporary fixes isn't good enough. They need to make the necessary repairs. The systems that need repair, the septic system and the fire suppression system can and should be fixed. The septic system can be repaired. State Park management has yet to tell us what needs to be done and what the cost is for the repairs. The fire suppression system is also fixable. Again what needs to be replaced and what is the cost? If State Park management fixed these systems the cabins could be reopened.
- 5. The sea wall, like the other systems at Cama Beach, has needed work for several years. The sea wall is about 2100 feet in length. Some portion of 1500 400 feet needs repair. State Park management should have addressed this issue years ago. Now they claim they can't because of sea level rise. FEMA had federal money available for repairs, but State Parks did nothing to access the money. State Park management should be doing all it can to protect the site from sea level rise, but they have shared no options or costs with the public.
- 6. How does State Parks management decide to permanently close cabins without providing what the costs are to fix the systems that need work? The cabins have generated \$1 \$1.5 million in revenues each year. Some of that revenue could be used to do the repairs. In addition the cabins at Cama Beach are a big attraction for the Island and the money spent by visitors is very important. In 2023 there were 273,000 visitors to the Cama Beach State Park. According to a Park Study those visitors spent about \$8,829,000 in the area and created 71 full and seasonal jobs. State Park management has not discussed the loss of this income to the area in their discussion of closing the cabins. The decision to temporarily close the cabins has already had a serious impact on businesses who are dependent on Park visitors. And given the expected population growth in the region having good public access to the waterfront and rentable cabins on the beach would seem to be highly desirable.
- 7. Cama Beach State Park is a wonderful and unique place. The decision by State Park management to permanently close the cabins at the beach is ripping the heart out of this Park. It is the cabins on the beach where visitors can spend time listening to the waves at night, looking at the stars, building special memories with their families, and learning about the bygone eras of Puget Sound that makes this Park so special. Ask the State Park Commission to get the cabins reopened as quickly as possible. Then, we can work together on the longer term issues

The superpowers of eelgrass







DUNGENESS CRAB TACOS

Fresh caught Dungeness crab tacos topped with homemade corn salsa and cilantro lime crema, Enjoy!



CORN SALSA: 2 ears corn on the cob; 2 c. cherry tomatoes, sliced in half; 6 green onions, thinly sliced; 1/2 c. cilantro, chopped; 3 T. finely diced jalapenos, seeds & membranes removed; 5 cloves garlic, pressed; 2 T. extra virgin olive oil; 1 lime zest and juice; 1/2 tsp. salt

CILANTRO LIME CREMA: 1 c. sour cream; 1/4 c. mayonnaise; 3 cloves garlic, pressed; 1/2 c. cilantro; 1 lime zest & juice; 1/2 tsp. salt

TACOS: 10-12 corn tortillas; Extra virgin olive oil for brushing; 2 c. fresh cooked crab meat (about 2 whole Dungeness crabs); 2 c. shredded white sharp cheese or mozzarella or combo

DIRECTIONS: 1. CORN SALSA: Shuck the corn on the cob. Cut the corn kernels off the cob and place in a medium bowl. 2. To the bowl, add tomatoes, green onions, cilantro, jalapenos, garlic, lime zest and iuice, olive oil and salt. Gently toss to combine. Cover and refrigerate until ready to use. 3. CILANTRO LIME CREMA: In food processor or blender, add sour cream, mayonnaise, garlic, cilantro, lime zest and juice, and salt. Process until creamy, but green flecks are still visible. Pour into a small bowl, cover, and place in the refrigerator until ready to serve. 4. TO ASSEMBLE THE TACOS: In a large nonstick skillet over medium heat, brush olive oil on one side of a tortilla, flip and brush the other side. Once the corn tortilla is crisp, flip and immediately top with a handful of cheese and crab. 5. Once the cheese has melted and the crab is warmed, remove the taco to a serving plate. Repeat these steps with the remaining tortillas. (I use two skillets at the same time making the cooking time faster.) 6. Top each taco with corn salad and cilantro lime crema. Serve and enjoy!

A SURVIVAL GUIDE FOR COPING WITH AIRLINE TRAVEL

When Orville Wright first took flight over the beaches of Kitty Hawk, NC in 1903, he couldn't have imagined that a century later, millions of people the world over would be getting into shouting matches with ticket agents, security screeners and baggage handlers over the nearly universal frustration caused by his invention. Thanks for the 12-inch gash in the side of my brand new suitcase, Orville.

The first rule of air travel is simple: Don't fly if you can possibly avoid it. But sometimes air travel is unavoidable. If you simply must book a flight, here are a few helpful tips to reduce your stress level. These just might help you resist your urge to strangle the Delta Airlines ticket agent in Concourse C.

Packing: If you absolutely must fly I recommend packing light, so that you can fit everything into a carry-on and avoid the delay of waiting for your luggage at baggage claim on your arrival. It may force you to make some difficult decisions – like which to leave home: your sun lamp or your snow cone machine. Hard choices, I know.

If packing for a longer trip, a carry-on might not always be an option. You may need a larger suitcase. By FAA guidelines, your luggage can only be one of five colors: black, grey, blackish grey, greyish black or navy blue. It's easy to mistake your bag for someone else's, so make sure it stands out by attaching a brightly colored neon orange strap securely to the handle. Once the luggage comes down the carousel, your bag will easy to spot. Yours will be the one missing the brightly colored neon orange strap – as well as its handle.

Boarding: For many of us, the most exhausting part of air travel is waiting in all those long lines. When going through TSA Security, you will usually have several lines to choose from. It's important to know which is the slowest. Here's a simple rule of thumb: The slowest line will be whichever one you decided to get in.

Your line will inevitably be the one stalled by the traveler who barely speaks English embroiled in a twenty-minute heated debate with the TSA agent (who also barely speaks English) arguing that the army surplus bowie knife he tried to sneak through is a gift for his seven-year-old niece. Just accept your fate and just pick a random line. Then start taking off your shoes, socks, belt, overcoat, shirt, slacks, and underwear for the TSA screener. But leave your glasses on – unless they're your night vision goggles.

As you board the plane, it's important to be patient. The time it takes to reach your seat will vary between ten minutes and a week-and-a-half. 


