#### PAPER BAG KITE CRAFT



Supplies Needed: paper lunch bags; yarn or strong twine/string; popsicle stick; scissors; streamers; tape; scissors; embellishments: stickers, paint, markers, crayons, construction paper, washi tape

Directions: To get started, the kids can decorate the paper bags using a variety of embellishments. Stickers and washi tape work really well to add some fun prints and colors! They could also draw designs with markers and crayons or add polka dots and stripes using washable paints. Just make sure the paint is dry before moving on to the next step. Using a pair of scissors, snip a little hole on the bottom base of the bag. This will be used for the kite string. Cut a piece of yarn or string about 18-24 inches long. Tie one end to the middle of a popsicle stick and feed the other end through the hole in the bag. The popsicle stick will keep the kite string from pulling out when it's flying. Attach streamers to the open end of the bag using tape. Now the kite is ready to fly!

#### **APPLE (OR PUMPKIN) RICE KRISPIES TREATS**

We start with our BEST Rice Krispie Treat recipe (below). Add some red (or orange) food coloring, shape into apples, add a pretzel stem and some gumdrop leaves.



Ingredients: 6 tablespoons European-style salted butter, cut into small pieces; 16 ounces Kraft Jet-Puffed Marshmallows; 7 cups Kellogg's Rice Krispies Cereal

#### DID YOU KNOW?

It is impossible for most people to lick their own elbow. (try it!)

Instructions: Grease a 9 inch by 13-inch pan with butter or spray with baking spray. Grease a large mixing bowl with butter or baking spray and pour in the cereal. Begin melting the butter in a medium-large saucepan set over low heat then stir in the marshmallows. Continue to melt over low heat, stirring often, until about 75% of the marshmallows have melted. Remove the pan from the heat and stir vigorously until all of the marshmallows have melted. Pour the melted marshmallows over the Rice Krispies Cereal and toss to evenly coat. Spread the mixture into the buttered pan and gently press into an even layer. Let the cereal treats cool for at least 30 minutes before cutting into 18 rectangles. Notes: We recommend using Kraft Jet-Puffed Marshmallows. They have great texture and flavor. We found store-brand marshmallows to be stickier. Store your treats in an airtight container at room temperature for up to a week. Do NOT refrigerate your treats. They will become stale-tasting if stored in the fridge. Do NOT compact the cereal treat mixture into your pan or you will end up with very dense, hard treats. Gently press the mixture into the pan.

### CAMANO FIRE SENDING 5 NEW HIRES TO FIRE ACADEMY

Camano Fire will send five more new hires to the Snohomish County Fire Training Academy this September – along with one department firefighter who will serve as an academy company officer. These new career firefighters were hired with funds from the voter-approved levy lid lift in 2023. Two are existing paramedics, one is a current part-time firefighter, while the other two are new to the fire service and will earn their Firefighter 1 certification. "These firefighters make it possible for us to meet our staffing goals for the Mabana station" Chief Levon Yengoyan said. "We are continuing to work on facility improvements so we can staff the station full-time." The new hires will spend three months at the academy beginning in mid-September. After graduation in mid-December, they will rejoin their shifts. This is also the first time that Camano Fire will send one of its career firefighters to support this academy class. Several local fire agencies share the training costs and contribute the staffing needed to run each threemonth academy class. "Sending an officer to support the academy is a great way to give them more experience in a leadership role." Chief Yengoyan said. "They'll get hands-on training in personnel management, performance evaluations, and other management-level training that will benefit our own department."

### I WILL NEVER FORGET: 9/11 IN NEW YORK



The events of 9/11 will reign in my heart forever. Along with the rest of the nation, I sat in horror watching the televised events of that awful day. Although a volunteer, it didn't occur to me that the American Red Cross would take an active role in the recovery process, but it soon became evident that New Yorkers in all walks of life were affected. Apartments within a huge radius were evacuated, jobs evaporated, life as New Yorkers knew it was horribly altered.

