Road Trip to See the Fifth Million IH Tractor By Roger Krentscher

Have you ever wanted to see something in life, but never got around to seeing it. I have and here is the story. One September 10th, after spending a week of scraping and painting my mini barn, it was time to go on a road trip. I decided to drive to Fort Benton, Montana and see the Special 5 Millionth International Tractor.



We all know this is a one of a kind tractor with its chrome grill, muffler and rims, with its special paint job. Also with its place in history, being the fifth million tractor being built by a manufacturer.

I had missed my chance earlier to see the tractor when it was in Madison, Wisconsin for the National IH Winter Convention. So on September 11, 2023 the trip began.

I would like to talk a little about the history of the tractor. On Friday, February 1, 1974 at 9:00 am the 5th million International tractor rolled off the assembly line in Rock Island, Illinois. With this tractor, International Harvester became the first tractor manufacturer to produce 5 million tractors. For the next two years, International took the tractor to special events.

On September 26, 1976, International

offered to auction the tractor off to its dealers. The winning bid of \$40,086.86 was presented by 13 dealers from Montana. On June 15, 1994 with only three of the dealers left, they donated the tractor to the Montana Agricultural Museum.

The last thing I want to talk about is the route I took to the museum. When I left Indianapolis, I took I-74 to I

-80 in the Quad Cities, I-80 West to I-380 North to Waterloo, Iowa. At Waterloo, I-380 turns into US 218. US 218 North to US 18 West. By Mason City, Iowa US 18 West runs into I35 North. I35 North to I90 West by Albert Lee, Minnesota. Follow I-90 West to Billings, Montana. At Billings jump on US 87 and follow to Fort Benton, Montana. When you get to Fort Benton, you will go down a hill into Fort Benton and you will see the Museum on the right.

The Museum opens at 10:30 am. They are two hours behind us in time. When you get to the Museum, the 5 Millionth Tractor is in the back of the Museum. The tractor is beautiful, it looks like it just came off the assembly line. It was well worth the drive to Montana. There are a lot of nice displays in this museum, too.



A few things to remember when going up there. When you get into Wyoming and Montana, if you go past a gas station get fuel. In Montana, I drove six hundred miles and went through 5 towns. I also drove during the day, as the big animals come at night to play.

Thank you for taking the time to read my story.
