



MAKE A LIDDED JAR OIL LAMP



SUPPLIES: Mason jar; Mason jar lid; 100% cotton cord or lamp wick; Olive oil or cooking oil; Hammer; Screwdriver or nail; Pliers (optional; Two blocks of wood; Tape (optional); Metal washer or nut

DIRECTIONS: 1. Place the mason jar lid upside down between two blocks of wood. If your lid comes apart, set the ring part aside and use the disk part for now. The two blocks of wood should be about 1 inch (2.54 centimeters) apart. The gap should be right in the middle of the lid. 2. Punch a hole into the jar lid. Position your nail or screwdriver right over the middle of the middle. Use your hammer to force the nail or screwdriver into the lid. Once you have poked the hole, set the hammer aside, and wiggle the nail or screwdriver out. 3. Widen the hole, if necessary. The hole needs to be wide enough so that you can slide your cord or wick through. It needs to be tight enough so that it can support the cord or wick and hold it up over the jar. If your hole needs to be widened, you can use a pair of pliers to peel the edges of the hole towards you. 4. Slip your wick through the hole. The tip of the wick should be now sticking up through the top of the lid. If you want, you can wrap the tip with some tape first; this will prevent the wick from unraveling as you work it through the hole. You can also use a 100% cotton cord. 5. Consider slipping a metal nut over the wick. This will hide the hole in the jar, and make your lamp look neater. The tip of the wick should be sticking no more than 1 inch (2.54 centimeters) above the top of the nut. Make sure that the inside diameter of the nut is the same as your wick. If you used tape, be sure to snip the taped part off once you have the wick through the nut and hole. 6. Fill the jar one-fourth to one-third of the way full with olive oil. You can also use other types of oil as well, such as citronella or lamp oil. Olive oil, however, is the safest because it does not contain any harmful chemicals. 7. Place the lid back onto the jar and wait 10 to 15 minutes. This will allow the cord or wick to soak up enough oil so that you can light it. TIP: Consider customizing your lantern before you add the oil in. Add a few drops of essential oil; or add sprigs of a woody herb like rosemary, thyme, or lavender; add citrus slices; For a nautical or beach-themed lamp, you can fill your jar with seashells and sea glass. For a festive lamp, try adding some cedar cuttings, holly berries, and small pine cones. For a more fragrant festive lamp, add in some pine sprigs and cinnamon sticks. - Source: wikihow

DIA DE LOS MUERTOS



Translated to English, Dia de Los Muertos is "The Day of the Dead". In actuality, Dio De Los Muertos is not one, but two days spent in honor of the dead. The first day celebrates infants and children who have died. This is a group that is believed to have a special place in heaven, and are referred to as "Angelitos" or little angels. The second day is in honor of adults who have passed away. While the culture in the U.S. shys away from discussions of death, Mexicans embrace death. They use Dio De Los Muertos as an opportunity to celebrate the death and the life of loved ones and friends they knew in this world. And it is a day of celebration, not a day of mourning. While not alone in the world in celebrating death, it is certainly uncommon and could make someone from the U.S. very uncomfortable. Note: Chinese also similarly celebrate their dead. Dio De Los Muertos was celebrated in late July and early August by Aztec Indians for thousands of years. When the Spaniards conquered Mexico in the 1500s, they looked upon this celebration as a pagan ritual. To eliminate it, they moved it to the date of All Saints and All Souls Day in November. The effort failed, and the Aztecs along with all Mexicans continue to celebrate the holiday.

CAMANO FIRE BUDGETS STRATEGICALLY TO OFFSET RISING COSTS

In 2007, a fire engine cost almost \$400,000. Today, fire departments pay upwards of \$1,000,000 for a fire engine. From order to delivery, it can take two years or longer to get the new engine. From apparatus replacement to fire station maintenance to fuel for fire engines, Camano Fire isn't immune to the challenge of rising costs. The department budgets carefully to make taxpayer dollars stretch as far as possible. Camano Fire's oldest engine is 25 years old – but typically, our engines serve in a front-line capacity for 10 to 15 years. Each year we put an average of 19,000 miles on each engine - and after 10 years, that engine can have upwards of 200,000 miles on it. After 10 or 15 years, we put our engines in reserve. This means they can fill in when an engine is out for maintenance and can support regional wildfires. Our high school cadet class also uses our reserve engine for training during the school year. Keeping our engines on the front line longer also helps us save up and pay cash for a new apparatus rather than taking out a loan or asking taxpayers for more money in the form of a bond. We're currently looking into the viability of refurbishing an engine rather than purchasing one brand new - like what we've done in the past. Twice in the past four years, Camano Fire has completed what's called an ambulance remount. Rather than buying a whole new apparatus, the department buys the chassis (the cab, engine, and body framework) and re-mounts the existing ambulance box on it. "We put the mileage on the engine and the chassis – that's what wears out. The actual ambulance box lasts much longer," Chief Yengoyan said. "Each remount saves us upwards of \$150,000." The equipment inside our ambulances and engines isn't cheap either. We have five \$60,000 LifePacks – one on each in-service ambulance and one on the engine. The LifePack is a key piece of equipment our paramedics use to analyze heart rhythms, deliver resuscitation shocks and collect cardiac information on patients. Gas isn't free, either - did you know we spend upwards of \$90,000 each year on gas? "Last year we spent more than \$91,000 in fuel, a 27.5% increase from what we spent 10 years ago," Yengoyan said. "Like many other expenses, our fuel costs increase due to inflation as well as increased call volume." Camano Fire keeps 15% of its annual operating costs in reserve and puts aside approximately \$250,000 per year to pay for big-ticket expenses like ordering new apparatus or replacing lifesaving equipment. Saving money throughout the year means Camano Fire rarely goes out for bonds and regularly receives clean Accountability, Financial Statement, and Federal Grant Compliance Audits from the Washington State Auditor's Office.



