Q8 Following the 2008-09 financial crisis, The Dallas Public Library's budget was cut by 40 percent, which led to the libraries hours being cut dramatically and the loss of 50 percent of the staff. Budget cuts continued through 2011-12. Finally, in 2014, the City of Dallas committed to restore the library's budget. With its current operating budget, in 2018, the Dallas Public Library did some amazing things - Over 9 million people visited a Dallas Public Library location or accessed the library online Nearly 500,000 attended a program or event at one of the 29 branch locations More than 8,000,000 items circulated with an additional 4,000,000 digital items checked out 90,000 children and caregivers attended a literacy program at a library Library staff connected over 1,000 people to social services and provided over 3,200 programs for library customers experiencing homelessness Over 30,000 adults attended English Language Learning, Basic Reading, GED and citizenship classes Launched Applied English classes at 8 branches to help participants practice their English language skills while doing practical activities such as filling out standard forms, grocery shopping and banking If elected, will you commit to continuing to responsibly grow the library's operating budget?
