So in addition to raising funds raising funds for animal welfare charities, Bring Your Dog To Work Day is likely to boost the productivity and happiness of the employees within your company.


DOG AT WORK ALREADY?

ALL DOGS MATTER

All Dogs Matter is a charity that rescues and rehomes more than 300 dogs a year in London, Norfolk and the surrounding areas.

The dogs who come into our care are strays, from pounds or simply dogs whose owners no longer can or want to keep them. Opposite is Peter Egan, actor and patron of All Dogs Matter, with ex stray Chelsea who now has her forever home.

Unfortunately, there is a growing demand for rescue services in the current climate, as more and more unwanted dogs find themselves in need of new homes. Our job is to pair each dog with the best new owner for it, ensuring that it will be safe, cared for and loved for the rest of its life.

Our work is done in three stages:

- 1. Identifying and taking on the dogs in need of help;
- 2. Placing the dogs in foster homes where they can be assessed, checking their health, microchipping, neutering & vaccinating them;
- 3. Finding them forever home!





£2 = could be used for food or treats for one day.

£10 = is enough to buy bedding.

£250 = can cover vet bills to treat injuries to dogs that are taken into care.

ANIMALS ASIA

Founded in 1998 by Jill Robinson MBE, Animals Asia has worked tirelessly around the horrific dog and cat meat trade as well as the cruel bear bile farming industry.

It promotes compassion and respect for all animals, working to improve their welfare and bring about long-term change in China and Vietnam. It is the only organisation with a bear sanctuary in China.

Guided by these principles, its Cat and Dog welfare programme drives two broad objectives – removing supply and reducing demand – with the ultimate aim of ending the eating of cats and dogs.

In addition, Animals Asia campaigns for an end to abusive animal practices in zoos and safari parks in Asia, and works closely with governing authorities to improve animal management and increase awareness of the welfare needs of captive animals.





£5 = could buy a jar of honey for the bears.

HOW A DONATION COULD HELP

Some HR Guidelines...

Businesses and individuals that participate in Bring Your Dog To Work Day should follow these basic guidelines to make sure everyone involved has a safe and enjoyable time.



Written consent should be obtained from every office employee ahead of Bring Your Dog to Work Day.



Owners are responsible for controlling their dogs at all times.



Businesses must have the correct employee insurance. Bring Your Dog To Work Day is not responsible for keeping employees safe.



An accurate record of all dogs in the workplace should be kept.



Individuals need to gain the permission of their employers to bring their dogs to their place of work.



Each dog coming to the workplace should be kept on a leash while walking in the building as well as outside, and should have an identity tag with the owner's contact details.



Determine if any employees are allergic to dogs



Respect those employees who may not feel comfortable around dogs.



Dogs should be clean and well-groomed ahead of their day at work.



Keep the workplace clean and adhere to all hygiene standards.



Dogs should be well socialised ie good natured and comfortable around dogs and people dogs and people.




Each participating employee should bring a 'Dog Packed Lunch' - including treats, toys, a lead, water bowl and food.
