



FROSTED MASON JAR LUMINARIES WITH FAUX "SNOW"

Equipment: Scissors; Hot glue gun and glue sticks; Flameless candles; Paintbrush(es); Spoon

Materials: 2 Mason jar(s); Mod Podge Satin; Epsom salt; Fir branches collected and trimmed to size; Small wood slices; Twine

Instructions: Add epsom salt to a large plate used only for crafts. Apply Mod Podge in a medium layer to the entire jar. Work quickly, as Mod Podge dries quickly. Lay the mason jar into the epsom salt. Roll the entire jar around in the salt. Push down slightly. Pick up the jar and use a spoon to add salt to any areas that were missed. Let dry completely. Cut a length of twine to wrap around the lip of the jar. Wrap around several times, tying half way through. Finish wrapping and tie into a bow. Use the hot glue gun to apply the fir branches and wood slices to the front of the jars on top of the bow. Finish by adding the LED tea lights to the jars.







INGREDIENTS: 2 spaghetti squash; 2 T. extra virgin olive oil, plus more for brushing the squash; 1 sm. yellow onion, diced; 3 carrots, peeled and diced (about 3/4 cup); 1 lb. lean ground beef, chicken, or turkey; 3 cloves garlic, minced; 1 T. Italian seasoning; 1 (15 oz.) jar marinara sauce (I use Raos tomato basil sauce); Sea salt to taste; Fresh ground black pepper to taste; Freshly grated parmesan cheese to taste; Basil ribbons for garnish

DIRECTIONS: 1. Assemble and prep all ingredients before you begin. 2. Preheat the oven to 400 degrees. Line a rimmed baking sheet with parchment paper and set aside. 3. Wash and pat dry the outside of the spaghetti squash. Slice it in half and scoop out the seeds. Place on the prepared baking sheet. (You may have to cut off the stem end to make it stand up properly.) 4. Brush the top and inside of the spaghetti squash with olive oil. Season with salt and pepper. 5. Bake the squash for 40-45 minutes, until soft and tender, 6. Meanwhile, prepare the meat sauce. Heat 2 tablespoons olive oil in a Dutch oven over medium heat. Add diced onions and carrots, cook for 6-7 minutes stirring occasionally until tender. 7. Add the minced garlic, meat of choice, Italian seasoning, and a pinch of salt and pepper to taste. Cook, stirring occasionally until the meat is cooked through and no longer pink. Stir in marinara sauce, cover with a lid, and reduce the heat to low. Simmer for 15 minutes, 8, Remove the squash from the oven once done and allow to cool for about 3-5 minutes. Use a fork to gently scrape the insides of each squash to release the stands. 9. Top the spagnetti squash bowls with meat sauce. Sprinkle with desired amount of parmesan cheese and garnish with fresh basil. Enjoy!

Anchor: You mean sunglasses?

Man on the Street: I have no idea what you're talking about. What's a sunglass? Will it protect me from the aliens?

Anchor: The sudden appearance of this bright yellow orb has left many Seattleites scrambling for cover, unsure of what to do in response to the unprecedented surge of cosmic radiation. For more on what the risks are – and what we can do to protect ourselves, I turn to University of Washington astrophysicist, Nigel Van Twerp.

Dr. Van Twerp, can you shed some light on what exactly are we dealing with here? What are our chances of survival in the face of this overwhelmingly luminous threat? And is that giant yellow orb an alien spaceship?

Anchor: Sunburn? That sounds terrifying. The sun is so huge! Is it likely to swallow up the earth?

Dr. Van Twerp: Sadly, the earth – and everyone on it – is inevitably doomed to perish. According to my calculations, all life on earth will die a painful death as our planet is ultimately absorbed after the sun becomes a red giant and expands beyond our current orbital circumference.

Anchor: So how much time do we have left, Doctor Van Twerp?

Dr. Van Twerp: [Looks at his watch.] Hard to say really. I'd estimate around 7.5 billion years, give or take. In the near term, I'd be more worried about sunburn.

Anchor: Sound advice as always, Dr. Van Twerp. We at Action News want to advise all our viewers to avoid looking directly at the sun or even being exposed to it. Make sure your family takes cover immediately. Do not go outdoors unless you absolutely must – say, to rescue a pet who has escaped outside and is staring upwards.
