



UFO NORTHWEST: How Washington State Spawned the Men In Black

Friday, October 4, 2024 / 7:00 PM – 8:00 PM Camano Island Library

On August 1, 1947, the tragic crash of a B-25 bomber in Washington State triggered an FBI investigation of "The Maury Island Incident"—an infamous Northwest UFO sighting, and history's first alleged encounter with the so-called "Men in Black."

The FBI's records from 1947, which were sealed for decades, reveal Cold War fears, jurisdictional disputes, cover-ups, false confessions, a courageous FBI Special Agent, and the hands-on involvement of FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover.

Relying on the FBI records, this talk exposes a Washington story that shapes our current UFO narratives, from 1950's pulp magazines to the ubiquitous X-Files and Men in Black film franchises. Also examined: how the Northwest's unique position in UFO history is challenged by others that assert contradictory narratives.

Join us with guest speaker Steve Edmiston, a business and entertainment lawyer with Bracepoint Law. He was the screenwriter and co-producer of the film, "The Maury Island Incident". It chronicles the true story of Harold Dahl and his alleged 1947 sighting of a UFO over Puget Sound.

TISSUE PAPER APPLE OR PUMPKIN CRAFT



Materials: Red (for apple), orange (for pumpkin), green and brown tissue paper; Cardboard or construction paper; Glue

Draw an apple or pumpkin as a template onto the construction paper or cardboard. Cut the tissue paper into approximately one inch squares. The squares do not need to be exact and this is a great way for kids to practice cutting. I usually cut strips and then help my little ones snip off squares (or blobs really). Have your child crumple up the squares into small balls. This is a great task for working on fine motor skills picking up the tiny scraps and pinching them into balls. Next help them spread a thin layer of glue in a small area of the apple and begin placing the tissue paper balls in that area. Continue until the whole apple is covered. Depending on the age of your child, the apple will be more or less full. But it will be beautiful, perfect for fall and a great opportunity for your child to work on those important developmental skills along the way.





Stanwood Police Department is thrilled to announce the launch of its BlueBridge Program, an exciting initiative aimed at providing individuals in crisis with immediate support. "Our officers are boots to the ground, they are the ones who see the need and this program empowers them to provide on the spot help to people in our community," Mayor Roberts. Through the BlueBridge program, Stanwood officers will be given prepaid debit cards allowing them to make purchases while on patrol that can make a real and direct difference for individuals in distress. "This might look like buying a victim of domestic violence a hotel room for a night, giving a low-income student a pair of shoes, or providing someone living out of their car with a warm meal and a little gas," Police Chief Toner. 

FIRE SAFETY TIPS for families with a member with autism

- Stress same fire safety tips/facts as you would for any one. Kitchens, electrical, candles, heating, etc. And remember that having a working smoke/co detector is the most important part of any plan.
- Practice fire drills. Many people with autism respond well to routines. Teach them to keep low because they may not feel the heat and respond by naturally getting lower. There is a wide spectrum of autism so your plan should be customized for each individual.
- Wrap them in a blanket or heavy coat. This will give them a sense of security and keep their arms from flailing about.
- Pick a meeting place that is quiet and familiar. Going to your car in the driveway or a nearby neighbor's house is recommended. A meeting place in the street or on the sidewalk, will give the person with autism an opportunity to "BOLT" either back into the house or into traffic.
- Program emergency contact info under ICE (In Case of Emergency) on their cell phone/IPA/Tablet. There are smart phone apps that can hold all relevant medical/emergency information. Info you can also keep in a small wallet.
- Visit the local firehouse so the person with autism can become familiar with the sights and sounds that may accompany an emergency situation.
- There are stickers that can be placed in your car window or near your front door to alert emergency personnel there may be a person with autism present or involved. (Like those below that were found on-line).

GARDEN OF EDEN GREENHOUSE

This spring I built a greenhouse with about 14 old tempered glass door panels I had salvaged long long ago. Treated lumber framing and cedar siding, but mostly glass. Even had stained glass in the front door and two next to that plus another two in the back. Put a 55 gallon black barrel and concrete pavers to radiate heat at night.

The first spring day that hit 70 degrees, the greenhouse hit 90. What, I wondered, would happen when we hit 80 or more? I'm growing tomatoes and a few exotics in there, probably loved that 90 degree heat but I was betting they wouldn't like Saudi Arabia temperatures. So I cut two large windows in the back opposite the front door to let heat out both ends. This week we hit the mid 80's outside and the greenhouse hit 105.

Course, I panicked and bought sunblocking screens for the glass roof and got that attached. Next day we hit 89 outside and the hothouse was 107. Not exactly sure at what temperature green tomatoes roast on the vine, I ordered a solar powered exhaust fan. If that doesn't work, I'll order a second one.

Inside the greenhouse my tomatoes are 5 feet tall while the ones I planted outside from the same seed are spindly still, just beginning to realize summer is definitely here, but cold at night. The difference between the two is astounding. I recommend a small greenhouse to anyone who still pooh-poohs climate change, still thinks we ought to drive large SUV's and wants to drill baby drill for more oil and gas. Death Valley broke its all time heat record this week and cities from Las Vegas to Miami are burning hot while the summer's just begun.

I may or may not solve my greenhouse overheating problem. Bad planning on my part. There won't be any exhaust fans for Mother Earth when us tomatoes begin to fry on our vines. No sun blocking shrouds, no good fixes. Just bad gardeners, when all is said and done.


WHITE CHICKEN CHILI

CHILI: 1 T. olive oil; 1 lb. skinless, boneless chicken breast halves, cut into 1/2-inch cubes; 1 onion, chopped; 2 cloves garlic, chopped; 2 (15 oz.) cans great Northern beans, rinsed and drained; 2 c. chicken broth; 2 (4 oz.) cans chopped green chiles; 1 tsp. salt; 1 tsp. ground cumin; 1 tsp. dried oregano; 1/2 tsp. ground black pepper; 1/4 tsp. cayenne pepper; 1 c. sour cream; 1/2 c. heavy whipping cream OPTIONAL TOPPINGS: Sour cream, Corn chips, Cilantro, Jalapenos, Avocado, Scallions, Hot sauce

DIRECTIONS: 1. Heat olive oil in a large saucepan over medium heat. Add chicken, onion, and garlic; cook and stir until chicken is no longer pink in the center and juices run clear, 10 to 15 minutes. 2. Stir in beans, chicken broth, green chiles, salt, cumin, oregano, black pepper, and cayenne pepper; bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer until flavors have blended, about 30 minutes. 3. Remove chili from heat; stir in sour cream and whipping cream until incorporated. 4. Ladle into bowls and top with your favorite toppings. 5. NOTES: It's all about the toppings for me! Here I've topped the chili with more sour cream, corn chips, jalapenos, chopped cilantro and hot sauce. Let your imagination go wild!


