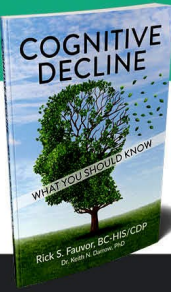

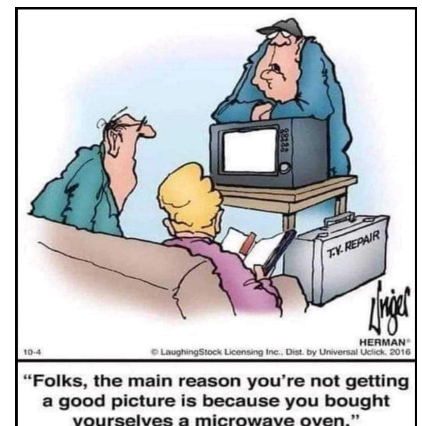
I was always taught to respect my elders, but at my age, they're getting hard to find!

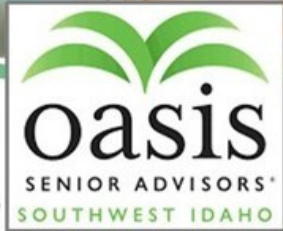

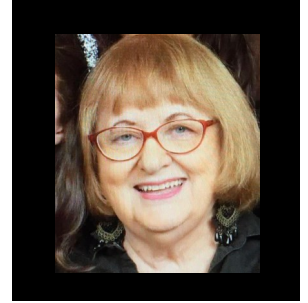
