# **Homestead Exemption**



# What is Homestead Exemption?

When you own a property and make it your permanent residence or the permanent residence of your dependent, you may be eligible to receive a homestead exemption that would decrease the property's taxable value by as much as \$50,000.

### Am I Eligible to File?

You must meet the following requirements:

- √ Legal or beneficial title to the property recorded in the Official Records of the county where the property resides
- √ Reside on the property
- ✓ Be a permanent resident of the State of Florida
- √ Be a United States citizen or possess a Permanent Residence Card (green card)

## How Do I Apply?

You may complete an application form online, by mail or in person by March 1<sup>st</sup> of the year for which you are applying. #### What Information Do I Need To Provide?

To apply for homestead exemption by mail or in person, you must submit a copy of the following documents:

- 1. Florida Driver's License or Florida Identification Card and at least one of the following:
  - · Florida Vehicle Registration
  - Florida Voter Registration Card
  - Recorded Declaration of Domicile (affidavit of residency obtained through the County Comptroller's Office)
- 2. Social Security numbers are required for all owners making application and their spouses, even if the spouse does not own and/or reside on the property.
- 3. If you are not a United States Citizen, your Permanent Residence (green) Card (front and back).

#### When Do I Apply?

Filing for homestead exemption begins January 1<sup>st</sup> and ends March 1<sup>st</sup>. All exemption applications for that year must be filed no later than March 1<sup>st</sup>. You may also pre-file for the following year from March 2<sup>nd</sup> through December 31<sup>st</sup>.
