# CHAIRMAN'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

These past several years have been a roller coaster ride for the Friends, and for the Dallas Public Library, its 30 locations and nearly 400 staff members, that we cherish. As I conclude two years as Chairman, I am glad to report that we are back at the top.

Our libraries are open and flourishing, enriched by the creativity and innovation initiated by staff to continue serving the city while the buildings were closed.

Our political leaders better understand the need for a strong library and appreciate our efforts to keep the issue in front of the public.

Our committees are better organized and more active than ever, engaging with volunteers and increasing the scope of our activities and influence. The Membership Committee has done a particularly outstanding job, welcoming nearly 200 new members in the past two years.

I'm proud to recount some of the highlights of the past year:

- Spurred by the advocacy efforts and our strong showings at town hall meetings, our Dallas City Council increased library funding enabling 15 branches to expand operating hours and keep pace with rising costs for library materials.
- The return to normal life allowed us to hold our first in-person Annual Meeting and our first Annual Gala in three years.
- A generous donation by the David M. Munson and Mona Campbell Munson Fund of The Dallas Foundation enabled the Friends to enhance every library with Reading Ready Play Spaces.
- That was only part of an ambitious \$1.1 million campaign, our largest undertaking in many years, to fund early childhood literacy programs, multicultural programming for families, educational programming for children and adults, and grants for the Library staff, and more.
- In the longer term, our commitment to help the city fund the Dallas Public Library's Facilities and Strategic plan that will guide the future of our library system.

Although we are proud of all we have accomplished together, that commitment to our library's future is why we cannot rest. At a time when libraries face challenges ranging from fiscal difficulties to book-banning crusades, our combination of advocacy and financial support is more vital than ever to our community.

As we approach our 75th anniversary in 2025, the Friends will continue to build on our legacy of service, generosity, and passion for this great institution. I am more confident than ever about the future of the Friends and the Dallas Public Library, and I am so proud to have played even a small part in their success.

### THE FRIENDS' **POWERFUL IMPACT**

Between July 2021 and June 2022, Friends of the Dallas Public Library provided nearly \$500,000 in direct program funding and materials acquisition, of that \$53,754 was for capital projects. Total funding from Friends of the Dallas Public Library is decided prior to the beginning of each new fiscal year. Specific amounts are designated to each of the priority funding areas.

# EARLY CHILDHOOD LITERACY \$61,417

Books for Dallas Babies at Parkland Health and Hospital System, pre-school storytimes, concerts, activities and programs at Bookmarks at NorthPark Center and take-home early literacy kits.

#### READING READY PLAY SPACES

In July 2022, the Friends embarked on a **\$200,000 investment** in early childhood programs including installing Reading Ready Play Spaces at all Dallas Public Library locations. These spaces, designed for families with 0-5 year-olds will provide interactive play areas in libraries for caregivers and children makes the library a welcoming environment where families can play, learn, and grow together.

Each library location will have toys that spark imagination, get families talking, and encourage children to learn as they play. This investment in families with young children was made possible thanks to a very generous grant from the David M. Munson and Mona Campbell Munson Fund of the Dallas Foundation.







#### 1970

The Friends continued acquiring treasures including Illuminated manuscripts, papyrus sheets, and clay tablets, building a museum-quality collection of fine and rare books for the Dallas Public Library.

#### 1974

Sponsored a series of 14 musical programs given by the Dallas Symphony Orchestra.

#### 1975

Received \$1.8 million bequest from Virginia Lazenby O'Hara to build and furnish a fine and rare books area in the new Central Library

#### 1978

Mayor J. Erik Jonsson worked with the Friends to secure \$10 million in private funds, matched by City funds for the proposed Central Research Library.

#### **SMART KIDS**

\$145,824

Providing free quality educational programming for school-age children. SMART Kids connects youth with opportunities that inspire curiosity in Science, Math, Art, Reading and Technology at the library, ensuring that they have the skills needed to succeed in the 21st Century. Youth Services staff, community volunteers and community partners work collaboratively to develop SMART Kids programs focusing on ages 6 – 17.

A significant program that the Friends are proud to fund is SMART Summer at the Dallas Public Library. This beloved program helps kids of all ages keep their skills sharp and sets students up for success when they return to school in the fall.

Last summer, SMART Summer participation grew by nearly 25% with 7,143 children and teens and 1,750 adults registering to read. More than 2,365 participants read 50+ days, and with the libraries all back to 100% operation, in-person program attendance increased by nearly 30,000 over the summer of 2022. And, more than 16,000 free books were given away as reading incentives helping to build "at home" libraries citywide. Thank you to all our SMART Summer sponsors and donors who made summer 2022 another SMART one at the Dallas Public Library.

During the evening, the Friends presented its esteemed Exall Award to the 350+ member staff of the Dallas Public Library to recognize the efforts of the library staff to keep providing services during the pandemic, when library buildings were closed. The creativity and innovation that the staff developed to serve Dallas remotely while the buildings were shut down have made the library system even better.

At the event, the Friends also presented the Lillian M. Bradshaw Award for exemplary service to library staff member, Jessica Alvarado. The awards were followed by a panel discussion featuring local authors Harry Hunsicker, Jim Schutze, Donna Wilhelm and Erin Yun, moderated by Dallas Poet Laureate Joaquin Zihuatanejo.
