A Safe, Secure, Faith-Based Learning Environment for the Children of Our Community

Earlier this year, the "Virus" shut the Program down for five months. It now threatens to do the same, but God has other ideas right now.

Last week, the Jim Thorpe Area School District School decided that it would transition all education to a distance learning environment beginning Tuesday, December 1<sup>st</sup> with an anticipated reopening on January 19, 2020. Translated, this means that the children will attend school "virtually." What this means to us is that the Program will be providing care and supervision for approximately 15 children needing a place from which to attend school. In other words, children enrolled in the Program will be spending their school day with us here at Grace-St Paul's.

Putting the Plan and resources together to provide whole-day care, on such short notice, was a challenge. A 48page plan was prepared, reviewed, and coordinated with GSP leadership. The results, I am happy to report, have been great. The challenges have been solved quickly, thank God and our excellent Staff at the Program.

We are implementing the Plan in such a way to keep the impact to the on-going GSP programs to a minimum.
