Supplies Needed: 8 jumbo craft sticks; Yellow and black paint; Silver paint; Paintbrush; Paper plate; Red craft jewels; Scissors; Tacky glue; Photo of child $(4'' \times 6'')$; License plate.

Let the school bus photo frame dry completely. 6. Add picture. Once your DIY back-to-school photo frame is finished drying trim down your photo to fit within the opening of the frame. Add glue around the back of the frame opening and glue your picture down. 7. Glue on couple of magnets. Finish your DIY back-toschool photo frame by adding a couple adhesive magnets on the back of the frame. Now hang your cute school bus photo frame up on the fridge to cherish those first day of school memories.

LAKE GOODWIN ARTIST, JULIET SHEN



My main source of inspiration and renewal has always been the natural landscape. The constant transformations taking place in Nature intrigue me because I think our spiritual and creative life is in similar flux, and that observing the natural way of things can give us moral guidance for living as well as comfort in aging. Though there is a connection between how my brush makes strokes that move and grow and how tree limbs move and grow, my paintings are not about trees. They are about tenacity and perseverance, and about how we are all intertwined. There are two major influences on my technique. Training in designing typefaces has heightened my awareness of how the edges and spaces between things define what we see. And my admiration for Chinese brush painting has shown me how you can create opulence from the humblest of tools. Anyone who grows up in a diaspora will feel a dichotomy of the soul. For me, painting brings the East and West in me into some kind of fresh synthesis. Juliet Shen started painting in childhood and spent the 1970s making art and working for design firms in New York. After moving to Seattle in 1983, she had a long career as a graphic designer, running her own firm from 1989–2012 and teaching typography at the School for Visual Concepts. In 2006 she earned a masters degree in typeface design from the University of Reading, UK. Since 2012 she has been painting full time, exhibiting in group shows and solo shows around Puget Sound. After a 35-year career in graphic design, she resumed drawing and painting, her original passion. Juliet has experimented with compositions that pay homage to the Chinese landscape tradition, but with a contemporary approach. She paints forests, wetlands, wild rivers, and tidal currents in a semi-abstract style that relies on fine brushwork. Her work is always infused with a sense of place, recognizable or fantastical.

MORE LOCAL CRABBING TIPS



There are many kinds of crab traps which are also referred to as crab pots, the two most popular in the Puget Sound Region are Ring Traps and Square Box Style Traps. We are going to focus here on the Square Style because they are very productive and much easier to deal with from a kayak or small boat than ring traps. Square Traps (also known as fold up traps or Danielson Traps) are set at the bottom of the ocean, they have two to four small hinged openings that crabs enter to feed on the bait, but they become trapped and can't be released unless they manage to wiggle through the bars, get lucky or if they are purposefully released. They have several safety features built in to ensure safety such as biodegradable release mechanisms which will render the trap useless if it is abandon or for some other reason accidentally left in the ocean. Do not buy an expensive trap for now. Look for the basic traps which can be found for as little as \$15 on sale. Later on you can buy the more expensive traps when you're a pro and you know you won't be losing them in the ocean. One of the main advantages of expensive traps is their heavy weight which can reduce the chances of them drifting, but you can always add weight to a cheap trap if this is a concern. Next you will need a bait box. This is usually a smaller cage that is attached within the larger box cage and usually secured with a clamp, but even a small piece of string will do. Its important to mount the bait box where crabs can't reach the bait from outside the cage. They will need to figure out how to get inside if they want a free meal. Next you will need about 100' of weighted rope (or less depending on your style). You don't actually have to buy the more expensive weighted line, you can buy cheaper nylon line but regulations say that it has to sink somehow so if you buy the cheaper rope then you will also need to buy or make a line weight. Floating on the top of the water you will need to tie the line to a red and white buoy marked with your name and address. This will help to keep track of your traps and tell them apart from others AND it will hopefully help get it returned if you lose it. You will see people with double stacked buoy with all sorts of flags and masts attached. This goes beyond regulation and is generally to help them identify their traps.

HOSTESS CUPCAKE COOKIES

The perfect back-to-school treat! Soft, cake-like chocolate cookies topped with marshmallow frosting, a blanket of chocolate ganache, and those iconic vanilla swirls, enjoy!



COOKIES: 1 (15.25 oz.) box Devil's Food cake mix; 2 T. all-purpose flour; 1 T. cocoa powder; 2 Ig. eggs; 1/2 c. vegetable oil FROSTING: 1/2 c. unsalted butter, room temperature; 2 1/4 c. confectioners' sugar; 1 tsp. vanilla extract; 1/4 tsp. salt; 1 (7 oz.) jar marshmallow creme

GANAUCHE: 1 c. semi-sweet chocolate chips; 6 T. heavy cream

DIRECTIONS: Preheat the oven to 350 degrees and line two cookie sheets with parchment paper; set aside. COOKIES: In a large bowl, using an electric hand mixer, beat the Devil's Food cake mix, flour, cocoa powder, eggs, and vegetable oil until a soft dough forms. Lightly spray a tablespoon scoop with non-stick spray. Scoop a heaping tablespoonful of dough and roll into a ball, place on the prepared baking sheet. Using the palm of your hand, gently press into a 3-inch circle, repeat with the remaining dough, spacing the cookies about 2-inches apart. Bake the cookies for 8-9 minutes, or until the edges are set. Allow them to cool on the baking sheet for 5 minutes before transferring to a wire rack to cool completely. FROSTING: In a large bowl, beat the butter until creamy. Add the confectioners' sugar, vanilla extract, and salt, then beat until combined. Add marshmallow crème, beat until smooth. Microwave for 45 seconds, then let it rest for 1 minute before whisking until smooth. Let the ganache cool for 5 minutes before using. Spoon the cooled chocolate ganache over the chilled cookies. Allow the ganache to set before proceeding. Pipe the reserved marshmallow frosting in a squiggle pattern across the top of each cookie. Let set then enjoy! Yields 16 cookies
