FAVORITE OATMEAL RAISIN COOKIES



Ingredients: 1 3/4 c. all-purpose flour; 2 tsp. cornstarch; 1 tsp. baking soda; 3/4 tsp. salt; 1 tsp. ground cinnamon; 1 c. unsalted butter room temperature; 1 c. light brown sugar firmly packed; 1/2 c. granulated sugar; 2 lg. eggs; 1 1/2 tsp. vanilla extract; 3 c. old-fashioned rolled oats; 1 1/2 c. sun-dried raisins covered in hot water for 5 minutes and drained

Instructions: In a medium bowl, whisk together the flour, cornstarch, baking soda and salt; set aside. In a large bowl, using an electric hand mixer, beat the butter for 30 seconds. Add sugars and beat until light and fluffy, scraping down the sides as needed. Add the eggs one at a time and vanilla, beating until combined. Gradually add the flour mixture to the butter mixture beating until combined, scraping down the sides as needed. Stir in the oats with a wooden spoon. Stir in raisins that have been soaked in hot water for 5 minutes and drained thoroughly. Cover the dough and place in the refrigerator to chill for at least 30 minutes. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees. Line baking sheets with parchment paper. Drop the cookie dough by rounded tablespoon-sized balls onto the prepared baking sheets. (Rolling the cookie dough between your palms to make a smooth ball, will give you more uniform cookies.) Bake for 8-10 minutes (edges should be lightly browned, centers may be underbaked but shouldn't be raw, they will continue to bake as they cool). Allow cookies to cool completely on the baking sheets before serving. Store leftover cookies in an airtight container for up to 5 days. Notes: If you prefer larger cookies, simple drop by rounded 2 tablespoon-sized balls in step 7 and space about 2-inches apart. Bake for 10-12 minutes. This will yield 24 cookies. 

When Ron Koslowski arrived on the island and hung his shingle out on the highway --- KOSLOWSKI ATTORNEY AT LAW --- he honestly wasn't sure how long he'd last here in the boonies. Having plenty of competition from the Stanwoodopolis law offices, a new lawyer might have a tough time making inroads. "Nobody likes an attorney", he would tell us layabouts down at the Pilot House Lounge, "until they need one." True words, Ron, true words.... When Melissa, Ron's long suffering wife, finally had had enough, she hired her own attorney and sued for divorce. Ron, of course, made the mistake of representing himself. Suffice it to say she took him to the cleaners, gained possession of the house and the newer car, which left him pretty much paupered. To salve his loss, he drank away his sorrows one last night at the Lounge, after which he was pulled over by an Island County deputy. At least he got lodging that night. All of us at the Pilot House figure he moved on to fresh clients after he stopped showing up, probably plenty of bars up north looking for free glassware. You can still see a few of Ron's embossed beer glasses at the Pilot House. What you won't see is Ron. Somewhere maybe he's found a new watering hole and a fresh list of potential clients.



MORE LOCAL CRABBING TIPS



1. A lot of folks catch crab wading through eelgrass with a water depth of just a couple of feet (crabs love eelgrass), following them as the tide goes out. No traps needed, just a five gallon bucket and a tolerance for cold water. I first learned to do it that way as a kid when we'd stay at Birch Bay sixty years ago. And it works on Camano as well. (submitted by Scott Chase on nextdoor.com). 2. You need a shellfishing license and you will want to maintain a count that you turn in to the DFW [they give you a little slip to track your takes - you can enter the data online at the end of the season. FWIW after counts they usually open a winter season in 8-2] also get a caliper there, it's a plastic sizing thingy, it'll also have a little graphic on the male/female distinction one you see one of each, it's VERY clear. (submitted by J&R Winger on nextdoor.com). 3. Also, there is good crabbing from the pier at Kayak Point County Park. There is a fee for day use. If you're using pots you'll need to let them sit an hour or more before pulling. That's fine from a boat but not so fun from a dock so I recommend you get a couple crab RINGS instead. You tie the bait in the middle and it lays flat on the bottom allowing the crabs direct and more immediate access. You pull the rings about every 10-15 minutes and presto! There's already crabs there. When you pull the rings up, the bottom drops and forms a basket to keep the crabs in, but don't pause while pulling as they'll scamper out. Rings work great off a small boat or kayak too as you have something to do constantly. (Once you pull one ring and process it, it's time to pull the next, then back to the other, etc.) I love "Ringing" with kids 'cause theres almost always something in there, even if you have to throw it back. Kids don't care! (submitted by Ivan Cross on nextdoor.com). 4. Google "Castable Crab Trap" and you'll see devices you cast with a stout fishing rod or throw from shore with bait. They have snares all over to trap the crab. All you do is slowly pull it in. Kids love this! Pick an area with a fairly smooth bottom - not big chunky rocks. LONELINESS VS. BEING ALONE

