Driving in winter weather conditions can cause problems for even the most experienced driver. Here's how you can be better prepared.

PREPARE YOUR VEHICLE



Fill up on fuel



Check tire pressure & tread



Replace worn wiper blades



Check the battery & transmission



Use snow chains or tires when needed

MAKE A SAFETY KIT

- · First Aid Kit
- · Ice Scraper & Brush
- Jumper Cables
- · Portable Shovel
- Flashlight
- Batteries
- · Phone Charger
- Water
- Snacks
- Blankets
- · Warm Clothes -Boots
- · Sand or Kitty Litter
- Multi-tool
- Reflective Triangles or Vest



Did you know?

In winter traffic, a safe following distance is 8-10 seconds.

KNOW YOUR BRAKES IF YOU HIT ICE

Standard Brakes:

steer into the skid and pump your brakes slowly

Anti-Lock Brakes (ABS):

steer into the skid and apply steady pressure, do not pump

PRACTICE SAFE DRIVING

PLAN AHEAD: watch the weather, give yourself time, and don't travel unless you have to SLOW DOWN: reduce your speed, don't tailgate other drivers, and brake earlier than usual always obey traffic signals and watch for other drivers sliding into your lane WATCH FOR ICE: ice can be hidden in plain sight on roadways, under snow, or in tire tracks





Our own junkpile, seldom downsized, would be a curse to our kids when we leave these mortal coils, goofy art, rotting kayaks, dead lawnmowers, useless tools --- a veritable EPA superfund site. Fortunately we don't have kids. I suspect we'll just endow the property, the houses, the 20 plus sheds and all our worldly possessions to jumpstart the South End Historical Society. No need to call the movers or the thrift stores. Just need volunteers to be docents once the visiting hours are established.

PENGUIN ROCKS

Painting rocks is a soothing activity and it's a good craft to do with kids of multiple ages. It is simple enough for small kids and you only need a few different colors of paint.



What You Need: Multi-Surface Satin Acrylic Paint: Black Tie. Steel Grey, Cotton Ball, Orange Sherbet; Paintbrushes – $\frac{1}{2}$ " flat paintbrush and angled fine tip paintbrush; Set of 3 rocks (largest rock to measure 3" long), all in differing shapes and sizes and all with a smooth surface

Wash and dry rocks completely before painting. If there are any rough spots, smooth with sandpaper. I rarely have to do this though. Allow the paint to fully dry between each step and anytime you switch paint colors. You may need to use a double or triple coat of paint to achieve desired coverage. Use a sealant for extra protection. How to Paint Rocks to Look Like Penguins. Be sure to start with washed, dry rocks. Using a flat paintbrush (1/2" is my favorite size), paint the front side of your rocks in either white or gray. This will be the color of the penguin's belly. You don't need to paint the backside of the rock yet, as that will be a different color. Using a fine-tip paintbrush, paint the outer shape of the penguin in dark black, as shown. Leave the belly white or gray. When the outline is dry, paint the back side of the rock black too. Allow to dry before flipping the rock back over to paint the face. Using a fine-tip paintbrush and orange paint, make a small upside-down triangle for the beak Paint two small oval shapes with orange paint to make the penguin's feet. Finally, dip the back end of your fine tip paintbrush in the black paint and dab it onto the rocks to make little round eyes. Ta-da! You now have a family of cute little penguin painted rocks! Allow paint to dry completely, then finish with sealant if desired.

MAKE SCENTED PINE CONES WITH ESSENTIAL OILS

What You'll Need: Cookie sheet; Aluminum foil; Gallon-size plastic zip-top bag; Spray bottle (optional); Pine cones (as many as you want in any size); Essential oils of your choosing

