

**Dunkirk Dam** – a power-generating dam on the Yahara River in the Town of Dunkirk, Wisconsin

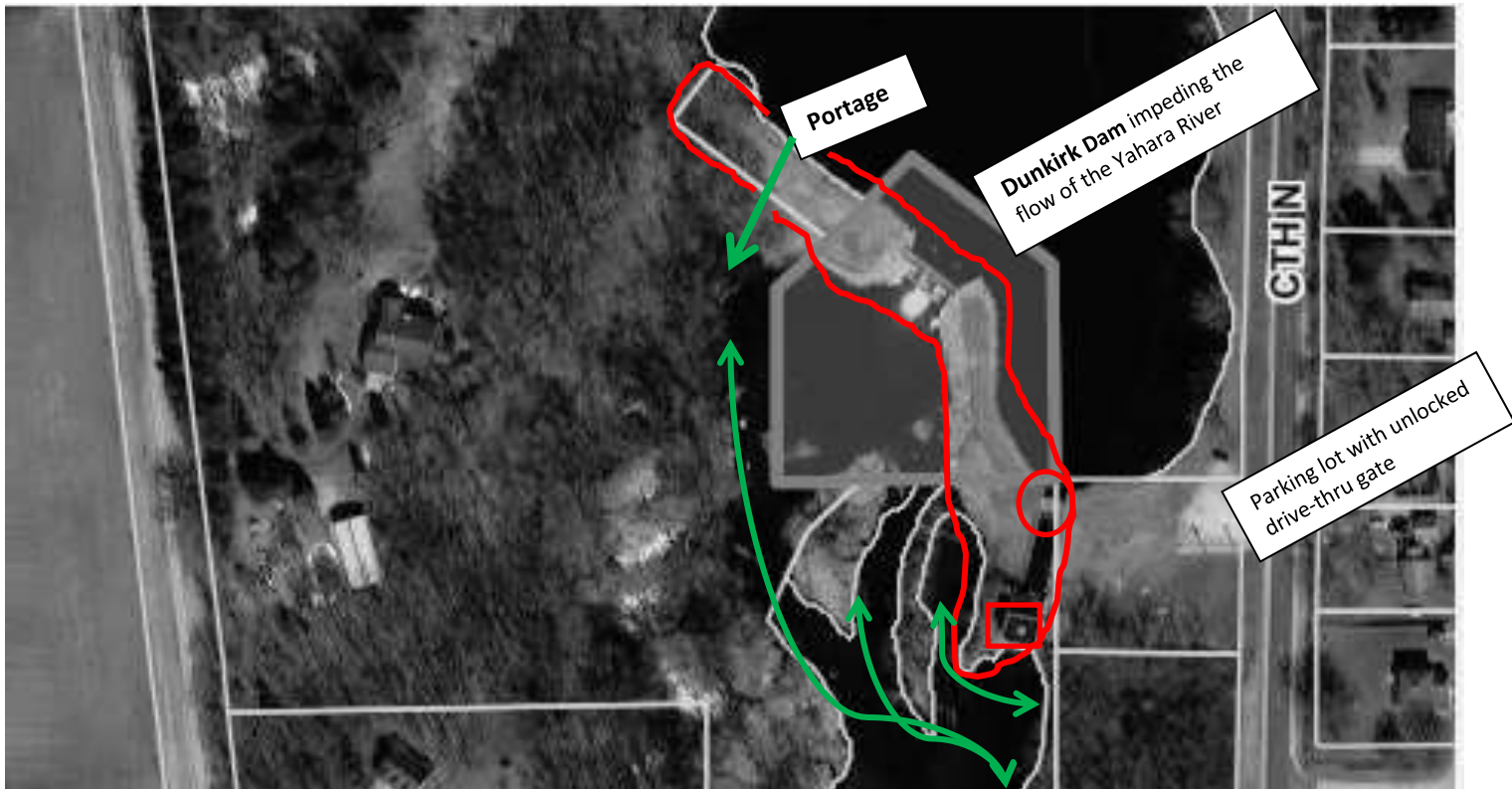

The following aerial map indicates the **“NO TRESPASSING AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL ONLY”** areas.



**○** “NO TRESPASSING AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL ONLY” Locked drive-through gates leading to a cement driveway accessing the West side of the dam. **Most trespassers gain access to the west side of the river by climbing over/under/through these gates and fence.**

**□** “NO TRESPASSING AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL ONLY” Fenced area around the Power House. This area is dangerous as the building contains the power-generating turbines. The river area just south of the Power House is very dangerous as the water rushing from the power house can be quite turbulent.

“NO TRESPASSING AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL ONLY” This large area includes the dikes (mounded grassy areas), tainter gates (where water funnels through), debris shoot/slide, turbine intakes, and power house.

Green arrows indicate the way anglers may access the west side of the river. They are required to “keep their feet wet” to access the river on the west side of the dam and comply with the “No Trespassing” signs on the dam.
