The US Fish and Wildlife Service has recommended that the West Indian Manatee be down-listed from endangered to threatened status under the Endangered Species Act.

Officials with the agency, however, are quick to point out that the move does not impact protections for the Manatee that are currently in place.

It's estimated that there are at least thirteen-thousand Manatees worldwide, with more than half of that number living in Florida waters. That's in stark contrast to a 1991 estimate that placed the Manatee population in Florida at only 1,267.

The European Space Agency, with assistance from NASA, made history by successfully landing a small space probe onto the face of a comet.

The Philae (Fie-lie) Lander was attached to the Rosetta Mother Ship. Once Rosetta reached the comet, Philae (Fie-lie) was separated from it and sent down to the comet's surface.

The probe was designed to latch itself onto the comet. Unfortunately, it didn't, and as a result it bounced several times before coming to a rest in a shaded area of the comet.

Silent since its last call to the mother ship the Philae (Fie-lie) Lander is now facing conditions on the comet from which, scientists say, it is unlikely to recover.

Have you ever wondered what free-ranging Polar Bears do to occupy the time when they're out on the Arctic Ice?

To learn the answer scientists with the US Geological Survey developed a special radio collar equipped with a video camera. The camera beams back images to researchers via satellite. It was put on a Polar Bear living near the Beaufort Sea in Alaska.

The amazing video, the first ever from a wild Polar Bear, shows the animal interacting with another bear, playing with her food, and swimming under the sea ice.

The video will be used by scientists to better understand Polar Bear behavior.
