FROM the PASTOR:

Jesus taught us [Matthew 5:43, Luke 6:47], "Love your enemies". He exemplified this when He asked His Father in heaven to forgive even those at His crucifixion who were mocking and torturing Him. Jesus is a friend of sinners. He desires that all sinners repent, believe, and put their trust in His precious blood given as a ransom for us. Even those who hate Him, He loves enough to give His life for them. By His blood and the gospel proclamation of peace with God through Christ, former enemies have softened their hearts and become His friends. This is certainly Good News for us! We should all be able to relate to having our hearts softened, and giving-in to the love Jesus offers us. When we were His enemies "we were reconciled to God by the death of His Son" [Romans 5:10].

But there are some enemies of Jesus that just don't qualify for His love. As strange as that may sound, for all His gracious favor for men and women who had become estranged from the love of God, Jesus maintains a righteous hatred for the sinful flesh that divides us. God has prepared His ultimate wrath and judgment against the devil and his demons. And He has shown His everlasting contempt for the "Father of lies" – Satan, who seeks our destruction. As a result, these things which God hates have made themselves our enemies. The devil, the evil world, and our sinful human nature are all working together, and they're all out to get us. That's not paranoia, that simply the truth.

So when we follow Jesus and "love our enemies", we must be careful not to embrace those enemies God does not love. We love "the sinner", but know that it's still okay to hate "the sin". We mustn't become an ally of the sin and deception God hates. So we need to love our neighbors in such a way that their sin doesn't deceive us and become the kind of "frenemy" that will prove to be harmful to us. The love that we have for our neighbors – even our enemies – must not extend to loving their sin, much less celebrating it. Christ died on the cross in victory over such sin. We pray "lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil". We don't want to walk blindly into trouble, or for God to reward our sin or anyone else's. Instead we ask Him to protect us and keep us one step ahead of the evils He detests.

Many of the people we would love to love have been tricked by Satan's deceptions. As much as we love those who have been deceived, we still have to guard our hearts so that we too don't fall prey to such lies. We are encouraged by God's Word not to "be conformed to the world" [Romans 12:2], and "take no part in the untruthful works of darkness" [Ephesians 5:11]. We're told to "have nothing to do" with things that breed quarrels [1 Timothy 2:23]. All these are given to protect us from our sinful world. Likewise, St. James warns us [4:4], "Do you not know that friendship with the world is enmity with God? Therefore whoever wishes to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God." That would just put us right back where we started!

Our lives as Christians always collide with those who don't know Christ. The world stands between us to divide us, and wherever possible, the devil sows the seeds of doubt and deception. If that weren't enough, our weak, powerless human frailty and our natural stubborn desire to rebel keeps us at odds with one another on this side of heaven. The Church is militant in this constant struggle. We continue to battle these enemies of God, while reaching out to the victims of this strife. God's Word provides the only LIGHT, and is our true beacon in this dark world, shining both the Law and the Gospel. We have spent this school year bearing witness to that light! And together, we withstand all God's enemies, and make some friends of the enemies we once had. Blessings as you grow in His light!
