# <u>Words from your President – Terri Rose</u>

February is often recognized for Groundhog's Day, Valentine's Day, Black History Month and American Heart month. Did you know it's also National Embroidery Month? National Embroidery Month recognizes the talented stitchers using both hand and machine techniques to decorate material. The Village Quilters is fortunate to have a Stitch Art Embroidery Bee. If you have an interest in machine embroidery, this might be the Bee for you.

While February is a short month, we have lots of activities this month. For example, Andrew Lee is teaching the first ever two-part workshop. In addition, there are 12 Bees which meet at various times throughout the month. The website calendar provides a description of each Bee as well as the meeting details. Finally, there are many ways to contribute to Community Service or Quilts of Valor. Please consider taking either a kit, a quilt top, or a finished top needing binding from the Community Service table. Quilts of Valor meets the fourth Monday of each month. In the spirit of what is often called the Love month, I hope you spend your sewing time doing something you love!

## **Programs**

#### February 10: Lynn Sykes- My Quilting Journey

Lynn Sykes has been quilting for over 25 years. She began as a hand quilter, moved quickly into machine piecing and quilting. Her program will take you through her journey from beginner to her jobs in the quilting industry.

#### March 10: Tone Haugen-Cogburn - Discovering Transfer Paint for Fabric

Tone is well known in the quilting community. Her quilts have been exhibited in countries including Norway, Denmark, England, France and Japan as well as in national shows like AQS in Paducah, Knoxville and Nashville, and International Quilt Festival in Houston. After several years of finding new and interesting ways to apply color to fabric - transfer paint has become one of Tone's favorite surface design techniques. Many hours of trial and error, but mostly fun, has resulted in many quilts with botanical elements as a focal point. There is no limit to how many colors or leaf shapes can play together in her pieces. This will be a trunk show to inspire everyone to use color and shapes in a new way.

#### April 14: Cam Kilman – Creative Grids Trunk Show

Cam will be talking about and showing quilts that used many of the different Creative Grid rulers. She was the former 'Creative Grids Project Manager' for 10 years. Wearing many hats, her duties involved marketing, overseeing educational project videos, creating companion patterns, writing ruler instructions and creating storyboards. A wonderful "perk" of the job she loved was to network with top industry designers to create innovative ruler designs for Creative Grids. She will have a supply of a few rulers for sale at the end of the presentation. # February 9: Let's Go Out Walking with Lynn Sykes \$25 (9:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.)

The February class "Machine Quilting with a Walking Foot" is full. If you missed the walking foot class, let Dana Elliott or myself know. There may be an opportunity in August for a half day class. Remember you must have a walking foot attachment or a dual foot on your machine.

# March 8 and 9: Transfer – Paint on Fabric with Tone Haugen-Cogburn \$40 + \$30 Supply Cost (March 8 1:30 p.m. – 4:30 p.m., March 9 9:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.)

The March class is a wonderful opportunity to learn about transfer printing and to try fabric dying and transfer printing. Tone Haugen-Cogburn from Maryville will be

teaching this **day and half class**. Tone is well known in the quilting community. Her quilts have been exhibited in countries including Norway, Denmark, England, France and Japan as well as in national shows like AQS in Paducah, Knoxville and Nashville, and International Quilt Festival in Houston. You will be dyeing your fabric on **Wednesday afternoon**, (thank you again Wannabees for letting us use the afternoon) and then will do the transfer printing on **Thursday, all day.** So many quilters are dying their own fabric, to get unique colors, this will be a great chance to learn about dyes without having to go to the expense of buying all the supplies. Tone will walk you through each step. Make sure and sign up or let me know by Friday. If the class is not filled we may offer the members of the Art Guild a chance to take the class.

If you are taking the Transfer Printing class in March and would like to buy the weaver cloth fabric Tone mentions in the supply list, she will bring it to the class. # **Workshops**

#### February 16: Mystery Quilt with Andrew Lee – Part 1

Join Andrew Lee in this TWO-PART workshop. There will be Accuquilt machines there to cut your fabric for a beautiful quilt. This is your chance to have most of the cutting done for you and to see how an Accuquilt works. You will begin sewing the blocks.

#### February 23: Mystery Quilt with Andrew Lee – Part 2

This is where the mystery comes in! You will use the blocks you've sewn to create your quilt.

#### March 16: Intro to English Paper Piecing with Sandra Douglas

If you've never tried English Paper Piecing, this is your chance. **No sewing machine is used**. The supplies are minimal, which makes it the perfect take-along when you are away from your machine. There are many projects, from full quilts to small samplers or bags, that you can "graduate" to.

#### April 20 and April 27: Judy Niemeyer Paper Piecing with Pat Bilski

Learn the Judy Niemeyer method of paper piecing. In this two part workshop, you will cut out the fabric and paper- piece the very beautiful Seasonal Table Runner. The papers for piecing are included in the class.

#### **Bus Trip – NC Shop Hop and Quiltfest South Carolina**

Sign-ups for an overnight bus trip on April 19-20 will begin at the February meeting. We will be departing Loudon the morning of April 19<sup>th</sup> and returning the evening of April 20<sup>th</sup>. We will spend the day visiting three quilt shops in the Ashville area of North Carolina on Wednesday, arriving in Greenville, South Carolina Wednesday evening. Thursday, we will spend the day at the Mancuso Quiltfest, returning to Loudon in the evening. The cost of the trip is \$190, based on double occupancy (price could go down depending on how many people attend). Price includes bus trip, hotel and show admission. Single occupancy rooms are available for an additional \$83. A \$75 deposit is required to reserve your spot with full payment due at the March meeting. The Stitch Art Embroidery Bee is making receiving blankets for Project Linus. We are in need of 1 or 1.5 yard pieces of flannel that are appropriate for infants or small children, prints and solids. Pre-washed is appreciated. Please bring your donation to Cherie Oswald at the February meeting.

# **Material Girls**

Bring your white on white fabric for the fabric exchange. You will turn in twelve 3" width of fabric strips and receive an assortment of 12 white on white fabric strips. We selected 3" strips as many quilts use 2 7/8" of fabric to make half square triangles and you will have 2 1/2" of useable fabric for other quilts. You may bring twelve 3 inch strips of various fabrics or one fabric. If you are using one fabric, start

with 1 1/8 to 1 1/4 yards of Quilt Shop Quality Fabric. Straighten the edge before cutting your strips...fabric is never square coming off the bolt. Cut twelve - 3" width of fabric strips. Place strips in a baggie with your name on it and turn in to the Material Girls table in February or March. You will receive your assorted strips at the March meeting.