Instructions: Prep Your Pine Cones. Give the pine cones a good rinse in the sink. Don't use dish soap, as the scent can linger and interfere with the essential oils you're going to add later. Then, place the pine cones on a foil-lined cookie sheet. Bake them at a low heat (roughly 200 degrees Fahrenheit) for about an hour. Baking works to preserve the pine cones. Keep an eye on them throughout the entire baking process. (While burning isn't likely, turn off the oven immediately if you see the pine cones start to burn.) Finally, remove them from the oven, and wait for them to cool before proceeding to the next step. To scent your pine cones, choose any essential oils that you like. While many people prefer to use cinnamon because it's associated with the fall and winter months, other good options include citrus, vanilla, peppermint, and even pine essential oils. You can apply just one type of oil, or you can mix and match. For instance, cinnamon and vanilla blend together to form a pleasant, warming aroma. Place the pine cones in a gallon-size zip-top bag, and pour at least 10 drops of essential oil right inside. You can always add more drops if you feel the scent isn't strong enough. Seal and shake the bag to spread the essential oil on the pine cones, and then leave them in the bag for a week. Finally, remove them from the bag, and make sure they're dry before using them to decorate. You also can use a spray bottle for a quicker and more uniform application of the essential oil. Fill the bottle with a few ounces of water and about 10 drops of essential oil to start. (You always can add more.) Then, spray the pine cones, and place them inside the gallon-size zip-top bag. With this method, they only need to remain in the bag for about a day because they've taken a more direct hit of essential oil thanks to the spray bottle. Finally, remove the pine cones from the bag, and let them dry completely before placing around your home. Once the pine cones are out on display for a few weeks, they'll start to lose their fragrance. You can continue to add essential oil as needed to refresh the scent. You don't have to use the same scents that you previously used on the pine cones, as long as the previous scents aren't detectable to the point that they clash with the new scents.

Quears CAMANO ISLAND LIBRARY

Slnce 2025 marks the tenth anniversary of the Camano Island Llbrary at Terry's Corner, it's worth several brief articles to see how this all came about. It all began in 2007 when Sno-Isle Libraries funded a 3-year pilot project.

It was approved early that year by the Board of Trustees (BOT) after a series of public meetings and focus groups showed strong support for a library on Camano in the wake of a second defeat of a bond for a new Stanwood Library. This "bookstore model" was housed where the current IRG Physical Therapy is located and David Menard was the manager.

In 2009 the BOT approved a proposal from the Camano Island Library Friends, an organization founded in 2008, to extend the pilot project because the economic downturn of that year made it unlikely that a bond for a permanent library would pass in 2010. In return for extending the pilot project, the Friends committed to raising \$20,000 a year to offset the cost of renting this space.

WORRYING WORKS - TRUST ME, IT'S SCIENCE

You know, they say that worrying is like a rocking chair: it gives you something to do but gets you nowhere. My wife says that I worry too much, that I fret over every little thing that could go wrong, when the reality is, none of those things ever do. But she just doesn't get it. She doesn't understand that the act of worrying is actually a highly effective, scientifically backed method of preventing disaster. Sure, she says I'm "obsessive" or "paranoid" or "a nervous nelly," but I've done the math, and I'm convinced I'm right: worrying works!

I've started keeping track of some of the things I worry about – big things, small things, catastrophic things – and after careful analysis, I can confirm that more than 95% of these unpleasant scenarios never actually happen. And here's the key: the reason they never occur is because I worried about them. That's right, I'm the human equivalent of an emotional insurance policy. My worrying creates a protective bubble preventing the events I fear from materializing.

Let me explain how my Worrying Works theory is scientifically sound, by sharing a few examples.

A Cat Getting Loose: I know it's irrational, but every time I open the front door to leave the house, I'm concerned one of our three cats will see their fleeting window of opportunity and make a run for it. I worry about them getting hit by a car, getting devoured by a coyote, or just deciding to leave us for a family of more responsible pet owners. They never actually do make a run for it, preferring instead to park themselves inside whatever newest cardboard box just arrived from Amazon. I can only assume that my intense worrying about this scenario somehow convinces them not to attempt a jail break. Cats are perceptive like that.

Falling Down the Stairs: I'm no longer in my prime, so the issue of falling actually is serious problem for people my age. I'm not exaggerating when I say that every time I descend a staircase, I'm mentally preparing myself for the possibility that I will trip, tumble and fall headfirst into a coma – probably while carrying a helpless kitten or a priceless Ming vase (although I don't currently own a Ming vase). The prospect of this horrible accident haunts me so much that I tightly cling to the handrail like it's my lifeline. Clearly, obsessively worrying that I might fall has worked because I have never once fallen down the stairs. (I have accidentally tripped over our cat Zippy lounging on the landing a couple times, however.)
