COCONUT CURRY PUMPKIN SOUP

This creamy yet light soup is bursting with amazing flavors! Perfect as an appetizer or small meal. Serve with your favorite toppings and crusty French bread to soak up every delicious drop!



INGREDIENTS: SOUP: 1 T. olive oil; 1 T. butter; 1 sm. yellow onion chopped; 1 lg. clove garlic minced; 1 tsp. minced ginger; 1 1/2 tsp. curry powder; 1/2 tsp. kosher salt; 1/4 tsp. ground white pepper optional; 1 pinch cayenne pepper optional; 1 (15 oz.) can 100% pure pumpkin; 3 c. chicken or vegetable broth; 1 c. coconut milk

TOPPINGS: Croutons; Pepitas; Dried pumpkin seeds; Fresh chopped cilantro; Fresh chopped chives; Bacon Bits; Lime wedges; Sour cream

DIRECTIONS: 1. In a large pot, heat olive oil and butter over medium-high heat. Add onions; sauté until soft and translucent about 4-5 minutes. Add garlic, ginger, curry, salt, white pepper, and cayenne pepper if using; sauté about 1-2 minutes until fragrant. 2. Stir in pumpkin and chicken broth; bring to a boil. Reduce heat to low; cook, stirring occasionally for 15 minutes. Stir in coconut milk until melted and well combined. 3. Remove soup from heat. Using an immersion blender, puree soup in the pot until smooth OR transfer to a traditional blender and puree in batches until smooth and return to the pot. 4. Ladle warm soup into bowls and garnish with your choice of toppings.



VIEW FROM THE KITCHEN: WHY MOST CATS SUCK AT PICKLEBALL
