Coming in September

Just a heads up for two things coming in September 2023. When we resume our monthly meetings, Helen Shafer Garcia will be our demonstrator and workshop instructor. More coming in the Sept/Oct newsletter.

The big event will be our **OPEN STUDIO ART TOUR ON SEPTEMBER 30.** We have 15 artists participating and those with an accesible studio are graciously offering to host another artist or artists at their studios. This is great - it means less driving for those who purchase tickets for the tour.

We anticipate this to be a large fundraiser for FAA, so we need members to sign up to help either on the day of the tour or to accomplish some task in preparation.

We need in **advance**:

***A person to create the map to each open studio
***A person to make paper signs with the studio
number and directional arrow. The signs will be "real
estate" type wire/foamcore signs which the Board will
provide. The paper will be fastened to the foam core.
***People to distribute the brochure/invitation to the
tour to various business who are willing to display them
*** A person to accumulate small gifts (card packs?,
small bakery treats? etc) as prizes for the drawing.
*** Every member to talk to their friends, relatives
business associates etc. to encourage them to come.
***On the day before the tour, a person or persons
to place the directional signs.

*** **Day of the tour,** a person who is not showing to be at each location to help with logistics, parking, packing purchases, covering for artist(s) for lunch or bathroom breaks......that sort of thing.

We will have a sign up list at the September meeting and encourage everyone who is able to take on one small task. This is an all-hands-on deck event and it will take all of us to make it successful. There may be more tasks that come up later, but for now, that's a start.

Should You Title Your Artwork?

Jason Horejs of Xanadu Gallery in Scottsdale received an email from an artist regarding putting titles on your work. In this person's case, he had a series of paintings based on pond scum which he titled "Contaminated Water". The curator of the exhibition said many visitors to the show were intrigued by the pieces, but none sold and wondered if the title itself was the determining factor. He suggested that the pieces were more like Monet's pond in their beauty and thought that should be incorporated into the title in some way. The artist felt that a title like that would interfer with the originality of the work and make it more like a copy of Monet which it certainly was not.

Here was Jason's response, "I have always felt it's important to have a title – just as you wouldn't send a child out into the world without a name, you want to give a work of art a token of identity through the title. Can a title hamper sales if it's the wrong title?

"This is an intriguing question and I am going to admit that I've never really looked at the question that way. My gut reaction is that it is probably best in most cases to avoid words that would have overtly negative connotations unless the meaning of the piece (social or political commentary, for example) is directly tied to the title. Words like "Contamination" or "Scum" are going to land on the wrong side of this line."

"People might be intrigued by the titles, but I think they are going to ask themselves,'do I want to bring 'Contaminated Water' or 'Pond Scum' into my home?' There are going to be exceptions – some buyers like to have something unexpected, something perceived as negative, in their collection for the little shock value it might bring, but this is going to be the a very small minority. On average it's going to have a small negative impact on your sales. The more important issue for me is that I guess I just don't see the contamination or scum in the pieces you mention – I think the work is beautiful and so the title seems not to fit."
