LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

ADDITION OF HENDRICKSON TO OUR COLLECTION

Glenn Leggett has been holding onto Hingham's 1977 Engine 4 from the early 2000s. It has been sitting comfortably in the barn since then. We reached out to Glenn last year to inquire what his future plans with the truck were. After a really great discussion Glenn has always planned on donating it to our museum. The time has come and Glenn has officially donated the Hendrickson to the museum's collection to contribute to preserving the history of firefighting in Hingham. We have been hard at work changing the oil, fuel filters, batteries, changing light bulbs, and working through some grounding issues with the birds nest of wires under the dashboard.

Matthew Sherman has taken a very active role with investigating, researching, repairing and replacing parts on the Hendrickson. Matthew also took advantage of an opportunity to drive it around Bare Cove Park and he only stalled it once. Great job Matthew!

We plan on using the truck for longer trips to musters and firematic flea markets; and, around town to reduce the wear and tear on our restored collection. If anyone is interested in taking a ride to the MAFAA Muster in June let us know.
