Igor Kousenko Starts off New Year as January Demonstrator

Igor Koutsenko was born in Evpatoria, a resort city on the Crimean Peninsula on the Black Sea. His father brought Igor to the Children's Art School in his hometown after his son demonstrated artistic ability at a young age. At age eleven, Koutsenko was accepted to the adult art studio directed by the acclaimed artist Zvyagintesev who encouraged his talent. Later Igor was educated at the Penza School of Art (class of E. Iodynis) and received rigorous training in the old traditions of Russian realist art.

Igor immigrated to the United States in 1992 settling in Oklahoma City where he taught fine art at the University of Central Oklahoma. In 1995, he was granted permanent United States residency as an alien of extraordinary ability.



Balboa Park Spanish Village In 199, Igor visited Southern California and was attracted by its beautiful scenery and climate that reminded him of his boyhood surroundings in Crimea.

Since moving to Southern California, he continues to produce original work at his private studio in Fallbrook. Igor also teaches drawing and painting classes at the Fallbrook School of The Arts.

Throughout his career, Igor was featured in numerous articles, newspapers, and magazines as well as on artistaday.com. Igor's work is in the collection of the Riverside Art Museum, Pfizer Pharmaceutical Company, Institute for Specialized Medicine and the Hoffman Trust Collection, as well as numerous distinguished private collections throughout the United States.

Igor says," I have been in America for over eighteen years. All these years I have been looking for my place here as an immigrant and as an artist. Today I am much closer to finding that place. My influences are in Russian and European cultures. Recently, I feel more of a connection with American culture. I am always thankful to those who encourage me with their interest in my work."

Watercolor Delight Coming in February

Those who have seen the work of Janice Cipriani-Willis will most likely agree that she has a unique way of capturing the soul of her subjects in watercolor. Her signature use of light and shadow sets her work apart.

Janice is an accomplished watercolorist who lives and works at Dorland Mountain Arts in Temecula. She began her art education by earning a B.A. in Fine Arts from California State University, Los Angeles. At that time she worked in acrylics and used a loom to weave multimedia sculptures. Her style was exclusively nonrepresentational abstraction. She exhibited and sold her work via the L.A. ArtCore gallery.



This is a good example of Janice's approach to her portrait subjects. Notice the "vague" background leaving the viewer to conconcentrate on the artist's subject without distraction.

Watercolor has been her medium of choice for the past 15 years. She has studied with artists including Don Andrews, Gerald Brommer, Frank Francese, Fealing Lin, Ted Nuttall, and Frank Webb.

In 2014, Janice was awarded Signature Status in the National Watercolor Society. In 2018 she was named a Master Signature Member of Watercolor West, having been accepted 10 or more times into Watercolor West exhibits.

Traveling and observation have inspired Janice to find and express in watercolor the subtle and often obscure beauty she finds in the places and faces she has seen. She sees the pieces of light that play over forms as a marvelous mosaic. In her watercolors, the lightest light is the white of the paper.

Is Curiosity the Key to Creative Inspiration? What Unlocks that Door?

I came across this article by Kendira Jennings and found it, well, inspirational (sorry, couldn't resist).

"It's one of art's most elusive of concepts – inspiration. Where does it come from? And is there anything we can do to make it come more often?

One of the most important mindsets that can help unlock the door to creativity, I believe, is being curious. Be curious about the world around you. Ask questions, explore new topics, and stay open to learning.

If we look at some of history's greatest creators, Leonardo da Vinci and Michelangelo for example, we find they showed an insatiable curiosity to explore the natural world and use what they learned in their art work.

..... relevant avenues (to inspiration) might be used through the use of intelligent questioning, such as:

- * What would happen if?
- * Why is that thing in shadow now?*

* What is causing those colors to vibrate in that way and can I replicate that in my own work? * What is next?

* Why does this subject appeal to me?

When was the last time you experimented with something because you were curious to see what would happen? Art can be a great way to relearn how to explore possibilities. Tried and true has its place, but as creatives we also need to push the boundaries, and this is challenging because we are then venturing into unsafe territory. All those ugly questions raise their ugly heads.

* What if it fails?

* What if it's not good enough, and by extension, I'm not good enough?

* Aren't there already experts in this field? I'm too old, I'll never catch up.

* I mean really – who am I to think I can go down this path?

For me, this brings to mind a quote from Georgia O'Keeffe, who said, 'I've been absolutely terrified every moment of my life and I've never let it keep me from doing a single thing I wanted to do.'

Sometimes, limitations can fuel creativity. Embrace constraints and use them as a challenge to come up with innovative solutions. What are you not doing, exploring, being curious about because you are afraid of, terrified of doing it and what might or might not happen?" FALLBROOK ART ASSOCIATION P. O.
