SMBC Newsletter Health Column – March 2022 Dealing with Dog Slime

Your Bullie just took a big drink of water, and the bowl is suddenly full of a slimy substance the consistency of pudding. We affectionately call this dog slime. Even if your Bullie is not a first-class slimer, rub your finger along the inside of the water bowl, and you'll feel a slimy goo.

The "technical" name for this stuff is biofilm. It contains many types of bacteria in a thick substance that acts like glue to hold bacteria together and make it stick to a surface. These bacteria are a double-edged sword. They contain good and bad bacteria. On the bad side – they have been found to be associated with urinary tract infections, middle-ear infections, and bladder infections.

This means that it is important not to just refill your Bullie's water bowl each time it is emptied. Instead, rinse it well before filling it again, and wash it on a hot cycle in the dishwasher at least once a week. That's why metal bowls for food and water are the best choice.

By taking a few minutes to keep your Bullie's food and water dishes clean, you will avoid a lot of bacteria -borne illnesses and help keep them happy and healthy Judee Shuler,

Report of the Secretary Sent out many acknowledgments for the donations to Rescue this quarter.

Report of the Treasurer. Suzan reported that our bank ,now Truist is charging outrageous monthly rates and we should look into another bank, Y-12 was suggested. Joleen made a motion that Suzan look into changing our account to another bank. Lisa seconded. Motion carried.

Report of Committees

<u>Show</u> Since we are most likely not having a show this fall as we learn what is expected of our Club for the Nationals we can discuss under this heading. We will depend on Ashley Miller to keep us updated.

Rescue (see Excel file). Adopted in December: Waffles and Patch. Gucci is with the Stroups (had cherry eye repair at Lakeway). Hulk in line to be adopted by a family in Marion, VA on Saturday, currently he is being fostered by the Williams family. We are still working with Chubb. He is currently being boarded at Northshore. We think his major problem is hearing loss. I want to get him evaluated for that, but he has ear infection which needs to be cleared up before a hearing test can be done. Eliza is still with us—had her placed two times and she was returned because of cats and problem with housebreaking. I

am going to approach Tami and see if she might foster Eliza. Bonnie and the puppies are still in the care of Paul and Casey Applebaum in Kingsport. They have done a wonderful job with the puppies —crate training and socialization. I have found homes for four of the puppies. I made an executive decision, and we are asking \$300 for each puppy. They will be spayed/neutered on Jan27th and then I will be arranging to get them to their new homes. Three need to come to Knoxville and one to VA. Bonnie will be spayed and have an entropion repaired on the 20th. She is posted on the FB page and the BCARN site.

<u>Programs</u> Checking with Ashley Richardson to do a program on training and performance sports for Bulldogs. Will try to set a date in Feb. Do we want to think about a Yoga with the Bullies maybe in April??? If general conditions are favorable? Mari will contact Ashley Richardson about a date and use of the ORKC facility. We also discussed using the ET K-9 center if ORKC was not available.

<u>Fundraising</u> Over the holidays we received over 5K in donations. We need to find some way to build the Club treasury while making clear the proceeds will not go to rescue but to the club treasury. Joleen suggested that we have an Easter Parade and "Dog Show". Charge an entry fee and award "trophies" and prizes. Possible use the K-9 facility. Try for April 3 or 10.
