PWS have had 2 exemptions from Waste Management Licensing registered at the site by SEPA. They are a paragraph 9, ref no. WML/XC/1196806 and a paragraph 19, ref. no. WML/XC/1190920 . The p9 was registered for the purpose of restoring the site to agricultural land while the p19 is primarily for the construction of the site's haul roads. Both of these exemptions permit certain specified wastes relevant to each to be brought onto site. An overall explanation of these exemptions can be accessed using this link Activities exempt from waste management licensing | Scottish Environment Protection Agency (SEPA). PWS have also been granted a Mobile Plant Licence (MPL), ref. no. WML L SEPA2021-8002 by SEPA. The purpose of the mobile plant on site is to screen and crush material in order for it to be suitable to be used in the p19, and for the treatment of existing on-site Japanese Knotweed. A MPL sets out the overall activities a mobile plant will undertake at a site and states the waste types, tonnages, etc. which must comply with the conditions in the MPL. Regarding your complaint of mud on the public road the site has been inspected several times, the latest on 29th October this year. At that inspection I did speak to the operator about complaints we had received regarding mud on the road as a condition in the MPL covers the condition of the site roads and minimising mud on vehicles leaving the site. The access road within the site was fairly muddy and the operator stated their intention is to concrete the portion of the access road nearest the public road. At the site entrance PWS also stated that they were using a road sweeper here twice a day in response to complaints they had already received. At the time of inspection the site entrance was relatively free from mud and not causing an issue on the public road. Please be assured that SEPA are in dialogue with PWS regarding the operation of the site, compliance with their authorisations and any public complaints we receive. It is my intention to inspect the site early in January to address issues we are currently investigating. I trust this answers your enquiry but feel free to contact me if you need further assistance or information.