BUTTERNUT SQUASH RAVIOLI WITH BROWN BUTTER SAUCE

Fresh butternut squash ravioli tossed in a brown butter sauce with crispy sage, garlic, and lots of Parmigiano-Reggiano cheese, Enjoy!



INGREDIENTS: 1 (10 oz.) pkg. butternut squash ravioli, fresh or frozen; 1/4 c. chopped pecan; 4 T. salted butter; 10 fresh sage leaves; 2 cloves garlic, peeled and slightly smashed; Freshly ground black pepper to taste; 1/4 c. fresh grated Parmigiano-Reggiano cheese for serving

DIRECTIONS: 1. Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil. 2. Meanwhile, in a large dry skillet over medium heat toast the pecans shaking the pan frequently. Remove the pecans to a plate and wipe the pan clean. 3. In the same skillet, melt the butter and add sage and garlic. As it begins to foam, keep stirring and swirling the pan. At this point add the ravioli to the salted boiling water and cook according to the package directions, about 4 minutes, 4. After a few minutes the butter will turn from a lemon-yellow color to a light brown. A few minutes more and you'll begin to see tiny dark specks starting to form on the surface of the pan, these are milk solids. Once you see the butter turning a deeper brown color, it will release a nutty aroma. This is when the butter is properly browned. (If at any point the nutty aroma smells like burning, or the milk solids begin to turn black, immediately remove from the heat.). 5. Turn the heat off. Remove the sage to a plate and discard the garlic. Carefully add 2 ounces of pasta water to the browned butter. Using a slotted spoon transfer the cooked ravioli from the pot of water straight into the butter sauce. Gently toss to coat the ravioli with the sauce. 6. Serve pasta garnished with crispy sage leaves, toasted pecans, freshly ground black pepper to taste, and grated Parmigiano-Reggiano cheese!

A SURVIVAL GUIDE FOR COPING WITH AIRLINE TRAVEL

When Orville Wright first took flight over the beaches of Kitty Hawk, NC in 1903, he couldn't have imagined that a century later, millions of people the world over would be getting into shouting matches with ticket agents, security screeners and baggage handlers over the nearly universal frustration caused by his invention. Thanks for the 12-inch gash in the side of my brand new suitcase, Orville.

The first rule of air travel is simple: Don't fly if you can possibly avoid it. But sometimes air travel is unavoidable. If you simply must book a flight, here are a few helpful tips to reduce your stress level. These just might help you resist your urge to strangle the Delta Airlines ticket agent in Concourse C.

Packing: If you absolutely must fly I recommend packing light, so that you can fit everything into a carry-on and avoid the delay of waiting for your luggage at baggage claim on your arrival. It may force you to make some difficult decisions – like which to leave home: your sun lamp or your snow cone machine. Hard choices, I know.

If packing for a longer trip, a carry-on might not always be an option. You may need a larger suitcase. By FAA guidelines, your luggage can only be one of five colors: black, grey, blackish grey, greyish black or navy blue. It's easy to mistake your bag for someone else's, so make sure it stands out by attaching a brightly colored neon orange strap securely to the handle. Once the luggage comes down the carousel, your bag will easy to spot. Yours will be the one missing the brightly colored neon orange strap – as well as its handle.

Boarding: For many of us, the most exhausting part of air travel is waiting in all those long lines. When going through TSA Security, you will usually have several lines to choose from. It's important to know which is the slowest. Here's a simple rule of thumb: The slowest line will be whichever one you decided to get in.

Your line will inevitably be the one stalled by the traveler who barely speaks English embroiled in a twenty-minute heated debate with the TSA agent (who also barely speaks English) arguing that the army surplus bowie knife he tried to sneak through is a gift for his seven-year-old niece. Just accept your fate and just pick a random line. Then start taking off your shoes, socks, belt, overcoat, shirt, slacks, and underwear for the TSA screener. But leave your glasses on – unless they're your night vision goggles.

As you board the plane, it's important to be patient. The time it takes to reach your seat will vary between ten minutes and a week-and-ahalf.