My first three weeks after 9/11 were spent in Washington, D.C. helping to set up a national American Red Cross call center. Those affected needed one central place where they could inquire about loved ones, where to find temporary housing, get mental or spiritual help; others needed to know where to go to give blood, volunteer help, donate money.

Soon after Washington, D.C., I was deployed to New York and my life was changed forever. I was assigned to Pier 94, a huge FEMA facility in Manhattan that coordinated more than 100 agencies under one roof. It was a one-stop shop where people could come for financial and emotional assistance.

Every assistance agency imaginable was represented at Pier 94: New York Police and Fire Departments, Salvation Army, housing authority, child welfare, unemployment, missing persons, insurance companies. The American Red Cross assisted people who lost family members, they helped families through financial crises that occurred as a result of the bombing, they set up respite centers where relief workers could rehydrate and relax.

Pier 94 was a somber place. We were aware at all times how affected these people were on so many levels. No cameras were allowed. Confidentiality and privacy were high priorities.

The Red Cross had a huge team of Mental Health workers available to the public, first responders and aid workers, as well as a large contingency of chaplains who circulated around the vast building. We even provided child care, staffed by church groups, so that people could talk to agencies without the distraction of small children. My personal responsibility was to give financial assistance to people who suddenly couldn't pay their bills, they had been thrown in financial chaos.

### DID YOU KNOW?

Octopuses don't have tentacles. Their eight limbs are considered as arms. Even dog clubs organized to give comfort. Throughout the day, well-behaved dogs were guided through crowds, stopping when a child needed to bury his head in comforting fur, or when an adult, overcome by grief, just needed to look into soft eyes and cry. It was obvious to me that the dogs sensed profound sadness, a deep melancholy that prevailed on Pier 94. I marveled at these dogs and their gracious owners who spent hours circulating through the crowds bringing calming comfort.

Local restaurants donated their services and food, preparing breakfast, lunch and dinner for all those who served. It was my pleasure to share meals with people of all represented agencies. I had never spent time in New York, and talking with police, fire fighters, and those of other agencies was an eye-opening experience for me. I found New Yorkers warm and friendly, and so appreciative of people who were there to help.

When I had a few minutes, one of my favorite places to visit on Pier 94 was a long corridor decorated with gifts from the people of Oklahoma City who had suffered from the bombing in 1995. Flowers, dozens of teddy bears, pictures, notes from adults and children, it was an outpouring of love that brought tears to my eyes every time I visited that section of the building.

New York's Thanksgiving parade had a special meaning that year. Sure, we experienced the relief of laughter–you have to laugh at clowns' antics. There was pride, too, when school bands marched by playing patriotic tunes, their uniforms spotless, their instruments polished to perfection. But when the NYFD float came by with our tattered American flag we came to attention, saluting or putting hands over hearts. The fire fighters who carried that flag carried it with pride, and yes, defiance.

I continue to have mixed feelings about 9/11: horror that such a tragedy could happen on US soil, admiration for the strength and bravery New Yorkers showed, and pride in the American people for stepping forward to help. I am proud to have had a small part in the healing process after the worst day in America's history.

### THIS WEEK IS THE 25TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE NETTLE FESTIVAL TRAGEDY...LEST WE FORGET...

The ill-fated Nettle Festival was conceived as the kick-off to Rev. Ralph Fisher's tent revival for the Little Church of the Ravine. THE END IS NEAR, his readerboard sign announced months ahead of the scheduled event, THE SOUTH END REVIVAL IS COMING! The congregation might have known what was slouching toward us, but the rest of us down here were bemused or amused, depending on our degree of what the good reverend referred to as 'heathenism'. The South End was in mighty need of missionary work itself, he was fond of preaching, but their puny tithing went instead to saving the natives of New Guinea and east Africa. I figure they were easier to convert than us locals who were fairly content to wallow in our puddles of iniquity.

