What is Habitat for Humanity



Habitat for Humanity is a Global Christian Non-profit Organization whose main goal is creating affordable and desirable housing for those in need.

They are working across all 50 states as well as 70 different countries across the globe with the goal of building "strength, stability, and self-reliance" in families in need.

How It's Done





The Texas branch of Habitat for Humanity is made up of 68 local affiliates and has served 1,296 families in 2020. Serving over 39 million since 1976.

They are partnered with a number of companies and organizations in order to achieve the goal of housing those in need. Choosing families based on their level of need, ability to repay a no-interest loan, and expectation that they will help others in need in the future.

Texas Lutheran Involvement



Texas Lutheran University students worked with the Guadalupe County Habitat for Humanity to build a total of 3 homes from start to finish in the past year for families in the community in need of a home.

Some students also volunteered at the ReStore that sells building supplies and reinvests the money earned towards building more houses.


Total Expense Breakdown



One organization commits to funding the cost of half of a Habitat home. Your organization has the opportunity to provide all or part of the volunteer labor needed to help build half of the home.

Sponsor-A-Day on the Community Build Home

One organization commits to funding a day on a home. This house is built in the fall. Rather than limiting it to one sponsor, we build this house with funds through partnerships with several different sponsors. Each sponsor has the opportunity to build on their scheduled day(s).




Why Habitat is Worth it




Conclusion

- Extent of affordable housing crisis would make the donation a pivotal step in addressing the problem for those in need






