Needless to say his road back to anything close to normal was a long and difficult one. He was a constant client at both Admiral Vet Clinic and Dr. Hnilica's Itch Not Clinic. We were able to find several loving foster homes where he was lavished with love and care. We are so grateful to Angela Taulbee his first foster mom, then came Patricia DeSanti, and Johnathan Borsodi and Katie Powell all of whom kept him on his meds, his baths , his allergy shots, and his special food. Then in January of 2017 Ed and Linda Skompski approached us about adopting

this sweet boy. His current foster dad Johnathan did a home visit and was delighted with the family and the home. Buttons was adopted! Ed and Linda travel for work and Buttons got to go along—he was a favorite in every hotel where they stayed. "Buttons has us wrapped around his big old paw and fits right into the Skompski life".

In August of 2017 Buttons was diagnosed with congestive heart failure. Linda and Ed wanted to walk every step with Buttons. "What we do know is that we are going to love him and enjoy him for whatever time we have with him; that is really all we can do." Valentine's Day 2018. "With a heavy heart and a lot of tears, we wanted to let everyone know that our sweet boy, Buttons, passed away this morning. His congestive heart failure had progressed so fast, and his heart stopped this morning. As devastated as we are, we wouldn't give up the last year with him for anything. We are so appreciative to you and the rescue for entrusting him to us and for letting us be a part of his life. He brought so much joy to us each and every day, and he was so loved by everybody that met him.