The Nettle Festival itself wasn't such a bad idea. In fact, the Tyee Store tried to revive it a few intervening years after what was referred to as 'the tragedy'. But even today there are members of the congregation who break into sobs over their coffees when mention is made. And this is 35 years after 'the tragedy'. I speak of it now in hushed tones and never around Mildred's family who still live down the road. Some events in this mean old world aren't meant for sarcasm or ridicule, although you would have to admit, even the pious among you, that Rev. Ralph overdid it with the Nettle Maze, his Labyrinth of Itching Hell.

Stigmata wipe-off tattoos are one thing, but the Nettle Maze crossed the line. By the weekend of the Revival, the Little Church had erected a tent worthy of Ringling Brothers. Churches from as far away as Sedro-Wooley and Darrington had come in converted school buses and rickety vans, hauling the Believers and their children from far and wide for a day of righteous fun and old time religion. Pastor Philip of Pentecostal fame arrived the night before from his circuit riding, prayed with Rev. Ralph and his long-suffering wife Mildred and slept the peaceful sleep of the Godly before that morning's first sermon of fire and brimstone-laden admonitions blistered the varnish off the old pulpit.

By afternoon the sun came out like a prophecy and the festival cranked up its volume. Chainsaw carvers sent cedar chips flying and the face of Jesus appeared in chiseled log sculpture. Stigmata wash-off tattoos made the teenager giggle, 666's on foreheads being by far the favorite of the boys. Glossalalia crossword puzzles didn't work out so well, but the Biblical action figures of Moses in combat with John the Baptist and Jesus himself down by the firepit were a huge hit with the younger kids.

And of course there was the Nettle Maze. The Labyrinth of Itching Hell itself! Half an acre of loops and turns and dead ends so intricate not even Jimmy Randall, the church caretaker who'd carved the trails over the past three weeks, starting when the plants were three feet tall and he could see over them, could navigate safely. Now, of course, they were higher than the tallest man's head and impossible to survey beyond the impenetrable wall of stinging stalks that held each entrant locked into the maze. Dozens were wandering hopelessly lost in there when a foul wind came up like the cold breath of Beelzebub himself, the one Pastor Philip of the Pentecost had predicted only half an hour earlier in fiery prose. Hell had come to the South End or surely would arrive soon, the unsuspecting crowd had been informed and sure enough, a mighty howl rose from the ravine like the thousand laments of the Lost. The sun blotted out behind dark and treacherous clouds and that cold wind became a tempest and the circus tent became a

But those inside the Maze had nowhere to turn. Children and adults alike wheeled and fled, down paths that went nowhere, flayed by the wind-whipped stalks of stinging death. Well, not death, literally, but who knows what went through those terrified minds besotted with brimstone stories? Their screams reached the field beyond, but what could we outsiders do except listen in horror. 




### MISSISSIPPI POT ROAST TACOS

Crispy tacos filled with tender, slow cooked roast beef, pepperoncini peppers, and melted cheese served with a crazy good au jus for dipping, Enjoy!



INGREDIENTS: 1 (3-4) lb. chuck roast; 1 packet Au jus gravy mix; 1 packet Ranch dressing mix; 1/2 c. unsalted butter sliced into pats; 1/2 jar sliced pepperoncini peppers with juice; 1 bag corn tortillas; 1 lb. shredded low-moisture mozzarella cheese; Chopped cilantro for garnish; Whole pepperoncini peppers for serving, optional

DIRECTIONS: Place the roast into the bottom of a 5 to 6-quart slow cooker. Sprinkle with Ranch dressing mix and Au Jus mix. Top with 1 stick of butter, cut into pats, and half a jar of pepperoncini peppers with juice. Cook on LOW for 6 to 8 hours or on HIGH for 4 hours. Remove the meat and shred with two forks. Place the meat back into the slow cooker. Heat a large frying pan over medium heat. Dip both sides of a corn tortilla in the broth from the slow cooker and place in the fry pan. (The juice on the tortillas is basically your "oil" so no need to add anything else to the pan.). Add some shredded beef on half of the tortilla, add some shredded mozzarella cheese on the other half. Using a spatula, fold the tortilla in half to make a taco. Cook on both sides until golden brown and crispy. Repeat with the remaining tortillas. Serve the tacos with au jus and enjoy!
