## Story



OMGMT requires assistance to upgrade its existing computer lab which has deteriorated over the last five years. In 2017, we purchased 12 n-computing systems with 12 monitors And keyboards. Now only one works well, and five are marginally working. We wish to replace these old machines with 12 CPUs. To log into the MSCIT website, each student has to be on his own computer. No longer will n computing work. Our computer teacher needs a separate laptop computer to manage the computer lab. We wish to purchase a projector and speaker for teaching in the classroom. Banners and pamphlets are necessary for advertising our classes locally. We wish to keep replacement parts for repairs as needed. Chairs and fans are also needed in the classroom.



# Our Vision



The computer has become a standard of education throughout the world and is greatly needed in our rural setting far from the infrastructure of modern India. An internet-connected computer has become the encyclopedia and community library rolled into one. Without computers, our tribal students will continue to fall behind the students of the cities. Computers help the students to learn about the world and know what is happening in it. It helps them to aim for excellent jobs in the future and succeed in them.

In 2017, OMGMT received twelve new computers from the generous professor A.D. Joshi And created a computer and career center in his name. During these five years, OMGMT taught a range of school students from 2 nd standard to 12 standards and even a few local adults. From 2018 to 2020, the computer center was establishing itself as a local center for acquiring computer knowledge and practicing computer skills. By the end of 2019, it became clear that allowing the younger students to dominate our classes and practice sessions, the older and more serious students were not getting enough time on the computers. Hence, we made the strategic decision to limit computer use and classes to the older students of 9th, 10th, 11th, and 12th standard classes. These are the students that are getting ready for advancing to college or are planning to take a job in the community. As a result, our number Of students has significantly dropped, but we believe we are having a significant impact on our students and preparing them for the world.



# Strategy to Help:



1. Upgrading OMGMT computers at the Professor Joshi Computer Lab is required for the MS-CIT course. Our current system is malfunctioning and cannot be counted on to provide a stable computing environment. We envision our lab being returned to its initial set-up of twelve computers, a laptop for the teacher, and a projector and speaker system for teaching groups of children at once.
2. The Professor Joshi Computer Lab is convenient to thousands of students who walk and ride past the OMGMT office daily. The lab is located next to the only bridge that connects the northern forest villages with the village of Ganeshpuri and the major bus lines.
3. Provide the students with a reduced fee for all classes. Instead of the market price of 5000 rupees, we offer the same class at 3000 rupees, with the ability to pay on time.
4. Provide classes in Tally, Hardware and Software Systems, Marathi and English Typing. If the student enrolls in all the courses, they will be awarded an even greater discount.
5. Our staff has identified that the older students in our area are missing valuable career guidance as they finish their 10th, 11th, and 12th standard classes. OMGMT's staff of educators will visit each of the local high schools and provide a career guidance program in the months of April and May. Coming from impoverished families, many students have been given no career guidance at home, and most probably not at school either. From experience, our tribal staff has explained how difficult it is to make good choices about one's career without understanding the consequences of each choice.
6. The students receiving the career guidance will be informed of the opportunity that is available locally to use their summer vacation productively by learning computer skills. Most of our local students have no one encouraging them to aim high and take the necessary step to improve one's life.
