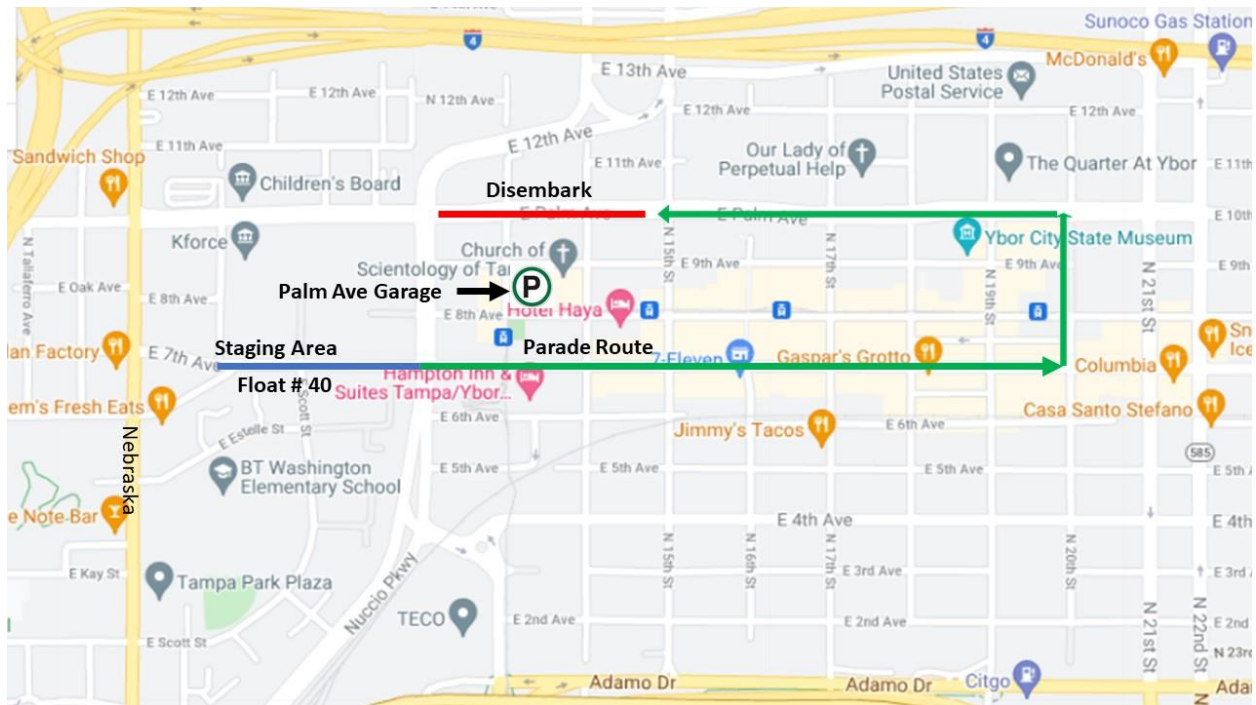
The Crewe of Bobbie C Davis is FLOAT #40

FRIENDS of the CREWE

The one-time cost to participate in this event is \$50 per person. You must be 21 years of age or older to participate. You will need to fill out a Guest Waiver (document section of the website) and provide your sponsor's name in that form. All fees can be made via PayPal (link on the CBCD.org website). Please state the name of the parade and your sponsor's name in the notes section of PayPal.

STAGING

All participants need to be at the float at **6pm** for safety instruction. Parking for this parade is usually in the City of Tampa Palm St Garage.

GENERAL RULES OF PARTICIPATION:

1. You must have a **CREWE WRISTBAND** which provides you access to the float and allows you to be vended alcohol. Make sure that you bring your **DRIVER'S LICENSE to the parade!** The **FLOAT WRISTBAND** is evidence that we have checked your ID and that you are of legal age to drink.
2. **PARADE WRISTBANDS can be issued at the parade or** obtained prior to the Friday **BEFORE** the event. All wristbands can be obtained by visiting the office of:

3. Throwing beads **PRIOR TO THE BEGINNING OF THE PARADE** is not permitted. Also, stay out of the street to allow parade and emergency vehicles through. No loud music in staging area.
4. All participants are encouraged to wear a costume which illustrates the theme of this event. No nudity, nor risqué costumes will be allowed to participate.
5. Throwing any beads from street level is optional! You must be on the float to throw beads.
6. Please use the trash receptacles for any additional plastic bags, bead rings and empty drink containers, etc.
7. Tow unit driver's, marshals and the safety officer are not permitted to toss out throws. The driver and the safety officer need to stay with the tow vehicle, at all times, in the staging area.
8. Once the Parade is rolling, the float will not stop for any reason other than emergency or an official Parade stop. The float should not accelerate during the parade, but all participants will need to stay behind the front of the tow vehicle and no more than 20 feet behind the float.
9. Beverages will not be vended, nor carried, in any containers outside the standard ones supplied by the crewe (red Solo cups) . Please **REUSE** and **RECYCLE** where possible.
10. The Safety Office will wear a green safety vest. All marshals will wear an orange safety vests. These volunteers are **SOBER** and are there to look after **YOUR SAFETY** and that of other participants. Failure to **FOLLOW THEIR INSTRUCTIONS** or any abusive and/or belligerent behavior will be grounds for removal from the parade route by law enforcement.

DISEMBARKING

The end of the parade is located at 7th Ave and 19th St. All participants need to either be off of the float by the end of the parade, or they will need to remain on the float until arriving at the parade terminus area located at on Palm Avenue & 15th. The stairs will be folded up at the end of the parade until arriving at the parade terminus area which will be identified by TPD at the end of the parade.
