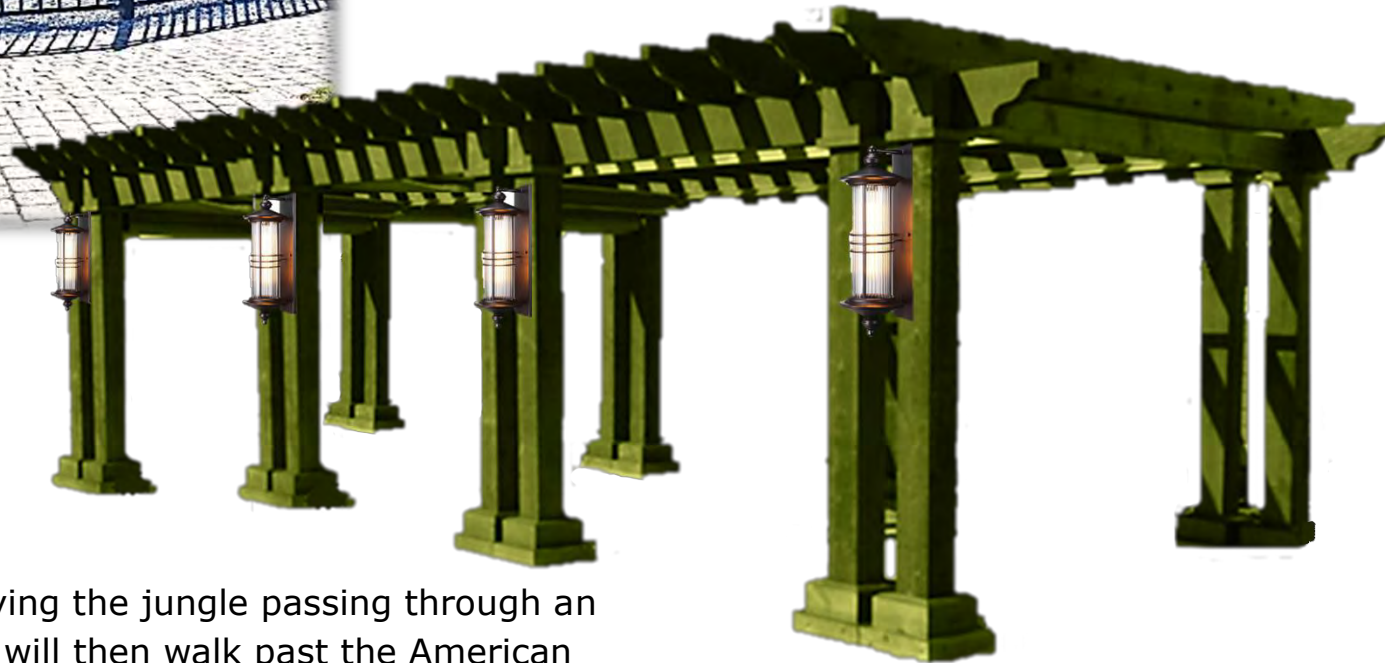


Site plan for 2026/2027 Capital Improvements to Veterans Memorial Plaza at 230 Market Street, Apalachicola:
Our iconic statue is our park's show piece, but there is no shady place to sit or put stuff down when you get there.



Concept Pair of twin pergolas to wrap and embrace our Three Servicemen statue circle.
Creates the much-needed intimate shady seating area where we can visit with the Bronze Boys.



The three soldiers are leaving the jungle passing through an ancient village gate. They will then walk past the American flag and head for home. Completing the story.



From vendor search... **This pergola but sections of about 12' long x 7' deep x 8' total height.**

- Four sections in total angled to make it *appear* curved, embracing the 35' diameter statue circle on both sides.
- **Add cedar lattice ceiling panels on top** for extra shade and exotic look. Rafters and beams to have decorative end cuts.
- Planning for 23" **tall brass outdoor wall lanterns** between each of the paired front posts. **Posts** are 8x8 cedar.
- **Stain the pergolas an army green olive color** to “ground” the structure in our green space, letting the dark statue keep focus.
- Within each pergola section we plan on a standalone **10' x 2.5' slatted wood flat bench** mounted on concrete piers. **Benches** are accessible from both walkways and allow back-to-back seating, plus room for personal items.
- **Cancel the existing beat-up ground-based spotlights** and simply run electric wire to each pergola.
- New electric feed will light the new flame-colored lanterns and proposed new smaller LED spotlights that we can mount on the pergolas to “wash” the front face of the statue.
- **Extending our circle of Freedom Memorial Brick walkway** will support future memorials and allow our visitors direct access to the flag and statue circles.

Concept of a large shady event pavilion to act as a “Headquarters” or “Home Base” for our 3 Soldiers.
Create the much-needed shady event space for our locals and visitors. Can also present static displays.



Pavilion that could work for us... size this to 28'x16' (2 sections) with **metal** roof in a neutral color.

- The white vinyl will be easy care and **reflect the historic white Orman house** on the bluff overlooking our park.
- Paint the interior **ceiling a light gray or ivory color** to maximize light and to discourage chewing insects.
- Allow **electricity** into this structure to facilitate events and educational activities.
- Allow options of **fans and lights** for comfort, safety, and security.
- **Seating** with weatherproof ADA compliant picnic tables and benches. Color options available.