by Robin Bush, ISR Communications. Do you know the difference between being lonely or being alone? Being alone means you aren't in the presence of another person. It is physical solitude that often boosts creativity, reduces stress, and promotes relaxation. Being lonely is a negative state of mind when your social relationships (in quantity or quality) are not as you desire and do not fulfill your needs for social contact. Loneliness is emotional isolation. You can be alone but not lonely, or you can be lonely even when surrounded by other people. Humans are, by nature, social beings that need social interaction and proximity to others for optimal health and well-being. Isolation today is a public health crisis in the United States as damaging as smoking 15 cigarettes each day (per the U.S. Surgeon General). Loneliness can even be a predictor of premature death. We can prevent this and support our emotional well-being by actively investing time in sustaining relationships with loved ones, expressing gratitude, and engaging in social activities. Sometimes, we revel in the peace of solitude, but when we are alone and want to connect, we are spared the challenges of yesteryear when connecting involved long walks through the wilderness to visit a neighbor living in a cabin sometimes miles away. Today, we are just a phone call, video chat, class, or date for tea away from connecting with others. There are different levels of connection, and we experience social interaction in a variety of ways - first is the sound of someone's voice, and a phone call fulfills that, but even more critical are facial cues and body language that you can see in a video chat or, best yet, by meeting in person. Not feeling particularly social nor ready for long conversations? There are other options. Try exercising together. You can join our south-end and north-end Let's Move Together classes, walk with Senior Striders each week, or get outside with our Langley Walking Group. There are S.A.I.L. (Stay Active and Independent for Life) classes weekly in-person and on Zoom that help with cardio, balance, and endurance. Many find exercising together forms a camaraderie that comes from the shared purpose of reaching new goals. Is sharing a meal with others more your cup of tea? Join us for a meal in Bayview, Coupeville, Oak Harbor, or Camano, and stay after lunch in Coupeville for one of our Lunch and Learn presentations. Are you looking for laughter and a bit of friendly competition? Come to ISR's Games Afternoons in Bayview every Wednesday. Volunteers at Senior Thrift or our meal sites also find working together forms sustaining connections. You can find all the details on these events and activities on our website, www.senior-resources.org. Or you may be seeking to transform loneliness into positive solitude. Try connecting with nature (time in nature is even written as a prescription by many medical professionals). Pick a few things you love and do them – every day or week, like reading an engaging novel or digging in the garden. Work on cultivating a positive mindset by disconnecting from social media and re-connecting with yourself. Embrace silence (when you intentionally turn off all distractions) for 30 minutes daily. Just make a comfortable, quiet place where you can sit and be peaceful, turn your thoughts inward, and steer away from the "to-do's" and challenges of daily life. Enjoy mental and physical silence. This state brings calmness and allows your body and mind to recharge. Whether it is social engagement or fulfilling solitude you seek, you can leave loneliness behind and live a healthier, more fulfilling life. Don't put it off; living a happier and more fulfilling life depends on it.


