### SCRIPTURE FOCUS

Hebrews 10:1–18



### DEVOTIONAL THOUGHT

During the Last Supper, Jesus did more than share a meal—He established a new covenant. A covenant is a life agreement. God has always desired to be our God and for us to be His people. But in this moment, Jesus revealed that a new way was being established—one that would change everything.



### THE FOUNDATION: HIS DEATH

Jesus' death is the foundation for forgiveness. Forgiveness through Christ does not just cover sin—it transforms and renews the whole person.



### OLD COVENANT VS NEW COVENANT

The Old Covenant was led in an earthly sanctuary by human, flawed priests. It required repeated rituals and sacrifices, offering only a temporary covering for sin. The New Covenant is led by Jesus Christ, our High Priest, who serves in the heavenly sanctuary.

Through His life and personal work, the covering of sin is complete.

The Old Covenant managed sin temporarily. The New Covenant deals with sin thoroughly and permanently.



### THE POWER OF HIS SACRIFICE

Jesus' voluntary sacrifice is superior to the sacrifices of animals, which were involuntary. Rather than sin condemning us, Christ condemns sin.

### A NEW PEOPLE

The New Covenant promises to form a people who belong to God.

Just as God chose Israel under the Old Covenant, He now forms a people through Christ—transformed from the inside out through the power of the Holy Spirit.

This covenant is personal and written on the hearts of His followers.



### FINAL REFLECTION

The New Covenant was never an afterthought—it was always necessary.

This is not just about forgiveness... it is about transformation, identity, and belonging. At the table, Jesus invited us into something eternal.
