THE PASTOR'S PAGE

In case you don't know this, I am a big proponent of the priesthood of all believers. We see it in the early Church. Protestants reclaimed the idea when they responded to a drift from what made the Church the Church, according to biblical teachings.

In one church I served, after preaching and teaching on the priesthood of all believers, we started expanding the ministry of the saints, the believers in the congregation. I probably preached on a passage like **Ephesians 4**. There, Paul writes about the various types of leaders that God raises up in the Church. Within the Church, leaders are not to accomplish all the work and ministry of the Church. Instead, leaders are called to unleash the ministry of all people. The work of leaders is to "to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ" (**Ephesians 4:12**).

All the saints do the work of ministry, and all the saints are responsible for building up the body of Christ, which is the Church. So, in that previous church, elders starting taking a larger role in Communion—sometimes on Sunday mornings and by taking Communion to shut-ins. One elder took offense at this. He was trying to protect me and my role as pastor. He wanted me to be special and to have functions that were unique to me. However, such thinking led to the abuses that created the Reformation—ordained leaders took over too much that belonged to the laity.

In a local congregation that takes seriously the priesthood of all believers, my role as pastor is not to do all the work of the church. I am to be a catalyst that helps people discover their spiritual gifts and to help them employ those gifts for the strengthening of the church. I do that work through prayer, preaching, and teaching. Sometimes that work is done publicly, sometimes that work is done in small groups like committees, and sometimes it is accomplished by helping an individual through one-on-one conversation.

I thought about this topic recently as I heard some pastors bemoan the fact that fewer and fewer people are having church weddings or are utilizing clergy as their officiants. We are living in an increasingly secularized society, and our government will grant people status to be a wedding officiant.

However, I have seen how this can work out for the good. One of the participants in the Saturday mornings Men's Bible Study was asked by a relative to officiate at his wedding. The couple had no desire for a church wedding or connection to a church or clergy person. The uncle was reluctant to take on this role. However, he consulted me. I encouraged him to do it, and I gave him a few tools to utilize. The wedding was beautiful. Even more than that, their officiant took his role seriously and made the couple go through premarital counseling.

Without the uncle's intervention, this couple may have had a secular wedding. They could have been married in the church, but the church and the pastor could have served as little more than a backdrop to the larger event. Some people use the venue without thinking

about what the place represents or how it is to impact them. In this case, the uncle was able to share the Gospel with the prospective couple prior to their wedding day. On their wedding day, he was able to share God's Word, pray over them, and bless them and all who gathered. The priesthood of all believers did its job.

Again, I know there are many who object to this notion. We have seen its abuse. Religion is not meant to be democratized. The priesthood of all believers is NOT the tyranny of the majority. Nor is it about people dividing into factions where one group does this or one group does that. Go back and read **Ephesians 4**. Those called into leadership set the tone for the local church. They set

a direction. They cast a vision. In response, members of the church—the saints—all pull together in one direction to fulfill that vision, do the work of ministry, and build up the body of Christ—the Church.

I was speaking with another group of ministers recently. One pastor, who serves a small church in the northern end of New England, told how his church was growing. Almost embarrassed, he mentioned that he's not much of a preacher nor does he have great charisma. However, a young couple started attending his church about a year ago. For some reason, they like the pastor's preaching and the congregation. With little effort from the members of the church, they decided to stay and join the church. Now, they invite other people to come to the church. They even offer to give them rides. This is the church being the church when the saints decide to take ownership of the ministry of the church and make themselves responsible for the health and vitality of the local church.

This is also why I invite people to suggest topics for sermons. I have ideas, and I can develop more. There are a slew of resources to help me find worship materials and develop services. However, I have discovered that I am enriched when others suggest scripture, topics, or other elements of worship.

I see this most notably in the music of our congregation. I do not have musical or singing gifts, but I love music. I have discovered that I am limited in choosing appropriate songs and music. Thankfully, we have an abundance of people who have such gifts. I thought I knew most hymns, but just within the past few months, we sang a couple of hymns that were new to me. I enjoyed them immensely. Those songs nourished my soul and uplifted my spirit. The same is true for our contemporary songs (with which I am not that familiar) as well. I, and our whole congregation, am enriched because of the priesthood of all believers.

If you want to learn more about the priesthood of all believers, you can go and read **Ephesians 4**, or you can

read **Acts 2:42-47** and put it into practice. There, you will find four things the early church did together. Wherever you start, go to the next step. When you reach the fourth one, start all over again, and do it with the other saints in the church.

Those four steps are: 1. *kerygma*—proclamation, being part of the worship life of the church; 2. *didache*—teaching, being part of a Bible study/small group in the church; 3. *koinonia*—fellowship, spending time with church members in social activities; and 4. *diakonia*—service, doing the ministry work of the church.



The more people seize hold of being a member of the priesthood of all believers, the healthier and more vital our local congregation will become. When people use their gifts as the priesthood of all believers, the church grows. At the end of May, we celebrated Pentecost Sunday on the 24th followed by Trinity Sunday on the 31st. Out of those events comes the season of Pentecost, which will take us to Advent. It's the longest season of the year, which reminds us that God has invested greatly in His people so they can live out the glorious life that is to be ours when we are led by the Holy Spirit.

A Spirit-led person is one who in the service of the Lord. A Spirit-led person uses their gifts to bring glory to God and to serve others. A Spirit-led person is a member of the priesthood of all believers.

So God Made a Father: A Moving Father's Day Poem

Inspired by Paul Harvey's "So God Made a Farmer," read this poem celebrating the amazing characteristics God gave all fathers.

So God Made a Father

At the dawn of time, God looked down on all He had made and said, "Now, I need a caretaker." *So, God made a father.*

God said, "I need someone to teach children to fish, and to ride a bike without training wheels, and to play catch in the backyard. It must be someone who's tough enough to run a chainsaw and wield a machete and yet, gentle enough to join his little girl and her dolls for tea." *So, God made a father.*

"I need someone to bring the car around when it's raining, so everyone else can stay dry. Someone who will keep jumper cables in his truck, just in case he needs to help a stranger. I need someone to notice practical things, like how the tread on the tires is wearing and if the weather stripping around the front door needs replacing, for no one else will." "I'll create someone who's strong enough to open a tightly sealed jelly jar and tall enough to place the angel on top of the Christmas tree. Someone who will be gracious enough to let his son fish the best fishing hole or to let his daughter win at least one hand of gin rummy."

"Yes, he will struggle to find his glasses and keys," God thought. "But I'll help him find time for the important things, like tumbling with the kids in the den floor, or saying 'I'm proud of you, son,' or giving Mama a hug." *So, God made a father.*

God said, "I need someone brave enough to carve the Thanksgiving turkey, for no one else seems to want the job. Someone who's not afraid to go into Grandma's dark cellar, or to check on what goes bump in the night, or to remove the dead mouse from the mousetrap." "I need someone wise enough to know when to let his child fail. Someone who will pick her up, dry her tears and say, '*Honey, I know you can do it! Give it another try.*'"

"I need someone who listens more than he talks. Who will stand by his family through laughter and tears, tornadoes and snow-storms, good times and bad. Someone who will love his kids and love their mother even more." *So, God made a father.*

God said, "I need someone to provide for the family. Someone who will get up early and stay up late and never complain. I need someone who's willing to make unpopular decisions and stand by them. Someone to provide authority and discipline, as well as love."
